PARCC Test

been settled by now, but as of the writing of this article, the approximately 600 CPS schools are on hold, told to prepare as if they were taking the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) test. So the schools must block off the time and prepare as if they were taking the test. Though the Board has issued several statements that they do not want to

take the test. The excuse given by many is that there is insufficient tech in the schools to administer this test. Yet some principals have used their limited budget to have the equipment necessary to take this test that was agreed upon along with ten other states and the District of Columbia. If these principals have just done an exceptional job of managing their budgets and money for equipment is the issue, how can the Board mandate costly new programs like fulltime Kindergarten and Pre-School for 3 and 4 year olds when commitment is already made cannot be paid for.

It is well documented that the City is broke, the County is broke, the State is broke, and the Federal Government is broke. Along with this, the City just had its bond rating lowered again. This means it will cost more to borrow. It's like having your mortgage interest raised. One of the reasons given for lowering of the bond rate is the "pension crisis" -- remember when the broke School Board offered to pay the pension for the teachers in lieu of a pay raise. The Board got no strike and somehow has been allowed to underfund the pension they were contractually obligated to.

The Federal Government has the right to withhold a Billion dollars from the State of Illinois

The test may be taken in paper and pencil. This would avoid the complaint that PARCC will be testing tech skills instead of subject areas. I am aware of suburban districts that have the tech available that are taking the paper and pencil test that is available.

This is clearly an over simplification of the test and in fairness must be noted that I have found different arguments in Colorado and New Jersey about the test. This is just an effort to let our community understand what our kids, staff and principals are going through.


