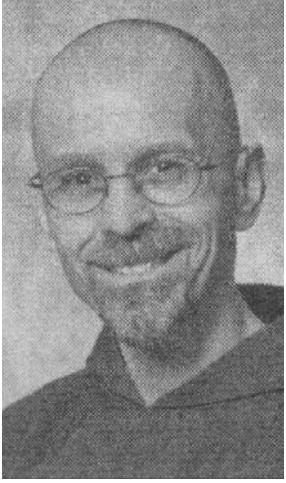


Day Of Recollection At Five Holy Martyrs

PARCC Test

Maybe this issue has been settled by now, but as of the writing of this article, the approximately 600 CPS schools are on hold, told to prepare as if they were taking the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) test. So the schools must block off the time and prepare as if they were taking the test. Though the Board has issued several statements that they do not want to take the test.

The excuse given by many is that there is insufficient tech in the schools to administer this test. Yet some principals have used their limited budget to have the equipment necessary to take this test that was agreed upon along with ten other states and the District of Columbia. If these principals have just done an exceptional job of managing their budgets and money for equipment is the issue, how can the Board mandate costly new programs like full-time Kindergarten and Pre-School for 3 and 4 year olds when commitment is already made cannot be paid for.

It is well documented that the City is broke, the County is broke, the State is broke, and the Federal Government is broke. Along with this, the City just had its bond rating lowered again. This means it will cost more to borrow. It's like having your mortgage interest raised. One of the reasons given for lowering of the bond rate is the "pension crisis" -- remember when the broke School Board offered to pay the pension for the teachers in lieu of a pay raise. The Board got no strike and somehow has been allowed to underfund the pension they were contractually obligated to.

The Federal Government has the right to withhold a Billion dollars from the State of Illinois

if it does not meet the testing requirement, but though the Sun-Times states this withdrawal of funds not mandated. The Feds have no other way to control the test, like the penalty you get if you do not have health insurance. I personally think that with the close connections between Chicago and Washington, loss of funds is unlikely.

The test may be taken in paper and pencil. This would avoid the complaint that PARCC will be testing tech skills instead of subject areas. I am aware of suburban districts that have the tech available that are taking the paper and pencil test that is available.

This is clearly an over simplification of the test and in fairness must be noted that I have found different arguments in Colorado and New Jersey about the test. This is just an effort to let our community understand what our kids, staff and principals are going through.

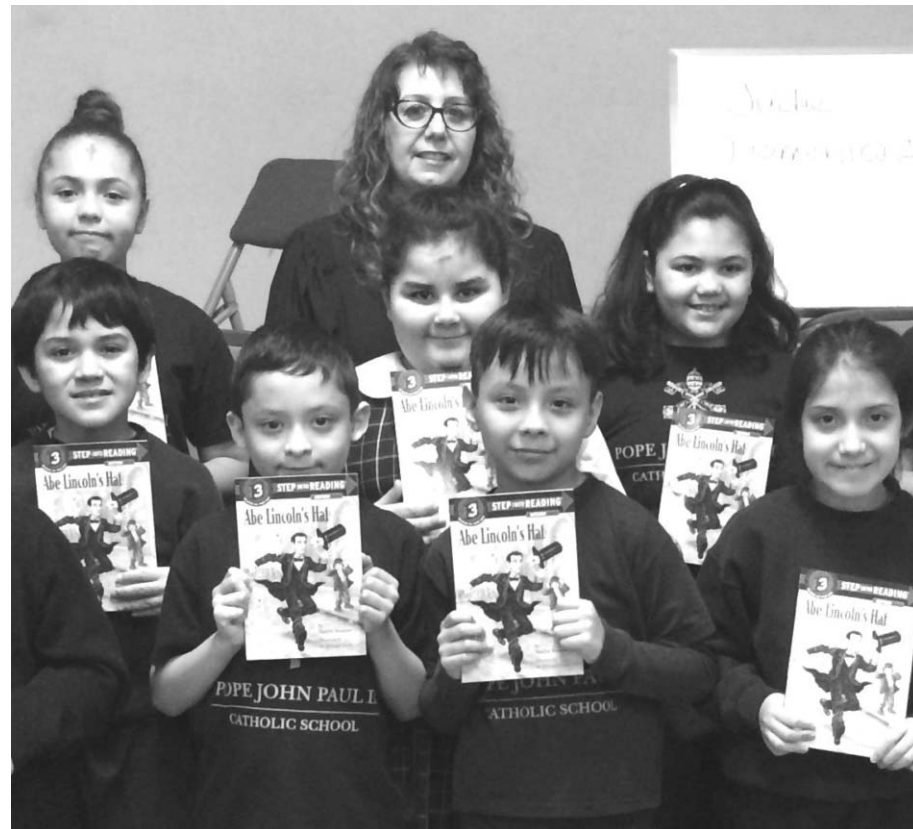

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Program Promotes Food Business
The Chicago Public Library has launched the "Take 20, Read Plenty" public awareness campaign to promote the importance of reading 20 minutes a day to children ages 0-5.
Research indicates that children are equipped with 100 billion neurons at birth, but pathways between the neurons are not yet established. Reading to children aids in strengthening those connections.
Moreover, the number of words a child is exposed to between the ages of zero and three are strong predictors of educational success and eventual economic stability.
Seminal research shows there is a thirty million word gap between families of lower and higher socioeconomic statuses, so children living in poverty tend to fall behind faster in their development and in school. Children need to hear at least 1,000 stories read aloud before they can learn to read themselves.
Each CPL location will have a reading nook in order to model the practice of reading aloud and to provide an atmosphere conducive to reading aloud.
