gion post and community, Wojtak is approaching his 92nd birthday. The depression caused him to pass up high school and he worked as a laborer with the Civilian Conservation Corps in 1942. In March of 1943 he joined the U.S. Army becoming the youngest of four brothers serving in WWII. Ray was assigned to the First Army and shipped to Eng-

unteer work with his leland where the allied forced assembled for the invasion of Normandy. Dday would be the first combat experience. The "Big Red One" saw combat in France, Holland, Belgium and Germany which led to the allied liberation of Western Europe from Nazi Germany control. The 1st Army also participated in the "Battle of the Bulge" campaign.

After two years of intense combat, Wojtak was awarded the Silver Battle Star, one of the highest military decorations for valor. Honorably discharged in November, 1945, he returned to Brighton Park becoming one of the founding fathers and a charter member of the American Legion Central Park Post in 1946, a life long parishioner of St. Pancratius Church, and is an active member of their Holy Name Society for almost 75 years.

Wojtak served as post commander and for 60 years was Poppy Day chairman. He remains an active member by attending monthly meetings, serving on the post ritual team, and participates in the Memorial Day and Veterans Day ceremonies. Now, an active member of the Archer Heights Civic Association, he takes pride in serving indigent vets, displaying a strong commitment to his community and civic responsi-

A retired principal's view:

#### Viet Nam War

BY: DR. R PLETSCH

The news reports recently had coverage of the anniversary of the fall of Saigon in 1975. I talked to several teachers and students. It became obvious to me that these students and, for the most part, these young teachers had no concept of the war and that they often only know the misconceptions that seem to be accepted as truths.

I have looked at about seven middle school and US high school history books and most of them cover very little of the facts of that war. I did find one convergebated in find one copyrighted in 2009, however, that seemed to do a good job. The rest did not seem to be fact-filled. Several of the teachers I talked to tated things like we're stated things like we're lucky to get past WWII, because we run out of time. Some even admitted it wasn't even in their curriculum. One teacher told me the entire Viet Nam war was covered in two paragraphs calling it Nixon's war, that was stopped by peace marchers. Our students are little served by inaccuracies like that.

I recall an article in the Sun-Times by Father Andrew Greeley when he stated that many will earn their doctorates proving that the peace movement caused the war to last years longer because most polls showed more support for the war after all the big or peace rallies. Being of that age, I recall that as being quite

I found a very good website by the History Channel that now with time passed have challenged the myths of the war which, it seems, that is all the students hear. A few of the myths are as follows: The war was fought largely by the poor, and uneducated and a disproportionate number of Blacks died. The facts are

79% of all the Vets had at least a high school degree, by far, the most educated combat troops we have ever put in harm's way. The fact is 86% of those that died were Caucasian and almost 7,000 of these were college grads, mainly pilots and infantry college officers. Another myth is how terrible the Vets transitioned out to civilian life. In fact, suicide rate was about the same as everyone else and actually after five years in civilian life, suicide rate for Vets is lower than non-Vets and 85% are credited with very successful transition to civilian life and their average income is higher than those of non-

There are many facts that should not be argued any longer because the statistics are in, you just have to look for them. The Association of Southeast Asian Nations lists that more Asians were killed between 1973 when the United States left and 1976 than in the ten years previous. The South Vietnamese

fought for two years after the US left. They had no supply of food, arms or ammunition, while the North was still being supplied by China and the Soviet Union. Much has been learned since the fall of the Iron Curtain when the KGB made some of their files public, including the fact that Ho Chi Min considered ending the war during the bombing of Hanoi but peace rallies in the United States convinced him he didn't have to.

It is sad that most adults I talk to don't know these facts and the students are not even presented with these facts. It seems that there should be some work with the curriculum to make it available to our students because this is the world their grandparents lived, fought and died in.


