## Tabares Supports Property Tax Freeze

State Rep. Silvana Tabares, D-Chicago, backed a measure that would freeze property taxes statewide and provide relief for homeowners.

"When I'm walking door-to-door, constituents tell me that their property taxes are so high that they have a difficult time making ends meet," Tabares said. "They fear that rising property costs will continue to burden them even when the value of their home decreases. I'm committed to passing real solutions

According to a study published by the Tax Policy Center, Illinois has the second highest property tax rate in the country. House Bill 695 would prohibit units of local government from passing annual tax increases onto homeowners.

## CPS Invites NAC Members

Chicago Public Schools is accepting applications for parents and community members to serve on Neighborhood Advisory Councils to gain community feedback on proposed charter schools. Applications must be submitted by Monday, June 1st.

NAC members serve as liaisons between the District, prospective charter applicants and the communities they represent. Their role is to ensure that all new charter and contract school proposals provide students and families education options that correspond with a community's academic needs. The members play an important role in the charter RFP process and are given the opportunity to review submitted proposals, ask questions and provide input to the District and the Board of Education on how to proceed.

NACs will review proposals for new charter and contract schools that would open for the 2015-16 School Year. The annual request for new schools is mandated by Illinois Charter School Law.

CPS made changes to the process based on feedback it received from participants in 2014. This year, NACs will be led by independent facilitators to eliminate concerns about the District influencing the process. Geographic boundaries were adjusted so that every community for which a proposal was received will be represented in of four regions across the city.

Potential members must commit to volunteering as a member for

four months, during which they will attend meetings and perform ongoing review of charter school application materials for a minimum of 10 hours per month. They are also expected to serve as a community liaison by conducting outreach activities and soliciting input.

Parents, community members and elected officials, including alderman and state representatives, are all eligible to serve on NACs.

The Bright Start or Bright Directions college savings account are administered by the Treasurer's Office and can be opened at [www.illinoisinvestments.gov](http://www.illinoisinvestments.gov). Purchasers can choose investment options or use

an advisor for guidance.

Age-based options where the underlying investments become more conservative as the beneficiary gets closer to college-age also are available. Savings can be used at any qualified institution nationwide, including technical schools.

These tax-advantaged college savings accounts are named after Section 529 of the Internal Revenue Code. In Illinois, 7 of 10 seniors graduated with college debt. The average balance was \$28,500.
