A retired principal's view: Choosing A School

As you prepare for next year's school for your kids, you must choose between many schools. If you are

going to choose a Catholic school, check your budget now and judge your ability to pay your bills. If moving, the cheaper the rent the less likely the school will have extra worthwhile educational programs. And charter schools see if they really deliver that which they

Though some schools I can name have very few Catholics in attendance. The parents of these students still consider the Catholic education the best of their choices.

If moving, be careful looking at schools and visit them before you move. A good time to visit is at recess and dismissal when no one is putting on a show. Ask if in these last three weeks education is still going on and has not concluded with Memorial Day. Check the websites for boundaries. When I taught at the Metcalfe Magnet School we were held in high regard in the community. The real estate agents in the neighborhood would advertise their houses for sale as near, sometimes across the street, from the top rated Metcalfe School. The trouble we were not a neighborhood school and people had to apply by Thanksgiving for the next year. There were also gov-

quotas. The charter schools (at least originally) had to offer something a neighborhood school could not. These schools are for profit and often have spent much on impressive websites. But this is their selling tool and, of course, might have little to do with what actually goes on in the building. Actual progress of the students is hard to assess because scores are given that cannot be validated. Some have been charged with unjustly denigrating local schools and telling parents they plan to expand and if you want your child to come to our school you must come now because you don't want your child

look at test scores. The scores we are given today seldom chart growth of the particular child. Look at Jones College Prep, Whitney Young, St. Ignatius, they have such great students enter it is hard to judge these schools. The students there will probably be successful with the worst teacher in the world. I coached high school basketball for 14 years. Some may look at the old yearbooks of St. Joseph High School and St. Mary of Perpetual Help High School and have a completely different reading of success than I do. Some of the best records came when I simply had a lot of talented students. My best years coaching were with kids with less raw ability but they played above expectations. Some high schools have a large number take the entrance exam when the football team is good. As if a good

team equals a good educa-Keep in mind that all of these schools draw from the same teacher pool. Some Catholic schools lose teachers because of money (I did this). Charter schools are for profit and there have been allegations that they do not let many of their teachers reach high salaries. On the other hand, the public schools are paying less and less attention to seniority because of budget trouble.

Many of you are content and for most of you that is fine. But if you were one of those that hears that little voice saying I can do better for my kids, maybe these guidelines can help.
