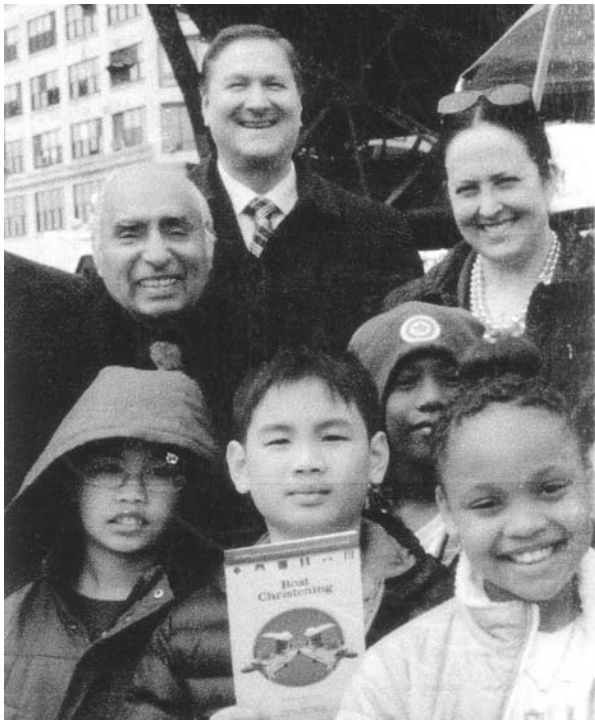


Memorial Day Parade

MWRD Adds New Skimmer Boats



Commissioner Mariyana Spyropoulos, President of the Board at the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago stated "The Chicago Area Waterways will be cleaner thanks to two new skimmer boats that will traverse the waters of the Chicago River." The boats will operate from mid-April to mid-October and after significant storms year round. The third boat is a 36-foot debris collection barge with a clam shell for removing larger objects. A contest to name the boats was held and out of 150 submissions, "Skimmy Dipper" and "Skim Pickens" were selected, both at the suggestion of Josh Ellis, a director with the MPC. Ellis manages substantiability initiatives in storm water mitigation and water supply management. Opening For Cal-Sag Trail

Congressman Lipinski (IL-3) joined with area officials and residents at Lake Katherine in Palos Heights for a Ribbon Cutting Ceremony for the completed 11-mile west leg of the Cal-Sag Trail which runs along the Cal-Sag Channel from 131st and Cicero in Alsip to Archer and Route 83 in Lemont.

In recognition of Lipinski's support for the trail, he was given the honor, along with his wife of running the final leg of a relay carrying half of the trail sign to the trailhead at Lake Katherine.

The Cal-Sag Trail connects in Lemont to the Centennial Trail and I&M Canal Trail that runs from Willow Springs to Joliet and beyond. In Palos Heights, the Cal-Sag connects to the Tinley Creek Trail and then to the Orland Park Bikeway.

Upon completion in 2017, the Cal-Sag Trail will be 26 miles in length, connecting Burnham to Lemont.

334 Scholarships For Kelly Graduates

Colleges, universities, and organizations from around the country have awarded 334 scholarships to the Kelly High School graduating class of 2015.

The awarded amount of \$13,000,000 is the second largest sum of money awarded to students in the school's 87 year history. The graduating Class of 2014 earned \$13.1 million. In addition, the Class of 2015 completed over 2,900 college applications, and every graduating senior completed three applications.

Next fall, former Kelly students will be attending schools such as Vassar College, the University of Kentucky, and Connecticut College, as well as dozens of colleges throughout the Chicago-land area and State of Illinois.

To celebrate their achievement, students attended the annual Decision Day Barbeque on May 14th in the Kelly courtyard, where they both announced and celebrated where they will be attending next fall. Representatives from Fifth Third Bank, Marquette Bank and City Clerk Susana Mendoza's Office attended to award \$10,500 in scholarship money to graduating seniors.

Summer Challenge For Rahm's Readers

Mayor Rahm Emanuel Public Library Commissioner Brian Bannon at the Museum of Science and Industry to launch the 2015 Rahm's Readers Summer Learning Challenge: Explore and Soar. Along with the Museum of Science and Industry, Adler Planetarium, Chicago Public Schools, Chicago Park District, Chicago City of Learning and the Big Shoulder Fund, children will be challenged to read 20 minutes a day and a total of 70 million minutes this summer. This year's challenge encourages not only reading, but also exploring and investigating the solar system.

Children lose up to three months of math and science learning during the summer months, said Mayor Emanuel. "Rahm's Readers provides an essential opportunity for kids to stay engaged, stay encouraged and be prepared for success when school resumes in the fall."

Fun programs are held throughout the challenge with the Library's partner agencies as a part of Chicago City of Learning initiative.

The Chicago Public Library is taking the challenge to parents and caretakers to participate in the Take 20, Read Plenty campaign by pledging to read to youngest children for 20 minutes per day. Studies show that early learners need to have at least 1,000 stories read aloud to them before they are able to learn to read and that reading to young children for 20 minutes per day increases vocabulary and strengthens pathways to learning. All Rahm's Little Readers participating in the program, ages 0-5, will receive a free book.

Summer learners can: Read 20 minutes per day; Discover by engaging in a series of hands-on library programs, visiting the Museum of Science and Industry and Adler Planetarium, and Create by solving design challenges, creating art, writing stories or poems, or designing and building things to share with others.

A specially designed Explorer Guide ensures that Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math education skills, are cultivated.

Participants are also encouraged to engage in critical thinking, creation and design activities to encourage creativity, problem solving and persistence. Kids that complete at least 500 minutes of reading and other learning activities over the summer will receive prizes courtesy of the Chicago Public Library Foundation and be entered in a raffle to win an eReader.

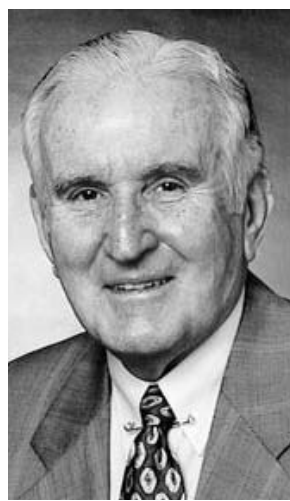
The early literacy component of the program promotes the American

Library Association's "Every Child Ready to Read 2" practices for parents to grow a healthy reader, including Talk, Sing, Read, Write and Play activities combined into an age-appropriate activity log that parent and child can complete together. This piece is available in English, Spanish, Chinese and Polish. Parents and caregivers who participate and reflect on their family's learning will be eligible to win a tech package.

The program also features a teen component, Rahm's Readers Teen Summer Challenge: Defy Gravity, encouraging high-schoolers to deepen their understanding about the solar system and space travel. Teens can participate in activities at YOUmedia locations, share their discoveries and creations on social media with #cpldefygravity and earn prizes, as well as enter an eReader raffle. 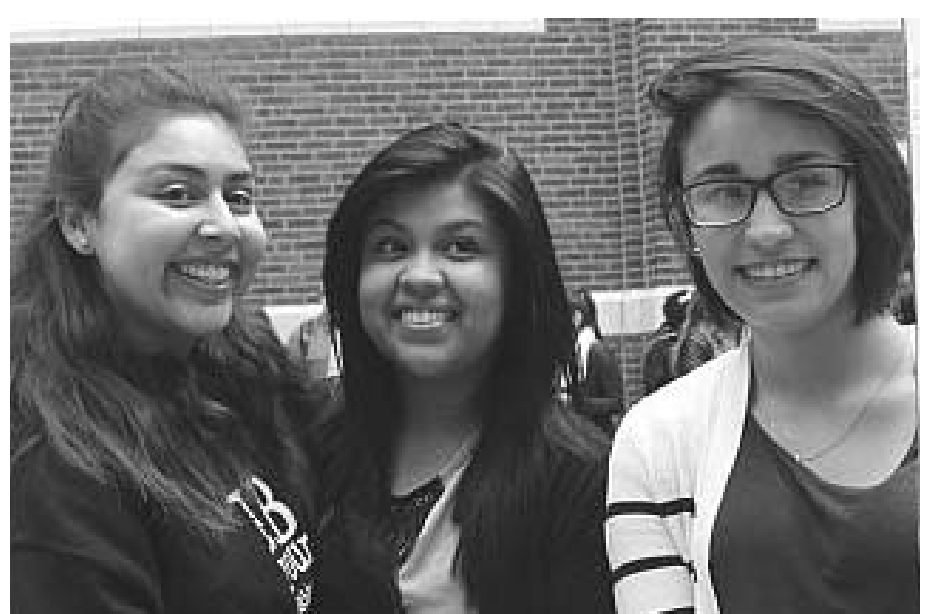

The 529 college savings plans took center stage on May 29th during a national effort to discuss college expectations and goals with children. "Too many families believe the dream of attending college is slipping away," Treasurer Michael Frerichs said. "It is important for families to know that the first steps to that dream can be taken for as little as \$25."

The Bright Start or Bright Directions college savings account are administered by the Treasurer's Office and can be opened at www.illinois-treasurer.gov. Pur-

chasers can choose investment options or use an advisor for guidance. Age-based options where the underlying investments become more conservative as the beneficiary gets closer to college-age also are available. Savings can be used at any qualified institution nationwide, including technical schools.

These tax-advantaged college savings accounts are named after Section 529 of the Internal Revenue Code. In Illinois, 7 of 10 seniors graduated with college debt. The average balance was \$28,500.
