# Summer Olympics

The Summer Olympics will begin this week in Rio de Janeiro and continue to August 27th. The number of possible educational activities that could be incorporated in our children's curriculum is beyond number. While most students are on summer break, we have many home schoolers in our community and several schools will resume classes before the Olympics are concluded.

The students could investigate the return of the Olympics in 1886 when 280 athletes from 13 nations met in Athens. Today in Rio, there are about 10,500 athletes and over 200 nations will compete. They could discuss this enormous increase and research why there were no Olympics in 1916 or 1940 or 1944. They could also look into why the United States boycotted the 1976 Olympics while the Soviet Union boycotted the 1980 games -this denied some athletes from the two nations that won the most medals a chance to com-

The kids, of course, could be introduced to different games of the Olympics. It is interest-ing to show children about the relay races. I'm

can do great history lessons. The 1936 games with Jessie Owens is familiar to everyone and would probably not be a good report. But there are the 1912 gold medals that were taken back of American Indian, Jim Thorpe. Why did this happen? There is also the story of the bloody water polo game between the Soviet Union and Hungary in 1956 or the terrorists that killed members of the Israeli wrestling team at the 1972 games in Munich. They could look into performance enhancing drugs. There was a time the East German women's swimming team could not chemically prove they were women. There are also many stories of Americans competing for other countries because they could not make the US team, but the other country allowed them in. The classic of the Winter Olympics was when the entire Italian ice hockey team was composed of Americans.

What an honor it must be just to be in the Olympics. The possibilities for educational experience during Summer games are staggering and what a waste of good human interest and data if all the kids do is count medals. Gone are the days that the athletes are truly amateurs. But it is still a great spectacle in which countless numbers of young people aspire to. Our hope is that they are run well and safely.

# IDPH Promotes Immunizations

During National Immunization Awareness Month this August, the Illinois Department of Public Health reminds parents that immunizations are important for people of all ages.

The need for vaccines does not end in childhood. Immunizations are recommended throughout our lives based on age, lifestyle, occupation, travel destinations, medical conditions, and vaccines received in the past," said IDPH Director Nirav D. Shah, M.D., J.D. "Immunization not only protects the person receiving the vaccine, but also helps prevent the spread of disease, especially to those who are most vulnerable, such as infants, the elderly, and those with chronic conditions and weakened im-

mune systems." All adults, including pregnant women, should get the influenza (flu) vaccine each year to protect against seasonal flu. Every adult should have one dose of Tdap vaccine (tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis or whooping cough) if they did not get Tdap as a teen, and then get the Td (tetanus and diphtheria) booster vaccine every 10 years. In addition, pregnant women are recommended to get the Tdap vaccine preferably at 27 through

36 weeks.

Adults 60 years and older are recommended to receive the shingles vaccine and adults 65 and older are recommended to receive one or more pneumococcal vaccines.

Changes to school immunization requirements for the 2016-17 school year require all kindergartners to show proof of four polio immunizations. Additionally, students entering all grades except three, five, and 12 must show proof of two doses of varicella, and students entering grades six, seven, and 12 are required to be immunized for meningococcal.

For school entrance,

students must show proof of diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, polio, measles, mumps, rubella, haemophilus influenza type b, hepatitis b, and varicella, as well as pneumococcal and now meningococcal (depending on age) vaccinations. Secretary of State Jesse White announced that his office has reinstated the mailing of vehicle registration reminder notices to drivers. To offset the cost of the mailings, legislation is allowing his office to offer advertising space on the mailing which is in the process of being drafted. The public is urged to sign-up for email notices to further reduce mailing costs.

The reminders were discontinued in October 2015 due to the lack of funding as a result of the state budget impasse. The stop-gap budget recently passed by the legislature and signed into law by the Governor allows White's office to reinstate the notices.

More than 2.3 million people have registered for the email notifications, 800,000 of which signed up since October 2015.

Vehicle owners can sign up for email notifications by visiting www.cyberdriverillinois.com. To register for the program, vehicle owners will need their assigned registration ID and PIN, which can be found on their current registration card. If that information is not available, they can call public inquiry division at 800-252-898Ŏ.

### **College Credit For IB Exams**

Chicago Public Schools announced that as a result of new legislation standardizing credit policies at Illinois colleges and universities, CPS have students who achieved a passing score on International Baccalaureate exams will now receive college credit at all public post-secondary institutions in Illinois. This new state policy will reduce the cost of college for CPS students and create more opportunities to earn credits toward their college degree while still in high school.

An analysis by the University of Chicago Consortium on School Research determined CPS IB students are 40 percent more likely to attend a selective four-year college than their peers, and a recent report determined that nearly 100 percent of IB diploma programme participants from high graduate school, and 88 percent of those students persist through college.
