**Canonization**

This coming weekend in Rome will be the formal naming of Mother Theresa of Calcutta as a saint. Why is this significant for our youth? It shows that the Catholic Church is still highly regarded in the world. Few of the over 30,000 Christian denominations will not embrace that title "saint" when speaking of Mother Theresa.

Our students can learn the process which is deep and complicated and includes deep research into the life of the person nominated for sainthood. The church believes that after this process they have no doubt that the individual has made it to heaven. The church makes a thorough study so that no one is embarrassed later if some contradictory facts emerge about the person. This has almost never occurred.

When I was a principal in Pilsen my predecessor had arranged for St. Paul/Our Lady of Vilna school to make food donations to help the Sisters in their work. The Sisters were our neighbors and I soon had a great working relationship with them. I asked if they could join the Sisters of St. Casimir already on staff in teaching religion to our youngsters. It was a long process, with several layers of administrators agreeing to the assignment. The caveat being: 1) it would be an extra duty for the Sisters, all their other prayers and chores were to be completed; 2) they would accept no monetary reimbursement.

When Christmas came I gave the order some gift cards for items I knew they needed. They returned them saying they could not accept them. I asked them how they stay open. The answer: God provides. I




asked if they accepted donations, they said yes, but not from you or your school because that would be considered similar to a salary.

Our students can look up the process of being named a saint and numerous other activities. Because of the date, many schools are in session, the rest of the schools will be open within a few days. The courts have ruled that schools are allowed to teach about faith, religion and its importance to many in the world. As teachers we, of course, should be careful not to show favoritism. But it does show that there is still some reverence given to the church's process. It will be live on EWTN for those interested.

The debt that I felt for the Missionary Sisters of Calcutta has my son and I working in their soup kitchen on the Westside.

**Chicago Onscreen At Movies In Parks**

Mayor Rahm Emanuel and Chicago Park District General Superintendent Michael P. Kelly announced selections for Chicago Onscreen, the Park District's initiative to enhance the Movies in the Parks series with locally produced independent features, documentaries and shorts that focus on the themes of Identity, Memory, Victory and Vitality.

Chicago Onscreen will feature 13 films in nine locations from Aug. 30th to Sept. 3rd.

Highlights this year include: "In the Game," a feature-length Kartemquin Films ("Hoop Dreams") documentary directed by Maria Finitzo which chronicles the resilience and dedication of the girls' soccer team at Kelly High School as they try to turn their season around before graduation. In the bilingual "I'm an Actor (Yo soy Actor)," filmmaker Aaron Greer follows two young men pursuing careers as actors - one in Chicago and one in Cuba. Director Alex Thompson's lyrical dance film "Bedrooms" explores the beginnings and ends and ins and outs of relationships at many stages of intimacy.

Victory (runs 1 hour, 36 minutes) Sept. 1st, Margate Park (4921 N. Marine Drive). In these films, some of Chicago's fiercest young women fight for personal victories over discrimination, poverty and injustice on an uneven playing field. **Brookfield Zoo's Oldest Animal Resident Dies**

Chicago Zoological Society staff are mourning the loss of one of Brookfield Zoo's most beloved and well-known animals: Cookie, an 83-year-old Major Mitchell's cockatoo. The popular bird, who was certified by Guinness World Records as the oldest living parrot in 2014, died on Aug. 27th.

"On Saturday morning, Cookie suffered a very abrupt decline in his health, prompting the veterinary and animal care staff to make the decision to euthanize him," said Michael Adkesson, DVM, Dipl. ACZM, vice president of clinical medicine for the Society.

Cookie was the oldest resident at the zoo and the only remaining mem-

ber of the original animal collection, which dates back to 1934, when the zoo first opened. Cookie, who lived well beyond the life expectancy for his species, arrived at Brookfield Zoo at the age of 1 from Taronga Zoo in Australia.

Over the years, his popularity grew and touched many people's lives. He received many cards, letters, toys, and pictures from admirers around the world.

Brookfield Zoo began holding an annual birthday party indoors, where he resided in the Reptiles and Birds. Due to the number of guests who attended, the event was moved outdoors to accommodate everyone. Animal care staff would bring Cookie outside, where he would make a grand entrance.

### Applications Open For After School Matters

After School Matters is now accepting applications for its Fall program cycle. W. Dave Stout State Commander of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Department of Illinois announced the kick-off of this year's Voice of Democracy Scholarship competition for high school students.

Students must write and record a three-to-five minute essay on the "My Responsibility to America" theme using an audio CD or flash drive and present their recording, typed essay and completed entry form to their local VFW Post by Nov. 1st. Post winners compete at the District level with the winner advancing to the state competition. All speeches are judged on the sound recording.

All state first-place winners receive a four day trip to Washington, D.C. and the chance to compete for their share of more than \$150,000 in scholarships. The national first-place winner receives a \$30,000 college scholarship.

The National Association of Broadcasters started the Voice of Democracy Scholarship program in 1947. The VFW became a national sponsor in the late 1950s and assumed sole responsibility for the program in 1961. 40,000 students participate each year and VFW awards more than \$2 million in scholarships every year.

Anyone requesting a birth certificate must be 18 years old or be a parent whose name appears on the birth record. High school and college students have the opportunity to work on Election Day as an Election Judge or Equipment Manager.

Students can make \$175 - \$325 by serving as a Poll Worker. After completing the training course, they are assigned to a nearby polling place on Election Day to register eligible citizens, verify voter registrations and aid voters in casting their ballots.

### High NWEA Scores For CPS Students

CPS students achieved record scores on the 2015-16 Northwest Evaluation Association Measures of Academic Progress exam, which measures academic achievement in grades 2-8. This past school year, students achieved record attainment levels on math and reading and exceeded national averages of student growth.

In 2016, the percentage of CPS students who met or exceeded national achievement averages in reading in math improved to all-time highs for the District.

In 2016, 59.1 percent of students met or exceeded the national testing average in reading and 54.6 percent of students met or exceeded the average in math. These scores represent a 5.1 percentage point increase in reading and a 2.4 percentage point increase in math compared to 2015. Compared to 2013, when 45.6 percent of CPS students achieved at or above the national test-

ing average in reading and 45.1 percent achieved at or above the average in math, the percentage of students meeting and exceeding the national reading and math average has increased by 13.5 percentage points and 9.5 percentage points, in three years.
