## CPS Expands Safe Passage

Chicago Public Schools announced the addition of two new Safe Passage routes at Dyett School of the Arts and Al Raby High School. More than 1,300 Safe Passage personnel, from 22 community-based organizations support more than 75,000 students on a daily basis this school year.

CPS' Office of Safety and Security works with the school community to incorporate feedback on an ongoing basis to ensure that routes are the most effective for students. This information allows the District to position works in "hot spots" to deter any potential criminal activity.

The District's Safety and Security trains workers on how to manage different scenarios using an array of deescalation and conflict resolution strategies.

I can proudly say that my teachers at De La Cruz, Nightingale and St. Paul/Our Lady of Vilna never complained and neither should those educating your children now.

After School Matters is now accepting applications for its Fall program cycle. ## Record Rate For CPS Graduations

Mayor Rahm Emanuel announced that Chicago Public School students have achieved a record high graduation rate, with 73.5 percent of the class - or 20,436 students - earning a diploma. The rate has steadily risen over the past five years, growing more than 16 percentage points since 2011, when just over half of CPS students earned a high school diploma.

The gains came from every geographic region of the city and all types of CPS schools, with neighborhood high schools improving by 4.6 points to 73.1 percent and charter schools improving by 0.8 points to 78.2 percent.

Nearly 60 percent of students are reading at or above the average and more than half are beating the national average in math.

School attendance is on a steady rise, hitting 93.4 percent for the 2015-16 school year, up from 91.7 percent in 2010-11. Two-thirds of District schools showed improved attendance over the previous year.

42 percent of graduates are enrolled in a 4-year college or university in 2014-15 approaching the national average of a 44 percent.

In the 2014-15 school year, 36 percent of students earned one or more of the following college of career credentials early college credit, a 3+ on an AP exam, a 4+ on an IB exam, an approved career certification or a JROTC program completion certification.

The District is working to ensure that students have access to schools and resources needed to promote college readiness. This includes investments

in college-level coursework through expansion of STEM, IB, AP and dual-credit/dual-enrollment opportunities. The Mayor and CPS have set an ambitious new goal of ensuring that at least half of all CPS students earn college credit by 2019.

CPS launched two new programs earlier this year. The first began this summer, engaging 6,600 recent graduates with text messages to remind them of milestones related to enrollment, financial aid and counseling. A senior seminar curriculum in 13 high schools will help more than 2,000 seniors as they prepare to enter college.

## Cannabis Rules On Possession

The Illinois Supreme Court has adopted six new rules 585 to 590 to establish a regulatory framework for a new state law, Public Act 99-697 that discriminates the possession of small amounts of cannabis and drug paraphernalia.

Under the new law, possession of up to 10 grams of cannabis or drug paraphernalia seized during the offense is characterized as a "civil law violation" and is punishable by a fine of \$100 to \$200. Previously, possession was a Class B Misdemeanor punishable by up to six months in jail and fines up to \$1,500. Possession of drug paraphernalia was a Class A misdemeanor punishable by up to one year of imprisonment and a fine of \$750 to \$2,500.

The six rules can be found in Part F of Article V of the Illinois Supreme Court Rules. Article V governs rules on trial court proceedings in traffic, conservation and petty offences, certain misdemeanors, bail schedules for many of these violations, and now civil law violations.

The language of the new rules and all of the Supreme Court rules can be found on the Court's website.

The new rules lay out the regulatory framework for civil law violations, including applicability (Rule 585); appearance date (Rule 586); notice to accused (Rule 587); fines, penalties, and costs (Rule 588); uniform forms and processes (Rule 589); and the procedure if the accused fails to appear (Rule 590).

Rule 588 allows for the resolution of a civil law violation without a court appearance. Violators can pay a \$120 fine by mail, similar to the current process for minor traffic violations.
