

Illinois Issues Spring Travel Tips

Spring Break is no longer exclusively for college students. Illinois families will use the coming weeks to get away from the cold and enjoy vacation time between winter and summer. The Illinois Department of Insurance suggests you review these important tips before you leave.

Be Prepared

First, collect all pertinent insurance paperwork and make copies. Review your insurance coverages to understand what's covered. If your son or daughter is traveling alone, involve him/her in the review process. Explain the importance of keeping these documents safe and in an accessible location.

Auto Insurance

If you're lending out a family car, show your child where you keep the insurance information in that vehicle. Review emergency procedures with them. Prepare a list of contact numbers and important information for quick reference (including the name/phone number of the insurance company/agent, policy number, and your complete contact details).

Print a copy of the below accident checklist and keep it in the glovebox.

Checklist

- Following an accident, call 911. Do not put yourself in a dangerous situation on the side of a highway or road.
- Make sure to get contact and insurance information from the other driver(s) involved in the accident.
- Provide your contact and insurance information to the other driver. DO NOT give personal information such as a Social Security Number.
- Do not admit fault.
- Take photos of the scene, including photos of the vehicles involved, if it is safe to do so.
- Get contact information for the police department that responded to the accident.

Are you or your children traveling in someone else's vehicle as a passenger? The vehicle's policy might not provide ample coverage in the case of an accident. If not, then your auto insurance and/or health insurance policy would kick in to cover any gaps.

Health Insurance

Review your policy and the checklist below:

- Confirm that your son or daughter knows the name of the insurance company and has a list of emergency numbers (family doctor and your insurance company). Explain the meaning of

general insurance terms like co-pay and out-of-network.

- Everyone should keep your health insurance ID card, a list of your drug allergies, a list of drugs you are currently taking and information about any of your other medical conditions with you at all times.

• If you need urgent medical treatment or are in an accident, go to the nearest hospital emergency room.

• If something happens to your child, advise them to have someone contact you. Make sure your child can provide the medical facility with your health insurance ID card.

• If you need to see a doctor and it is not an emergency, contact the insurance company to find a local physician who is in your coverage network. The phone number for the insurance company, your policy number and co-pay information are located on the insurance ID card.

• Keep all paperwork, including receipts from the doctor's office, the hospital or any pharmacy if you filled any prescription(s).

International Travel

Generally, American auto and health insurance isn't readily accepted outside of the United States. If you travel outside the country, your medical insurance is likely invalid which means you'll pay for your care out-of-pocket. To find out more about the extent of your coverage, speak with your insurance agent or company before you leave home.

Travel insurance can be purchased if you are concerned about accidents or losses during a trip. If you are considering the purchase of a travel insurance policy, review the policy terms carefully to make sure you understand all coverages and exclusions before making a purchase. If it applies, review the travel insurance policy with your child before he/she leaves, focusing on the process your child would use for getting assistance, if needed.

Group Travel

Group travel is a popular way for kids to travel away from home without a parent for the first time. If your child is traveling in a group with sponsors or chaperones, make sure you provide the group leaders with emergency contacts and insurance information as well.

Retaining Teachers

Brown University recently released a report on factors that could decrease teacher turnover, especially keeping experienced staff, which can improve test scores in Math. The co-authors, William Marinell and Darrick Shen-Yee, studied middle schools including a large group in New York City and published their findings in the American Educational Research Journal.

Why teacher turnover is important is that it appears principals are the key element in most schools that convince excellent teachers to stay in a school. The excellent teachers, of course, are good for the students and most of them can work any place they want. The report indicates the principals that keep their best teachers promote professional development.

Now this can be a problem because excellent teachers know that they are. How do you get them interested in perfecting their work? Especially since many of those teaching professional development courses are "babies", who while they have a degree from a prestigious university, they have never been in a real classroom.

The excellent teacher says "Yeah, right, he's going to teach me something." Just like those who are told to see a priest for marriage counseling. You may get help, but you go in fearing what does this man know.

The authors also believe the principals should be collaborative, make schools safe and let their high expectations be known. Some schools making it safe is very demanding. Everyone talks about high expectations, but being collaborative can be hard for most principals. Non-educators might not understand, but in my day no one became a principal without at least 20 years of teaching



experience and gone through an exhaustive interview process. When done properly, those hiring know who they are getting and you, as the new principal, are quite confident in yourself and that these people know what you are going to do. So you finally get the job as principal and these experts say you should ignore why you were hired and you should work together and collaborate with your teachers. Some of your teachers are rookies or have little experience, yet the appearance of collaboration is a great skill.

How do you keep these great teachers if collaboration is really top of the list? Why not use them to lead the professional development. Oddly enough, some are bashful in front of staff members. But most of the staff recognizes that these teachers are the best.

The children you have agreed to guide during their schooling do deserve the best. Study shows what can help you, but never forget you are the educational leader and the boss. You are responsible to deliver the best product you can or when you meet God, he'll know.

Scholarships For City Colleges

Now in its second year, the Chicago Star Scholarship program at City Colleges of Chicago is helping nearly 2,000 Chicago Public School graduates attend college tuition-free this fall. As participation in the program increases, Star Scholars have proven to exceed GPA and retention rates set forth at two-year colleges.

The Star Scholarship was created in 2014 to reward CPS students with an opportunity to pursue a degree or certificate at City Colleges at no cost. Since that time, the program has grown to include a partnership between 15 Chicagoland colleges and universities to provide transfer scholarships for eligible.

Star Scholars who returned to City Colleges are also succeeding in the classroom, with an average 2.83 institutional GPA, the equivalent of a "B/B-" grade on average, as tracked for fall 2015 and spring 2016 semesters, compared to a 2.74 GPA for non-Star, non-remedial City Colleges credit students.

To support continued academic success after completion at CCC, there are partnerships with 15 four-year colleges and universities, with wrap-around supports to ensure a successful transfer. These packages range in monetary value between \$2,500 and nearly \$50,000 each year.

To become a Star Scholar, CPS students must graduate with a GPA of 3.0 or higher, demonstrate an ACT

math and English score of 17, and enroll in one of CCC's structured, pathways. Students meeting these criteria will be offered waivers for all tuition and books for up to three years.

It is estimated that students who complete the first two years at one of the seven City Colleges and then transfer to a four-year institution can save up to \$40,000 on the cost of a bachelor's degree.

Seminal research shows there is a thirty million word gap between families of lower and higher socioeconomic statuses, so children living in poverty tend to fall behind faster in their development and in school. 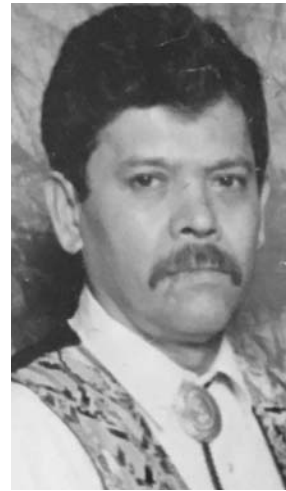
