Chocolate Fest At Plumbers Hall

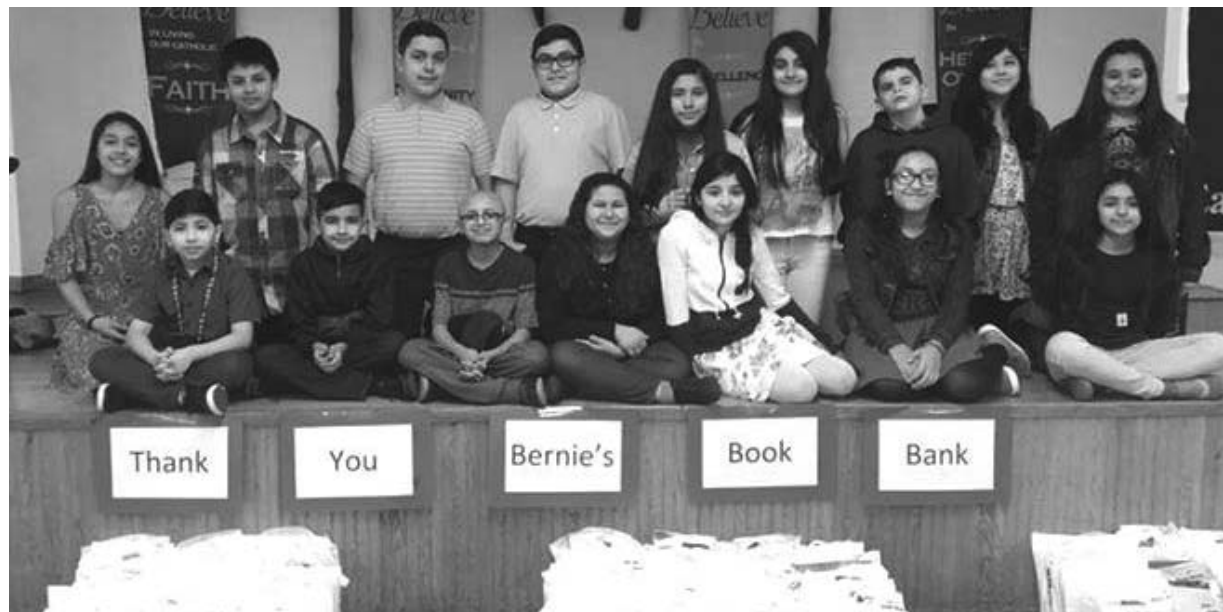

With spring in full swing, it is an APEtastic time to venture to Brookfield Zoo's Tropic World on Saturday, April 8, from 10:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. and Sunday, April 9, from 10:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. That's when the annual Ape Awareness Weekend celebration highlights the zoo's three ape species: western lowland gorillas, orangutans, and white-cheeked gibbons.

Throughout the weekend, guests can participate in interactive, ape-related activities such as comparing their own weight, arm length, and hand size with those of an orangutan and gorilla or building apeline nests using paper and wheelbarrows. The exhibit will be full of visuals, including the types of food apes eat and items that are used for training the animals to participate in their own health care.

Zoogoers can also attend special Zoo Chats throughout Tropic World to learn more about ape

populations: Orangutans at noon in the Asia section; White-cheeked gibbons at 1:00 p.m. in the Asia section; A conservation overview at 2:00 p.m. in the South America section and Western lowland gorillas at 2:45 p.m. in the Africa section.

Zoogoers can help gorillas by donating cell phones, cell phone accessories, papers, handheld games, e-readers, and laptops. Coltan—a metallic ore used in the manufacturing of these products—is primarily mined in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. The greater the demand for these electronics, the greater the demand for coltan, which sadly results in the destruction of gorilla habitats. Guests can drop them at the zoo's recycling stations, which will be located at the North and South Gates.

Improvements For Local Parks

Mayor Rahm Emanuel and Chicago Park District Superintendent Michael P. Kelly announced \$26 million in improvements to 20 aging Park District facilities as part of the new "Save Chicago's Treasures" initiative. Included are Archer Park and McKinley Park. "Some of our field houses are more than 100 years old," Emanuel said. "This is why 'Save Chicago's Treasures' is so critical. Maintaining the city's historic neighborhood gems are the essential investments that improve the quality of life for residents, build strong neighborhoods and create a better Chicago." The program will be paid for by Illinois Department of Natural Resources grant funding and Park District capital funds. The state grant funding has been frozen since 2015.

While the scope of each project varies, planned work involves major rehabilitation, including ruck restoration, masonry improvements and ADA accessibility. The Chicago Park District is the 2014 Gold Medal Award winner, recognized for excellence in park and recreation management across the nation. Promote Reading To Children 0-5

The Chicago Public Library is promoting the importance of reading 20 minutes a day to children ages 0-5. Research indicates that children are equipped with 100 billion neurons at birth, but pathways between the neurons are not yet established. Reading to children aids in strengthening those connections. Moreover, the number of words a child is exposed to between the ages of zero and three are strong predictors of educational success and eventual economic stability. Seminal research shows there is a thirty million word gap between families of lower and higher socioeconomic statuses, so children living in poverty tend to fall behind faster in their development and in school. Children need to hear at least 1,000 stories read aloud before they can learn to read themselves. Each CPL location will have a reading nook in order to model the practice of reading aloud and to provide an atmosphere conducive to reading aloud.

Adler Features Solar Eclipse

Have you ever wondered what it would be like to stand in the shadow of the Moon? Anticipating the moment before totality, when you can physically experience the shadow before it arrives. The wind picks up. Wildlife goes quiet. The temperature drops. The sunlight slowly dims in the middle of the day, bathing the surroundings in an eerie twilight. What feels like an otherworldly experience, is attainable on Earth, and it will leave you in awe. The Adler Planetarium's next temporary exhibit, Chasing Eclipses, will immerse you in the spine-tingling experience of a solar eclipse. Guests will find inspiration in eclipse chasers from history, discover the cosmic scale of being in the shadow of the Moon, and prepare to chase down the great solar eclipse on August 21st the first total solar eclipse in the United States in 38 years. In Chicago, up to 90 percent of the Sun will be covered, creating a spectacular light. The last time Chicago was this close to the path of totality for a total solar eclipse was 210 years ago in 1806. In celebration of this rare celestial occurrence, Chasing Eclipses will raise awareness, drum up excitement and give people all the tools they need to make the most of this event.
