



Report Card Pick-Up Day

Today is Parent-Teacher Conferences for students in Chicago Public High Schools. In our neighborhood most of those included attend Kelly, Curie, Juarez, Jones College Prep and Whitney Young. Some from our area are home schooled. Still others attend Catholic schools, Charter schools and the various Military Academies. These schools may have different schedules. But regardless of the school, make contact with all those that teach your children.

Having gone through this for years, sometimes the parents line up outside of classrooms, others use the space to bring teachers to a more central location. What do you as a parent need to do? Come prepared. Have papers your child has had returned and their recent Progress Report. Be ready to question the teacher that the grade on the Report Card does not closely resemble the papers and the Report.

Never accept grading methods not explained in Week 1 of the school year. Nothing like, well the grade (are low or high) is to encourage the student. Just expect what they earned. You should have a number of papers for each of the subjects. The Chicago Public Schools sent home Progress Reports on March 10th. If this was not indicative of your expectations for your child, you had time to question the Report. At high school level, the Report should not vary much from any of the four - six classes your child has.

One intimidating factor can be age. Some parents have problems questioning teachers who are those 30 year vets and some new teachers have trouble dealing with parents that are older than their own parents. In college I saw a professor to question my Biology grade. I did it like a gentleman, he looked in his grade book, saw he followed the wrong line, and changed my grade. Never any ill will and I got what I deserved. Never be combative. Remember no child is always right, but also seldom are they always wrong.

After your visit talk to your child. It is important that the child understands that you gave up your time to check on them. They are not adults. This does not have to be a "father knows best" moment. But some contact is significant in the child's life. Maybe it will help them become the good parent you hope you are. Even if it's only a couple words and a thumbs up.

Library Book Club At Kelly High

On March 14th Mrs. Debra Oswald, the librarian at Thomas Kelly High School, relaunched the Kelly Library Book Club, but this time with a new twist. Over 35 students and teachers attended the inaugural meeting of the revamped book club. Mrs. Oswald provided food and beverages from Connie's Pizza, and everyone was able to cast a vote for the first book the club would read using Google Classroom as an interactive tool participants will use to communicate, post questions, and discuss the book online between the regular meetings. According to Mrs. Oswald, this was the biggest turnout for any book club at Kelly in several years. The winning book was "If I Stay" by Gayle Forman.

Kelly is fortunate to have a library at all. Due to Board of Education budget cuts, many CPS schools do not have libraries or librarians anymore. Additionally, with the hours of many local libraries being cut along with it being unsafe for students in many neighborhoods to walk to their local libraries, many CPS students are deprived of all the resources a library has to offer.

According to Mrs. Oswald, "A library should be the academic center of a school where the exchange of information and knowledge is the key to any child's future. All students deserve access to books, resources, and a quiet place to work and study." Mrs. Oswald also stated, "The turnout we had for the book club proves we still have students who like to read and be exposed to new thoughts

and ideas if given the opportunity." With funding scarce, Mrs. Oswald was able to secure thousands of dollars in grant money for the Kelly library by being one of only two CPS high school librarians to win the prestigious Laura Bush Library grant in 2015 and the only CPS high school to win the coveted James Patterson Partnership Library grant, also in 2015.

Mrs. Oswald also sponsors a public library card drive in cooperation with the Brighton Park Library where students fill out an application for a library card at school. Mrs. Oswald then delivers the applications to the Brighton Park library and picks up the students' Chicago Public Library cards when they are ready.

Kelly is home to a diverse student population with many classes taught in Chinese and Spanish. In addition to having the largest bilingual program in the city, Kelly has a full range of IB, A.P., and other college-level classes. Mrs. Oswald used a lot of the grant money to make sure the school library has books in Chinese and Spanish, as well as books for all levels of readers.

She also worked with other teachers to make sure the library has books to supplement many of the wide range of classes taught at Kelly, such as the personal wealth and finance magazines and books she ordered for the business classes and architecture and neighborhood histories for the Chicago history classes. Mrs. Oswald enjoys helping students find books and other resources that match their diverse interests, and she looks forward to the next meeting of the book club.

Applications For After School Matters

After School Matters is accepting teen applications for its summer 2017 program session. More than 600 programs in the arts, communications, science, sports and technology will be offered at more than 60 Chicago public high schools, as well as Chicago Park District, Chicago Public Library and community organization locations and downtown at the Gallery 37 Center for the Arts.

More than 12,000 paid apprenticeship and internship opportunities will be available. Summer programs will meet four-to-five days a week for three-to-four hours per day over the course of six-to-seven weeks. Advanced apprenticeship programs will begin the week of June 26th, and all other programs will begin the week of July 5th. Participating teens will be eligible to earn a stipend of up to \$725 (depending on the program level), and interns can earn \$10.50 per hour.



Vizzie Award For Sky Show



The Adler Planetarium announces that its newest sky show, Planet Nine, and its creators Patrick McPike and Mark SubbaRao from the Adler and Michael Brown from CalTech, have won a Vizzie award for People's Choice in the Video Category at the 15th Annual Vizzies Challenge presented by Popular Science magazine and the National Science Foundation.

The Vizzies, formerly known as the International Science and Engineering Visualization Challenge, honor the most illustrative visualizations from the worlds of science and engineering.

A team of experts at NSF and Popular Science pared hundreds of submissions down to 50 finalists. From those 50, a panel of outside experts picked five Expert's Choice winners, and Popular Science readers chose five People's Choice winners.

"Planet Nine had all the elements of a great

story, and had already captured the public's imagination," said Mark SubbaRao, Adler Planetarium Space Visualization Laboratory Director. "Because the data behind the potential discovery of a new planet is so complex, Planet Nine lent itself very well to data visualization-driven storytelling."

Planet Nine opened at the Adler Planetarium in May 2016, and explores the largest of Pluto's neighbors in the Kuiper belt, inviting visitors to join in the search for a new ninth planet. Viewers follow "Pluto Killer" Dr. Michael Brown and his team of scientists at CalTech as they hunt for a planet that may be hiding deep in the outer Solar System.

World Penguin Day At Brookfield Zoo



Brookfield Zoo will celebrate World Penguin Day and learn about the zoo's colony of Humboldt penguins on Saturday, April 22nd.

On The Living Coast Plaza from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., guests of all ages can participate in penguin-themed activities. The "penguin egg shuffle" allows zoogoers to see what it takes to be a penguin parent as they balance a replica egg on their feet and walk—the way several species of penguins protect their eggs. A "who am I" activity demonstrates how animal care staff use a color-coded system to identify each of the penguins.

The first 1,000 kids joining in the festivities on the plaza will receive a keepsake World Penguin Day wristband. They can then go into The Living Coast and match their bands with a penguin that has the same color wing band. A penguin ID guide posted in the habitat will identify each bird.

Two of the zoo's penguins, Diviot and Pepe, have become known for their artistic abilities. With their fancy footwork and nontoxic watercolors, they have created fun and unique paintings.
