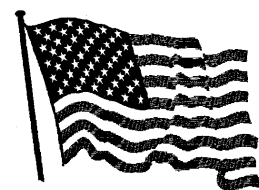

"13 Reasons Why"

"13 Reasons Why" is both a Netflix TV series and a popular book. Most of us have never heard of this. However, statistically a high number of teens and millennials are familiar with the works.

In short, it is a story of a Junior High student who commits suicide and leaves behind tapes and messages and lists explaining her action. Counselor Pierre LaRocco wrote an article about this program and he stresses that the characters and story are fictional. I will not tell the story but the student seems to reach all of her goals after death. Alex Moen, a Counselor and writer from Minnesota, states that he worries that this fantasy about a dead girl makes her a heroine because she manipulates everyone to understand her actions and does not give the true feeling that suicide is permanent. You cannot have the expectation that people will find out why or feel what they did to you.

If you know someone watching this program, please make sure they know it is not like Snow White and though she eats the apple, she comes back and meets a handsome prince and they live happily ever after.

Some alarming facts of suicide are that according to the Center for Disease Control (CDC) statistically only 1 in 50 suicides are successful. Most of

those that are unsuccessful never receive any help. Yes, whether you realize it or not, you probably know someone who has attempted or seriously contemplated suicide. Some of you are unfortunate enough to know some poor souls who were successful in taking their own life.

Think about it. If you believe that you will know that people are remorseful and sorry about your demise, you must believe in an afterlife. If you believe in an afterlife, most believe suicide will take you to hell. Then do you really think you won't?

Of course, there are many moral questions, especially mental conditions but if you know someone in this condition, seek help. Last year 44,193 Americans committed suicide. Most of them middle-aged white men. For the sake of your loved ones, if you think you know someone who is feeling like that, call the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline at 1-800-273-TALK (8255). If you know anyone watching "13 Reasons Why", please stress with them that it is make believe. The characters are fictional and none of the events have ever happened.

Public Health Issues Swimming Alerts

"Swimming is not only a fun summer activity for kids of all ages, but it's also a great form of exercise that can help keep your heart healthy and lower your risk of obesity," said Illinois Department of Public Health Director Nirav D. Shah, M.D., J.D. "However, swimmers need to take an active role in helping protect themselves and preventing the spread of germs. We all share the water we swim in, and we each need to do our part to help keep ourselves and our families and friends healthy."

This year's theme is, "Diarrhea and Swimming Don't Mix." Diarrheal incidents in recreational water can lead to outbreaks. Diarrhea is often caused by germs like Cryptosporidium, Giardia, norovirus, Shigella, and E. coli O157:H7.

Just one diarrheal incident in the water can release enough germs, that if a person swallows a mouthful of water, it could cause diarrhea lasting up to 2-3 weeks.

Many people think chlorine will kill germs in the water instantly, but some germs can survive for days in properly chlorinated pools. Crypto can survive in an adequately chlorinated pool for more than one week and is the leading cause of disease outbreaks linked to swimming.

Other common recreational water illnesses include skin, ear, respiratory, eye, neurologic, and wound infections.

Swimming in lakes

and other natural bodies of water comes with a unique set of risks such as Naegleria fowleri, "the brain-eating ameba," and harmful algal blooms.

Naegleria fowleri is a microscopic ameba commonly found in warm freshwater lakes and rivers. If water containing the ameba goes up the nose, it can cause a rare, but devastating infection of the brain. To reduce your chances of becoming ill, limit the amount of water up your nose, avoid putting your head under water, hold your nose or use nose clips, and avoid stirring up mud and scum while swimming in warm freshwater areas.

Algae can grow in warm freshwater areas and in large amounts can be harmful to people - harmful algal blooms. You should stay out of water that contains harmful algal blooms. If you see that the beach is closed, stay out of it, and don't swim, water ski, or boat in areas where the water is discolored or where you see foam, scum, or mats of algae on the water's surface.

Planetarium Features Solar Eclipse Event

Have you ever wondered what it would be like to stand in the shadow of the Moon? Anticipating the moment before totality, when you can physically experience the shadow before it arrives. The wind picks up. Wildlife goes quiet. The temperature drops. The sunlight slowly dims in the middle of the day, bathing the surroundings in an eerie twilight. What feels like an otherworldly experience, is attainable on Earth, and it will leave you in awe. The Adler Planetarium's next temporary exhibit, Chasing Eclipses, will immerse you in the spine-tingling experience of a solar eclipse.

Guests will find inspiration in eclipse chasers from history, discover the cosmic scale of being in the shadow of the Moon, and prepare to chase down the great solar eclipse on August 21st the first total solar eclipse in the United States in 38 years.

In Chicago, up to 90 percent of the Sun will be covered, creating a spectacular light. The last time Chicago was this close to the path of totality for a total solar eclipse was 210 years ago in 1806. In celebration of this rare celestial occurrence,

Dinos & Dragons At Brookfield Zoo



Through September 17th, guests of all ages can explore the new multisensory Dinos & Dragons exhibit at Brookfield Zoo, which re-creates a time when dinosaurs roamed the Earth and learning about dragon legends through culture and literature.

A display of 17 animatronic dinosaurs and dragons will feature Triceratops, Apatosaurus, Tyrannosaurus rex, and Chinese dragon.

Guests will first enter an indoor area in which they can explore the cultural connections between people and dragons through hands-on activities and up-close experiences with an amazing collection of large and small modern dragons: lizards.

Guests will see a 6-foot Komodo dragon, frilled and bearded dragons, a European legless lizard, spiny-tailed lizard, iguanas, and a plumed basilisk, as well as several species of monitor lizards: the crocodile, roughneck, Nile, and black-throated. Animal care staff will provide informal chats about the animals.

The live reptiles will be integrated within three dragon-themed areas: Medieval, Asian, and Paleontology. Each will have colorful scenery such as a fire-breathing dragon poking his head out of a castle. Engaging educational signs will illustrate the mythology of dragons, as well as facts on real-life "dragons."

Youngsters can enjoy a variety of interactive activities, such as loading and releasing a miniature catapult, putting on a puppet show complete with a castle backdrop, and digging for realistic-looking dinosaur bones and other fossils. Kid-friendly stations will feature temporary tattoos, a dragon texture rubbing project, and fun photo opportunities. At dig boxes presented by JULIE, Inc., young paleontologists can uncover dinosaur artifacts.

Exiting the indoor area, guests will encounter graphics of inhabitants from the Late Jurassic Period, when the Stegosaurus roamed North America 150 million years ago, to the Late Cretaceous Period of 85 million to 75 million years ago, when the Pteranodon wandered the Earth. Along a winding outdoor path landscaped with trees, each animatronic figure will come to life as guests pass by, triggering a sensor that signals body parts such as eyes, heads, arms, and tails to move.

Zoogers can test their dinosaur and dragon knowledge by trying to answer questions from the "Games of Bones," which will feature parodies of popular game shows: DINO-PARDY, Are You Smarter Than a

Paleontologist?, and Dino Feud.

Guests will also encounter a replica of a paleontologist's excavation site and a dinosaur dissection lab, complete with a light box of x-rays, beakers, books, and a microscope. Staff will engage youngsters in "dissecting" realistic-looking dinosaur body parts made of non-latex materials.

An animatronic Dacorex hogwartsia mom and her three newly hatched offspring will be displayed on the north side of Roosevelt Fountain.

Admission to Dinos & Dragons is \$5 for adults and \$3 for children ages 3 to 11 and seniors 65 and over. General admission to Brookfield Zoo is \$19.85 for adults and \$14.50 for children 3-11 and seniors 65 and older. For more information, visit CZS.org/Dinos Dragons.

Seek Photos Of Illinois Veterans

When the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington D.C., was finished in 1983, the wall listed approximately 58,000 serviceman and women who had either died in action or went missing in action during the Vietnam War.

Because of a fire at a government storage facility in 1973, the U.S. military lost millions of personnel records, including many of those who were listed on the wall. Although the military and other organizations made efforts to recover lost data, 24,000 veterans on the wall had no photo in the military records in 2013.

Thanks to a coordinated effort among Illinois newspapers, nearly 100 photos of Illinois veterans have been located and submitted to the Fall of Faces (available at http://www.vvmf.org/wall-of-faces/). Illinois still has over 500 service members who do not have a photo in the Vietnam Veterans Memorial

Fund's database. Did you go to high school or serve with one of these men and women? Check your photo archives and yearbooks. Talk to neighbors and former classmates; honor these veterans by putting a face to the name.
