## State Preparing to Pay for Education

Illinois finally has a budget. It is most likely that most will not like this budget. However, it is what it is. No one gets everything they want, but all must get something. This news came a few days after I read an article in Multi Briefs by "The Economic Times" columnist Bambi Majumdar. Her observation is that because many states expect cuts in Federal Education funding, instead of protesting and yelling are adding state funds to their education budgets.

Several politicians have the belief that the states, not the Feds, should fund their own people eliminating a layer of bureaucracy. It does not matter if you like the argument or not, it is a bold look at the facts.

Bambi Majumdar notes that Republican Florida Governor Rick Scott vetoed the initial K-12 budget as insufficient. He asked for \$215 million more in State funds, or about an extra \$100 per student.

In Wisconsin, the Assembly Republicans banded enough support to increase K-12 funding to give the school districts an extra \$12 million. In South Carolina there have been several compromises and, while cutting some programs, are working on more funding for the small and rural districts and it is considered an excellent start. Oregon law makers have produced an increase of 11.2% significantly more than the governor called for. It is still considered

inadequate by some, but others are happy that they have more funding to help their districts. California has announced it will boost both university and K-12 funding. They are now determining how much and how to distribute it. Texas is involved in very intense stalemate between their House and Senate who both have their own desire for reform, though they agree to increasing funding.

Here in Illinois it is hard to determine how the new funding recently passed will be divided. Some who voted on the budget will argue it's great and others will say it is terrible. It all depends on how they voted. If you want to have fun, do as I did. Look up the various websites of those that voted. The websites really range from "Aren't I great?" "Gee, I'm sorry". It is so difficult to read that I used the figures from The Sun-Times which estimates that education got very little and certainly nothing to prepare for Federal cuts. A \$350 million increase sounds like big money. However, some of the money is earmarked for programs, not in classrooms and there are 800 Illinois public schools hoping to get their share of the funding.

No matter which way you look at it, taxes go up and it's never enough. But we, as a state, have a responsibility. In Illinois schools receive funding on a per pupil allocation. CPS is constantly losing students. Some predict that even with this increase CPS might be less than it was just a few years ago.

## IDES Announces Unemployment Rate

The Illinois Department of Employment Security announced that the unemployment rate declined -0.1 percentage points to 4.6 percent in May and nonfarm payrolls increased by +2,400 jobs over-the-month, based on preliminary data provided by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) and released by IDES. April job growth was revised little to show a decrease of -7,300 jobs rather than the preliminary estimate of -7,200 jobs.

May's modest monthly payroll gain kept over-the-year job growth well below the national average. Payroll growth has been sluggish thus far this year.

In May, the three industry sectors with the largest gains in employment were: Construction (+4,000); Education and Health Services (+3,700); and Information Services (+900). The largest payroll declines were in: Trade, Transportation and Utilities (-3,700); Government (-2,500); and Professional and Business Services (-700).

Over-the-year, non-farm payroll employment increased by +34,700 jobs with the largest gains in: Education and Health Services (+19,200); Professional and Business Services (+13,400); Financial Activities (+9,500). Industry sectors with the largest over-the-year declines include: Trade, Transportation and Utilities (-7,700); Manufacturing (-1,800); and Construction (-1,700). The +0.6 percent over-the-year gain in Illinois is less than one-half as strong as the +1.6 percent gain posted by the nation in May.

The state's unemployment rate is +0.3 percentage points higher than the national unemployment rate reported for May 2017, which decreased to 4.3 percent. The Illinois unemployment rate is down -1.3 percentage points from a year ago when it was 5.9 percent. At 4.6 percent, the Illinois jobless rate stands at its lowest level

since February 2007, after having decreased for four consecutive months and is down -1.1 percentage points since January 2017.

The number of unemployed workers decreased -2.9 percent from the prior month to 298,100, down -23.0 percent over the same month for the prior year. This brings the number of unemployed workers to its lowest level since December 2006. The labor force decreased -0.3 percent over-the-month and declined by -0.9 percent in May over the prior year. The unemployment rate identifies those individuals who are out of work and are seeking employment. An individual who exhausts or is ineligible for benefits is still reflected in the unemployment rate if they actively seek work.

To help connect job-seekers to employers who are hiring, IDES' maintains the state's largest job search engine IllinoisJoblink.com (IJL). IJL recently showed 65,472 posted resumes with 181,939 jobs available.

## Animal Encounters At Brookfield Zoo



The Chicago Zoological Society, which manages Brookfield Zoo, is giving zoogoers the opportunity to meet their favorite friends at its new Penguin Encounter and Giraffe Feeding programs.

During regular zoo hours, guests can waddle over to The Living Coast and participate in a Penguin Encounter, which is offered daily at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m.

The 45-minute session begins with a member of the animal care staff sharing fun facts about the Humboldt penguins and communicating how to safely interact with the penguin during the encounter.

Penguins, like people, have distinct personalities and interests that guests get to see firsthand. Penguins are free to roam and waddle up to anyone they choose, and while one animal may be camera-shy,

another individual may enjoy a good selfie or two.

Staff will talk about the conservation work the Chicago Zoological Society is doing in Punta San Juan, Peru, to help preserve the habitat and abundant wildlife, including Humboldt penguins that live along the South American coastline.

Penguin Encounters, which cost \$40 per person, are offered year-round. Space is limited to 20 participants. Reservations are required and can be made online at CZS.org/Penguins or in Coast Gift Shop next to the exhibit. Participants must be at least 5 years old, and an adult must accompany children between ages 5 and 18.

Guests can also head over to Habitat Africa! The Savannah to participate in Giraffe Feeding, another new opportunity being offered through Labor Day. For \$10, guests can purchase a tasty treat for the reticulated giraffes and feed these magnificent creatures.

During the feeding time, an animal care specialist is on hand to answer questions and share information about the zoo's giraffe herd. This encounter is offered daily on a first-come, first-served basis from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. or until greens are gone (weather dependent).

### DCFS Issues Hot Car Alert

The Illinois Department of Children and Family Services released an audio public service announcement to build awareness on how to keep children safe in cars at [www.DCFS.Illinois.gov](http://www.DCFS.Illinois.gov).

In the summer, a car can heat up to 90 degrees in less than 10 minutes so it is never a good idea to leave a child alone in a car for any amount of time; and it is against the law in Illinois.

"If you see a child in a hot car alone, dial 9-1-1 immediately," says DCFS Acting Director BJ Walker. "Your sense of community and your intervention can help prevent a tragedy and save a life when minutes and even seconds matter."

### Bipartisan Effort To Change NAFTA

Congressman Dan Lipinski (IL-3) has been joined by lawmakers from both sides of the aisle in a call for a strong "Buy American" component in the ongoing renegotiation of the North American Free Trade Agreement.

The current language of NAFTA forces the federal government to consider bids from Mexico and Canada when making procurement decisions and prevents the full application of "Buy America" laws.

Specifically, Chapter Ten currently requires all NAFTA countries give non-discriminatory national treatment to firms in the other signatory countries. These international firms are required to be held at the same preference as domestic firms.

Although "Buy America" statutes require the federal government to give preference to American made products, NAFTA makes full compliance with this law impossible and prevents the federal government from bolstering domestic manufacturing.

## Dinos & Dragons At Brookfield Zoo



Through September 17th, guests of all ages can explore the new multisensory Dinos & Dragons exhibit at Brookfield Zoo, which re-creates a time when dinosaurs roamed the Earth and learning about dragon legends through culture and literature.

A display of 17 animatronic dinosaurs and dragons will feature Triceratops, Apatosaurus, Tyrannosaurus rex, and Chinese dragon.
