The 19th Annual World Music Festival Chicago will be staged from Sept. 8th to 24th at a variety of venues across the city.

Singer and saxophonist Seun Kuti & Egypt 80 from Nigeria will perform on Sept. 23rd at *Felabration!* featuring *Bitori* of Cape Verde, and *Africa Hi-Fi*, at the Concord Music Hall, 2047 N. Milwaukee Ave. at 8 p.m.

Opening the festival on Friday, Sept. 8th, the all-night *Ragamala: A Celebration of Indian Classical Music* starts at 6:30 p.m. under the Tiffany stained glass dome of Preston Bradley Hall at the Chicago Cultural Center, 78 E. Washington St.

Visitors have the rare opportunity to hear the rages (traditional scales or modes) during the early morning and late night hours as they were meant to be played. The all-night concert features more than eight musical groups and artists.

Writing Workshop At PJPII School

MWRD Offers Compost Sale

The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago is offering composted biosolids for sale at HASMA, 7430 W. Portage Trail, in Forest View (approx. one-half mile west of Harlem Avenue and one-half mile north of I-55) and CALSMA, 12600 S. Doty ave. (north of 130th st. - along the frontage road west of the Bishop Ford Expressway).

Composted biosolids are a product of wastewater treatment that improve soil quality by supplying organic matter, improving soil structure and porosity for a better plant root environment, and retaining nu-

trients longer. They can be used as a soil amendment or conditioner for establishing turf grass, mixing into topsoil blends, or adding to planter beds and pots for establishing flowers and trees. The cost is \$10 per cubic yard, plus tax. For more information, call (708) 588-4201.

LIHEAP Enrollment Opens Oct. 1st

The Illinois Department of Commerce & Economic Opportunity's Office of Community Assistance announced that the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program will begin accepting applications for winter heating assistance for seniors and people with disabilities beginning Oct. 1st.

The state and federally funded energy assistance program for low-income families, makes heating bill payments on behalf of households. Applications are processed through a network of local administering agencies.

Customers must bring documentation when applying for assistance including:

Proof of gross income from all household members for the 30-day income period beginning with the date of the application.

A copy of their current heat and electric bills issued within the last 30 days (if they pay for their energy directly).

A copy of their rental agreement (if they are renting) showing that utilities are included, the monthly rental amount and landlord contact information.

Proof of Social Security numbers for all household members.

Proof that their household received Temporary Assistance for Needy Families; Aid to the Aged, Blind, or Disabled; or other benefits, such as Medical Eligibility or Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, if receiving assistance from the Illinois Department of Human Services.

A single-person household can qualify with a monthly income of up to \$1,508; a two-person household up to \$2,030; a family of three can earn up to \$2,553; and a family of four can earn up to \$3,075. Benefits are paid directly to energy vendors on behalf of eligible households. The exception is households whose heating costs are included in their rent. These households must provide proof that their rent is more than 30% of their income in order to qualify for LI-HEAP benefits.

Disconnected households and families with children ages 5 or under (includes all children who are not yet 6 years old) can begin applying for assistance beginning Nov. 1st. Individuals not eligible for priority enrollment can apply beginning Dec. 1st. Applicants will be served on a first-come, first-served basis until May 31st or until funding is exhausted.
