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The Question of Monuments

The recent issue of Confederate monuments and statues might be on the minds of our students as they return to class. How should teachers and parents deal with the issue? There is no doubt it can raise tensions, but the fact is these feelings are seldom based in fact.

I have recently talked with several teachers and parents worried about the effects it will have on their children. I believe it is unfair to the children to assume how they think for any reason, color, ethnicity, age. Some of the teachers said the hardest thing will be not to let their own opinion come out. Why did they fight? They believed they were an independent nation (Confederate States of America). They had their own elected officials, court system, capital and currency. They believed, as an independent country, that the forces in Fort Sumter were an occupying force by a for-eign nation. If you believed, as in the North, that the people of the South were in rebellion, American property and

by rebellious people.

Chicago Superintendent Eddie Johnson provided a video message for students that can be played when educators begin the cur-

riculum. Six CPS schools piloted the curriculum last year to ensure it would be engaging and appropriate for students. Torture survivors visited several classrooms to tell their stories and hear students' questions.

At the end of the unit, 10th grade students will be asked to create a memorial to educate the public about this time and 8th grade students will be asked to write an opinion piece to express their views on how to improve police-community relationships.



A copy of their current heat and electric bills issued within the last 30 days (if they pay for their energy directly).

A copy of their rental agreement (if they are renting) showing that utilities are included, the monthly rental amount and landlord contact in-

formation.
Proof of Social Security numbers for all household members.

Proof that their household received Temporary Assistance for Needy Families; Aid to the Aged, Blind, or Disabled; or other benefits, such as Medical Eligibility or Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program receiving assistance from the Illinois Department of Human Services.

A single-person household can qualify with a monthly income of up to \$1.508: a two-person household up to \$2,030; a family of three can earn up to \$2,553; and a family of four can earn up to \$3,075. Benefits are paid directly to energy vendors on behalf of eligible households. The exception is households whose heating costs are included in their rent. These households must provide proof that their rent is more than 30% of their income in order to qualify for LI-HEAP benefits.

Disconnected households and families with children ages 5 or under (includes all children who are not yet 6 years old) can begin applying for assistance beginning Nov. 1st. Individuals not eligible for priority enrollment can apply beginning Dec. 1st. Applicants will be served on a first-come, first-served basis until May 31st or until funding is exhausted.

The Percentage of Income Payment Plan program is a similar

bill-payment assistance program and applications will be accepted starting Oct. 1st for LIHEAP eligible households. Households pay a percentage of their income towards their utility bill, supplemented by a monthly state benefit. Participat-ing households are eligible for a reduction in outstanding bills for every on-time payment they make. PIPP applicants will be served on a first-come, first-served basis until Dec. 31st or funding

is exhausted.



MWRD Schedules Reservoir Tours

The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago will host public tours of the first phase of the Mc-Cook Reservoir on Sundays: Aug. 27th, Sept. 17th and 24th, Oct. 1st and 15th between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. Each tour takes approximately two hours. Participants must wear sturdy footwear, no sandals, high heels, shorts or dresses allowed.

Tours begin at the Mainstream Pumping Station, 6100 River Rd., Pumping in Hodgkins, IL. Visitors can view interactive displays and watch videos of construction. Buses will transport visi-

tors for a guided tour of the McCook Reservoir. which is located west of the Stevenson Expressway (I-55) between the Des Plaines River and Chicago Sanitary and Ship Canal.

When completed, the reservoir will have a total capacity of 10 billion gallons, beginning with the first phase to be finished this vear that will provide 3.5 billion gallons of storage. Phase 2 will be completed in 2029 and provide 6.5 billion gallons of storage. The McCook Reservoir will provide an average of \$143 million per year in flood damage reduction benefits to 3,100,000 people in Chicago and 36 other 3,100,000 communities.

TARP is the country's largest public works project for pollution and flood control, covering a 375mile area that includes Chicago and 51 suburbs relying on a combined collection system. The 109mile network of tunnel systems, which capture 2.3 billion gallons of water 150 to 300 feet below ground, was completed in 2006. The Majewski Reservoir was completed in 1998 and the Thornton Reservoir in 2015. When complete, the McCook Reservoir will replace Thornton as the largest reservoir of its kind in the world.


