



Remembrance Day For 9/11

On that day no one cared what shows the First Lady wore, or how was it the president's fault. We saw people in distress and as a best part of Americans came forward, no one was concerned with race, religion, ethnicity or politics, just people in need.

The nation produced

many heroes, the passengers of Flight 93, the first responders, and buildings full of ordinary people trying to survive and to help their fellow people survive. Interesting results were that some years later because of the contamination, people that searched through the rubble got ill and some passed away. GITMO was opened and despite criticism and promises by Obama to close it, it still remains open serving versus terrorism. If you read "Enhanced Interrogation" by James E. Mitchell, it details other attacks that have been prevented because of the intel and confirmed that the 9/11 attack was supposed to have five planes.

Madigan Seeks Consent Decree

Attorney General Lisa Madigan joined Mayor Rahm Emanuel and Police Superintendent Eddie Johnson to announce a lawsuit to seek an enforceable consent decree to implement the reforms outlined by the U.S. Department of Justice in its investigation of the Chicago Police Department. In light of the new DOJ administration's preference not to seek a consent decree in Chicago, Madigan will seek reforms that provide the support officers need to implement safe and constitutional policing practices and rebuild trust between community residents and police.

Madigan filed the lawsuit earlier today in the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Illinois based on the findings of the Justice Department's investigation that revealed a pattern of civil rights violations caused by systemic deficiencies within CPD.

The DOJ report cited a number of problems, including the unconstitutional use of deadly and excessive force by officers; inadequate training on appropriate tactics, lack of supervision; a failure to adequately investigate officer misconduct and discipline officers and inadequate wellness and counseling programs to support officers.

In its report, DOJ recommended reforms needed to address these problems, specifically calling for a court-enforceable consent decree with an independent monitor to assess the progress of reform and the oversight of a federal judge.

Animal Encounters At Brookfield Zoo



The Chicago Zoological Society, which manages Brookfield Zoo, is giving zoogoers the opportunity to meet their favorite friends at its new Penguin Encounter and Giraffe Feeding programs.

During regular zoo hours, guests can waddle over to The Living Coast and participate in a Penguin Encounter, which is offered daily at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m.

The 45-minute session begins with a member of the animal care staff sharing fun facts about the Humboldt penguins and communicating how to safely interact with the penguin during the encounter.

Penguins, like people, have distinct personalities and interests that guests get to see firsthand. Penguins are free to roam and waddle up to anyone they choose, and

while one animal may be camera-shy, another individual may enjoy a good selfie or two.

Staff will talk about the conservation work the Chicago Zoological Society is doing in Punta San Juan, Peru, to help preserve the habitat and abundant wildlife, including Humboldt penguins that live along the South American coastline.

Penguin Encounters, which cost \$40 per person, are offered year-round. Space is limited to 20 participants. Reservations are required and can be made online at CZS.org/Penguins or in Coast Gift Shop next to the exhibit. Participants must be at least 5 years old, and an adult must accompany children between ages 5 and 18.

Walking Tour Of Prairie Ave.

MWRD Schedules Reservoir Tours

The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago will host public tours of the first phase of the McCook Reservoir on Sundays: Sept. 17th and 24th, Oct. 1st and 15th between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. Each tour takes approximately two hours. Participants must wear sturdy footwear, no sandals, high heels, shorts or dresses allowed.

Tours begin at the Mainstream Pumping Station, 6100 River Rd., in Hodgkins, IL. Visitors can view interactive displays and watch videos of TARP construction. Buses will transport visitors for a guided tour of the McCook Reservoir, which is located west of the Stevenson Expressway (I-55) between the Des Plaines River and Chicago Sanitary and Ship Canal.

When completed, the reservoir will have a total capacity of 10 billion gallons, beginning with the first phase to be finished this year that will provide 3.5 billion gallons of storage. Phase 2 will be completed in 2029 and provide 6.5 billion gallons of storage. The McCook Reservoir will provide an average of \$143 million per year in flood damage reduction benefits to 3,100,000 people in Chicago and 36 other communities.

TARP is the country's largest public works project for pollution and flood control, covering a 375-mile area that includes Chicago and 51 suburbs relying on a combined collection system. The 109-mile network of tunnel systems, which capture 2.3 billion gallons of water 150 to 300 feet below ground, was completed in 2006. The Majewski Reservoir was completed in 1998 and the Thornton Reservoir in 2015. When complete, the McCook Reservoir will replace Thornton as the largest reservoir of its kind in the world.

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CPS Curriculum On Burge Era

Chicago Public Schools and the Chicago Police Department unveiled a curriculum to teach 8th and 10th graders about Jon Burge, former Chicago police commander who, along with officers working under his command, have been accused by more than 100 African-Americans of torturing and physically abusing them while they were in police custody in the 1970s, 1980s, and early 1990s.

Chicago Police Superintendent Eddie Johnson provided a video message for students that can be played when educators begin the curriculum. Six CPS schools piloted the curriculum last year to ensure it would be engaging and appropriate for students. Torture survivors visited several classrooms to tell their stories and hear students' questions.

At the end of the unit, 10th grade students will be asked to create a memorial to educate the public about this time and 8th grade students will be asked to write an opinion piece to express their views on how to improve police-community relationships.
