When someone was killed, the blue star was changed to gold. It let all your friends and neighbors know of your pride and pain.

An organization was formed for these mothers in 1928. As they realized the pain of WWI had not passed. Officially the third Sunday of September was declared Gold Star Mothers' Day in 1936 because many of these ladies would never have someone to celebrate Mothers' Day in May again.

Admittedly it is not widely observed. It is hard for Americans to celebrate the death, often violently, of a child. If you see these flags with gold or even blue stars in the home of someone you know, it would be great if you showed your empathy. If your family has been in the US a long time, we all have relatives who have died serving our nation.

One of the deepest and most heart rendering conversations I have had as a principal was when some students wanted to talk to me about the news. They had witnessed reports of suicide bombers in the Middle East and the mother of the bomber yelling "I will have more children so they can kill more in this manner". I believed they felt better because they were able to discuss it. Some even compared it to abortion.

This ladies and gentlemen is culture war. Hopefully no matter how disrespectful we are to our politicians that we never let this become part of what we accept.

We, as a nation, are still losing young people in Afghanistan and Iraq and God only knows what will happen with North Korea. When you see that star it means sacrifice. Please be empathetic, maybe even a simple thank you and a prayer.

## World Gorilla Day at Brookfield Zoo

Brookfield Zoo will celebrate the first-ever World Gorilla Day—a day that highlights this charismatic species and empowers people globally to take action for conservation on Sunday, Sept. 24th.

Young zoogoers can participate in fun gorilla-themed activities throughout the day. In addition, there will be special zoo chats at 11 a.m., 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. on the walkway in Tropic World: Africa.

During these informal talks presented by the animal care staff, guests can learn about the zoo's gorillas as well as discover how people can help conservation efforts for this endangered animal. One way is by recycling cell phones and other electronic devices. Coltan, a mineral widely used in cell phones, is threatening gorillas and other forest species in the Democratic Republic of Congo.

The deforestation and mining for coltan has significantly impacted the gorilla population in its native habitat. Recycling and extending the life of electronic devices helps reduce the demand for coltan mining.

Guests are encouraged to drop off their phones and other unwanted items, including cell phone accessories, pagers, handheld games, e-readers, and laptops, to the recycling stations that are located at the north and south gates. In addition, there will be additional recycling stations in Tropic World the day of the event.

**Exemption Savings For Homeowners**

The Cook County Assessor's Office is implementing expanded exemption eligibility and savings to help more homeowners save money on property taxes. These changes resulted after Senate Bill 473 (Public Act 100-0401) was recently signed into law.

The Cook County Assessor's Office administers numerous exemptions that are subtracted from a home's Equalized Assessed Value, resulting in deductions from the dollar amount of The Homeowner Exemption, available to eligible taxpayers/residents of any ages on their primary home, increases from \$7,000 to \$10,000 in EAV. The Senior Exemption, for taxpayers/residents 65 years or older, regardless of income, increases from \$5,000 to \$8,000 in EAV. It is important to note that the exemption amount is not the dollar amount by which a tax bill is lowered. EAV is the partial value of property to which tax rates are applied; is it the figure on which a tax bill is calculated.

The Senior Freeze Exemption for low-income seniors expands eligibility by increasing allowable total household income to \$65,000 from the previous limit of \$45,000. There is also a new minimum of \$2,000 EAV deduction for the Senior Freeze, which will help offset increases in assessed value.
