Exemption Savings For Homeowners

The Cook County Assessor's Office is implementing expanded exemption eligibility and savings to help more homeowners save money on property taxes. These held Friday, Sept. 22nd at changes resulted after Senate Bill 473 (Public Act 100-0401) was recently signed into law. The Cook County Assessor's Office adminis-

numerous ters exemptions that are subtracted from a home's Equalized Assessed Value, resulting in deductions from the dollar amount of The Homeowner Exemption, availtaxpayers/residents of any ages on their primary home, increases from \$7,000 to \$10,000 in EAV. The Senior Exemption, for taxpayers/residents 65 years or older, regardless of income, increases from \$5,000 to \$8,000 in EAV. It is important to note that the exemption amount is not the dollar amount by which a tax bill is lowered. EAV is the partial value of property to which tax rates are applied; is it the figure on which a tax bill is calculated.

The Senior Freeze Exemption for low-income seniors expands eligibility by increasing allowable total household income to \$65,000 from the previous limit of \$455,000. There is also a new minimum of \$2,000 EAV deduction for the Senior Freeze, which will help offset increases in assessed value.
