## Day Of Non-Violence

The United Nations has marked October 2nd, the birthday of Mahatma Gandhi, as a day of celebrating change without violence. Today in the US, this is a little known effort by the United Nations. Because people don't seem to deal in the true nonviolent manner.

In 1968 I lived just north of the Amphitheater in Bridgeport. A group of people who claimed to be for peace, were some of the more violent people I had ever encountered.

Later, we heard they knew what they were doing, they pushed until confrontation. Peaceful marches are not in the news. Like in the Civil Rights movement, everyone remembers the dogs, the firehoses, and cars being pushed into the lagoon at Marquette Park, because violence  $\underline{\ }$  ,  $\underline{\ }$  cocause violence gave them longer time on TV.

Now very few really understand peaceful, nonviolent protests that Gandhi would have supported. Gandhi never would have supported people refusing to let the opposition speak or to let opposition supporters even on campuses. Gandhi believed if you don't listen to the other person you can never find common ground. This time in our history it appears we are not looking for that common ground.

Those of you with children at home or in a classroom might like to talk to them about Tieneman Square in Beijing where after of peaceful Gandhi type pro-democracy protests spread to over 400 cities in China.

This was too much for the Chinese communists and they sent in the

#### tanks in June of 1989 effectively ending the protests. There is no official recording of arrests or deaths that day, but they range from the 100s to the 1000s. They do let everyone know that seven soldiers died dur-

ing this event. There is a much more successful Gandhi type demonstration helped democracy for a nation -- the Philippines. Many reading this may not recall Fernando Marcos. He was an ally during the Viet Nam war and ruler of the Philippines from 1965 to 1986. But for the period of 1972 to 1981 he was of 1972 to 1981, he was supreme commander and declared marshal law. Eventually after many bloodless protests, he fled to Hawaii in 1986

and elections were held.

These are all interesting topics somewhat of a modern history that teachers seldom get to. Of course, in a short time it is an over simplification. Some people look at the fact that when Gandhi helped liberate India from the British there was such riots and murders amongst the different ethnic groups, Hindu, Muslim and Sikh that Pakistan had to be broken off from India to form its own country. This should not lessen the respect that Gandhi had amongst his people and was shown during the time of mourning for him after his assassination in 1948.

These are some interesting things to ponder. My favorite quote of Gandhi is "there are many causes I would die for, there is not a single cause I would kill for. I believe this talks to the heart of the man. I personally believe I am too American to be able to do this. It's a nice goal, but I doubt if I have it in me. So please at least mention this special day to those who look to you for guidance.

## 38th Anniversary Mass For Saint John Paul II

Saint John Paul II holds a special place in the hearts and homes of the people of Five Holy Martyrs Parish, as well as the Brighton Park community on the southwest side of Chicago, since he celebrated a Mass on October 5, 1979 at a special altar erected in our parish parking lot specifically for his visit. The Mass was attended by thousands of people who crowded the lot and the streets before dawn just to catch a glimpse of our Holy Father and be a part of that historical day. The main part of this altar still remains in our lot and a Mass commemorating the anniversary of Saint John Paul II's visit is celebrated at this altar every year on the first Sunday of October. The Pope John Paul II Centrum Committee of our Parish worked tirelessly to raise over \$100,000 in order to renovate this altar to make it a more permanent fixture in our community for individuals to come and honor Saint John Paul II in prayer. The 38th anniversary

Mass commemorating Saint John Paul II's visit to Five Holy Martyrs Parish will be celebrated on Sunday, October 1, 2017 at 11:00 a.m. at the Papal Altar in the Parish parking lot. This primarily Polish celebration is well attended by many cultural, civic and Parish organizations - a beautiful representation of Polonia in Chicago. The main celebrant and homilist at the Mass will be Father Jozef Zuziak, SDS, Salvatorian Father Merrillville, Indiana. In case of inclement weather, the mass will be celebrated in

the church. During this year's Papal Anniversary Mass, it will be the seventh time that we will not only pray and thank God for the gift and presence of Saint John Paul II among us, but we will also pray to him, asking him to continually bless us and intercede for us. For 31 years, Pope John Paul II has been with us spiritually during anniversary Masses, but since 2011, he has been with us during the Mass physically in the presence of his

On September 24, 2011, Five Holy Martyrs Parish was very fortunate to have received a relic of Saint John Paul II from His Eminence, Stanislaw Cardinal Dziwisz, the Archbishop of Krakow, Poland, and the former personal secretary to Pope John Paul II. The relic is a drop of Saint John Paul II's blood on a cloth protected by a lunula, a small, round glass encasement. The lunula has been mounted into a reliquary, a vessel in which a relic is held and exposed.

Since receiving this relic, Five Holy Martyrs Parish has begun a new tradition on the first weekend of every month by offering up our petitions to God through his intercession and venerating his relic at the weekend Masses; reciting a prayer to him as a community of believers; and finally by receiving a special blessing with the

relic at the end of Mass. Immediately after the Sunday 9:00 a.m. English Mass and the 11:00 a.m. Polish Mass, parishioners and friends are invited to gather in the Bishop Abramowicz Parish Hall for cake, coffee, and fel-

We hope that everyone will mark their calendars to attend this unique celebration at 11:00 a.m. on Sunday, October 1, 2017 – it is a wonderful reason for family and friends to come back to Brighton Park and reminisce. Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago will host public tours of the first phase of the Mc-Cook Reservoir on Sundays: Sept. 24th, Oct. 1st and 15th between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. Each tour takes approximately two hours. Participants must wear sturdy footwear, no sandals, high heels, shorts or dresses allowed.

Tours begin at the Mainstream Pumping Station, 6100 River Rd.. in Hodgkins, IL. Visitors can view interactive displays and watch videos of TARP construction. Buses will transport visitors for a guided tour of the McCook Reservoir, which is located west of the Stevenson Expressway (I-55) between the Des Plaines River and Chicago Sanitary and Ship Canal. When completed, the reservoir will have a total

capacity of 10 billion gallons, beginning with the first phase to be finished this year that will provide 3.5 billion gallons of storage. Phase 2 will be completed in 2029 and provide 6.5 billion gallons of storage. The McCook Reservoir will provide an average of \$143 million per year in flood damage reduction benefits to 3,100,000 people in Chicago and 36 other communities. TARP is the country's

largest public works project for pollution and flood control, covering a 375mile area that includes Chicago and 51 suburbs relying on a combined collection system. The 109mile network of tunnel systems, which capture 2.3 billion gallons of water 150 to 300 feet below ground, was completed in 2006. The Majewski Reservoir was completed in 1998 and the Thornton Reservoir in 2015. When complete, the McCook Reservoir will replace Thornton as the largest reservoir of its kind in the world.

#### **Exemption Savings For Homeowners**

The Cook County Assessor's Office is implementing expanded exemption eligibility and savings to help more homeowners save money on property taxes. These changes resulted after Senate Bill 473 (Public Act 100-0401) was re-

cently signed into law. The Cook County Assessor's Office administers numerous exemptions that are subtracted from a home's Equalized Assessed Value, resulting in deductions from the dollar amount of The Homeowner Exemption, available to eligible taxpayers/residents of any ages on their primary home, increases from \$7,000 to \$10,000 in EAV. The Senior Exemption, for taxpayers/residents 65 years or older, regardless of income, increases from \$5,000 to \$8,000 in EAV. It is important to note that the exemption amount is not the dollar amount by which a tax bill is lowered. EAV is the partial value of property to which tax rates are applied; is it the figure on which a tax bill is calcu-

lated. The Senior Freeze Exemption for low-income seniors expands eligibility by increasing allowable total household income to \$65,000 from the previous limit of \$455,000. There is also a new minimum of \$2,000 EAV deduction for the Senior Freeze, which will help offset increases in assessed value.



#### **Tiny Houses For The Homeless**

14th Ward Alderman Edward M. Burke recently held a hearing at City Hall examining the feasibility of establishing a pilot program to provide "tiny houses" for Chicago's homeless popu-

lation. Testifying before a Joint Committee on Housing and Human Relations, representatives of several groups supported the concept.

Homelessness affected more than half a million people in the United States in 2016 alone. Chicago has 5,889 homeless individuals based on the 2016 survey which includes individuals in shelters as well as those living on the streets.

Burke is suggesting that the "tiny house" initiative become part of the city's Chicago's Plan 2.0, a 7-step program that develops strategies to prevent homelessness and rehouse individuals.

The City Council has implemented a 4% surcharge on the house sharing industry, making Chicago among the first municipalities to leverage a dedicated funding source for homelessness efforts.

The City of Chicago participated in the national Ending Veterans Homelessness Initiative campaign that has housed more than 3,000 veterans to date.

Other initiatives underway include the construction of a new facility for homeless families at 910 N. Christiana which will specialize in triage services. The center will be operated by the Chicago Emergency Chicago Homeless Assessment and Response Center in conjunction with the Salvation Army.
