



March for Life

This Friday hundreds of students from Chicagoland and thousands from across the nation are descending on Washington, D. C. It marks the 45th annual March for Life. Many reading this article have never heard of it. It is a protest march against Roe v. Wade and the marchers go from the Mall to the Supreme Court building. You probably won't see it on TV.

A few years ago I took a group of 8th graders to the March and the Washington Park System estimated the crowd at 300,000. The same day we saw a group of about 50 anti-Second Amendment demonstrators -- guess which group made the nightly news?

The point is just because you are minority kids you cannot assume their ideas. Especially now that most students are taught about life in Science class.

I have talked to several Science teachers and they agreed that the educational material avail-

able is very good and far more superior than what they had to teach with as little as ten years ago. Some even admitted to me that they learn things on the subject they were unaware of.

It is certain that reasons for attendance at the March vary greatly from individual to individual, from deep beliefs to getting a chance to see Washington to anything is better than school. A few years ago at a school in Pilsen and one in Little Village they used the pretest and then a posttest questionnaire with the 6th, 7th and 8th graders before they started the unit on life.

The results, while not scientific, seem to state a trend. One of the questions was is abortion always okay. On the pretest about 60% said it was, but on the posttest only 20% said it was. The "mainstream press" wants you to think everyone of a certain group thinks alike. This, of course, is ridiculous. Most of us can't agree with everything with 100% of our own families.

Everyone, especially our parents and teachers, should be aware that even though the child might be only 12 or 13 they have different opinions, some like yours, and some not like yours. But available educational material has changed significantly. This might be significant note to our local politicians. Can you think any of them that are not or at least always vote pro-abortion? Folks if you are interested, watch EWTN yourself and maybe you can see why so many of our young will be at this March.

Birds of Paradise At Nature Museum

National Geographic's *Birds of Paradise* exhibition will open at Peggy Notebaert Nature Museum, Jan. 18th to June 17th.

Featuring the extravagant plumage, courtship dances and bizarre behaviors of the birds, the exhibition features the research of National Geographic photographer Tim Laman and Cornell Lab of Ornithology scientist Edwin Scholes.

"Through engaging games and fun, hands-on activities, the exhibit takes our visitors into the New Guinea rainforest and brings these extravagant birds to life," said Deborah Lahey, President and CEO.

Visitors will be greeted with natural soundscapes, traditional wood carvings and a montage of the dozens of species.

Guests can challenge their friends to a bird-like dance-off in "Dance, Dance Evolution," which encourages players to replicate the bizarre courtship dances that the males perform to attract the females.

Witness the transformations these species undergo to attract their mates through photos, videos, specimens and sculptures.

Put themselves in place of a National Geographic photographer, testing their camera trigger fingers and trying to catch speedy birds on camera, while navigating tree branches to get the best shot.

Discover maps and diagrams of the birds' ranges across New Guinea that showcase how the country's environment encouraged the birds to adapt and evolve over time.

Explore scientific knowledge about the

birds-of-paradise, including previous misconceptions, vintage illustrations and information on how the giants of evolutionary studies, including Charles Darwin, were fascinated by the birds.

Play interactive games to learn how sexual selection works, and download the Species Atlas app which offers information on all birds-of-paradise species.

Since their partnership began in 2004, Laman and Scholes have been dedicated to documenting and understanding the lives of birds of paradise. During 18 expeditions over eight years, the two were able to capture photographs, videos and detailed observations of these.

Known for their unique looks and mating rituals, the birds of paradise are a prime example of sexual selection and are one of the most elegant examples of extreme evolution. The birds are found in one of the most untarnished environments in the world: the remote rain forests of the New Guinea region.

The Nature Museum will also be showcasing *Serama* Chickens and *Bobwhite Quails* - Jan. 18th to March 19th and *Blue-headed Macaw* and *Ivory-billed Aracari* - March 21st to June 18th.

Exemption Savings For Senior Citizens

The Cook County Assessor Office has mailed Senior and Senior Freeze Exemption renewal applications for Tax Year 2017.

Nearly 300,000 applications were mailed to seniors who received the exemptions last year. The application deadline is Wednesday, Feb. 7th and state law requires annual renewal.

The Senior Exemption application is part of a booklet which also contains the separate, income-based Senior Freeze Exemption application. To qualify for the Senior Citizen Exemption for Tax Year 2017, a taxpayer must have: been born prior to or in the year 1952, owned the property during 2017 or have a lease or contract for 2017 which makes them responsible for the real estate taxes and used the property as their principal place of residence in 2017.

To qualify for the Senior Freeze Exemption for Tax Year 2017, a taxpayer must have: been born prior to or in the year 1952, a total household income of \$65,000 or less for [income] Tax Year 2016, owned the property or had a legal, equitable or leasehold interest in the property on Jan. 1st, 2016 and Jan. 1st, 2017, used the property as their principal place of residence as of Jan. 1st, 2016 and Jan. 1st, 2017 and been liable for payment of 2016 and 2017 property taxes

Seniors receiving the Senior Citizen Exemption automatically receive the Homeowner Exemption. Seniors receiving the Senior Freeze Exemption automatically receive both the Homeowner and Senior Citizen Exemptions.

Eligible seniors who have never applied for the Senior and/or Senior Freeze Exemptions in the past may visit the Assessor's web site at www.cookcountyassessor.com and download an application or contact the Assessor's Office at 312-443-7550 and request a form be mailed. Applications for the Homeowner Exemption are also available online.

Applications for additional exemptions administered by the Assessor's Office will be available within the next several weeks.

16-17 Year Olds Can Organ Donate

Secretary of State Jesse White's legislation allowing 16 and 17 year olds to register for the state's First Person Consent Organ/Tissue Donor Registry when they receive their driver's license or identification card went into effect on Jan. 1st.

The procurement organizations (Gift of Hope Organ & Tissue Network and Mid-America Transplant) must make a reasonable effort to contact a parent or guardian to ensure they approve of the donation. The parent or guardian will then have the opportunity to overturn the child's decision. Once the 16 or 17 year old turns 18, that decision would be considered legally binding without limitation.

In 2016, more than 350,000 16 and 17 year olds in Illinois were issued driver's licenses and identification cards.

Illinoisans can register with the Secretary of State's Organ/Tissue Donor Registry at LifeGoesOn.com, by calling 1-800-210-2106, or by visiting their local driver services facility.

Pilot Program For City I-D

Mayor Rahm Emanuel and City Clerk Anna M. Valencia officially launched the Chicago Municipal IDs pilot by printing the first "CityKey" cards. Additional cards will be printed between now and February for community partners who will test the system before it rolls out citywide in the second quarter of 2018.

Community groups will test the card throughout the first quarter of 2018 to ensure security and full-integration of the card features.

The official government-issued identification card will provide a "3-in-1" benefit to cardholders by allowing users to load fares, ride CTA, and use as a library card. The card will also continue to expand its functionality during the pilot with pop-up enrollment sites, additional test partners and added benefits.

The Municipal ID will cost \$5 for those 17 years and younger, \$10 for adults and free for seniors aged 65 and older. Various communities may

qualify for fee waivers including homeless individuals, domestic violence survivors, returning citizens, veterans, seniors 65+, low-income individuals, and One Summer Chicago participants.

U.S. Veterans will have the option to have a special insignia located under the cardholder's photo on their ID, indicating their service in the U.S. Armed Services. Cardholders will also have the option to include intent to donate organs, as well as emergency contact or medical information.

BBB Reports 2017 Top Scams

Phishing Scams tops the list of 2017 reports to Chicago and Northern Illinois Better Business Bureau Scam Tracker, knocking out the Tax Collection scam which has topped the list locally and nationally for the past few years.

Phishing scams have become the doorway for many cyber criminals to launch ransomware and malware attacks on businesses and consumers, and often leads to losses in money and valuable data. The BBB advises: never click on links or open attachments from unsolicited emails, and never provide personal information without first verifying the source.

"The more we inform consumers on scam tactics, what to look for and how to avoid them, the better chance we have to stop fraudsters in their tracks," said Steve J. Bernas, president and CEO of BBB.

Another scam that lit up Scam Tracker in 2017 was the "Can You Hear Me" scam where fraudsters faked having a headset problem in an attempt to get unsuspecting victims to say "yes" on a recorded line which could be used as phony proof of purchases.

Rounding out the top three reflects the proliferation of Online Purchase Scams as the number of fake websites continues to rise. Scammers pose as legitimate operations

selling fake vacations, high demand merchandise at discount prices, and even fake pets.

"That's why our online Scam Tracker tool is so vital in the work we do," added Bernas. "We are only as good as the information we receive so that's why it's so important for consumers to report any activity they suspect is fraudulent to BBB, even if they themselves weren't scammed."

Top 10 Scams of 2017: Phishing Emails/Texts - stealing money and information; Can You Hear Me - phone scam; Online Purchase - fake websites; Employment - job offer scams; Tax Collection - fake IRS or Treasury Dept. calls/emails; Debt Collections - invoices, calls or emails for fake debts; Tech Support - calls, texts or emails from fake tech support agents; Sweepstakes/Lottery/Prizes - fake claims to steal money upfront; Travel/Vacations - too good to be true offers and Identity Theft - fraudulent activity using your personal information.
