



Party For Planet At Brookfield Zoo

Brookfield Zoo will celebrate its annual Party for the Planet on Sunday, April 22nd, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The day of fun-filled environmentally-friendly activities, feature animal Zoo Chats, recycling and planting opportunities, and an Eco Expo.

At 11 a.m., zoogoers can join the grounds staff in planting a tree on the south mall. Between 11 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. zoogoers can assist in planting pansies in containers outside Hamill Family Play Zoo. An oak sapling and acorn seeds (while supplies last) will be available to take home and plant. The zoo, which features more than 100 species of trees, recently had its arboretum status renewed. Guests may download a tree guide from the zoo's website at czs.org/TreeGuide to help identify trees along the walkways.

During informal Zoo Chats, experts will discuss how everyone can make a positive difference for the Earth and its animals. Head over to Great Bear Wilderness at 11 a.m. for a talk about bears. At 12:15 p.m., staff will share stories about the animals who reside at Pinniped Point. On the south side of the Carousel at 1:30 p.m., guests can meet one of the zoo's animal ambassadors. At 2:30 p.m., venture over to the north side of the Pachyderm Building to learn about the black rhino.

At the Eco Expo, located at the North Mall, representatives from more than 20 organizations and companies will chat with zoogoers about ways to be ecofriendly. Those attending include: Illinois Environmental Council; Citizens Utility Board; Friends of the Forest Preserves; Downers Grove Park District; Lake Katherine Nature Center & Botanic Gardens; Dunes Learning Center; The Anti-Cruelty Center; Harper College Biology Club; Metropolitan Water Reclamation District; Student Conservation Association; Campton Township Open Space; Illinois Green Alliance; and the Forest Preserves of Cook County. Ape Weekend At Brookfield Zoo

Witness the agility, strength, and intelligence of three ape species during Brookfield Zoo's Ape Awareness Weekend on Saturday, April 14th from 10 a.m. to 5:15 p.m. and Sunday, April 15th from 10 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The annual, two-day event takes place at Tropic World and highlights the western lowland gorillas, orangutans, and white-cheeked gibbons.

Guests can participate in interactive, ape-related activities such as comparing their own weight, arm length, and hand size with those of an orangutan and gorilla, or building apeline nests using paper and wheelbarrows. There will be explanations of the types of food that apes eat in the wild and presentations that include items that are used for training the animals to participate in their own

Special Zoo Chats throughout Tropic World will the dangers they face in the wild and what can be done to help them. Informal talks about orangutans and white-cheeked gibbons will take place in the Asia section at noon and 1 p.m. An overview of primate conservation will be at 2 p.m. in the South America section and a chat about western lowland gorillas at 2:45 p.m. in the Africa section.

Mummy Exhibit At Field Museum



The Field Museum is conducting an exhibition of Mummies from ancient Egypt and Peru through Sunday, April 21st from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Comprised of objects from The Field's own collection, the exhibition includes 14 mummies, exquisitely painted coffins, stone sarcophagus fragments, ceramics, mummified animals, and tummy masks. Using non-invasive CT scanning, DNA analysis, and other cutting-edge technologies, museum scientists pare back thousands of years and reveal the people behind gilded coffins. Scans of the intricately wrapped "Gilded Lady" mummy of ancient Egypt reveal details that show us what she looked like.

Visitors will also be able to virtually explore the contents of never-opened Peruvian mummy bundles to discover the individuals within: children, mothers, and the objects their families buried with them.

City Promotes Opportunity Fund

The City Council will consider a measure that would authorize an additional \$6 million in funding for the Neighborhood Opportunity Fund, which generates funds from downtown development projects to support commercial corridor growth on the South, Southwest and West sides.

The inaugural class of Fund winners was announced in June 2017, in which \$3.2 million was awarded to 32 businesses, selected from among more than 700 applications. The second round awarded \$3.2 million to 25 businesses, selected from more than 800 applicants.

The Neighborhood Opportunity Fund, is financed by voluntary contributions from downtown construction projects. The payments are in exchange for density bonuses that allow developers to exceed zoning limits for a specific development site.

Eligible costs for grants include property acquisition and rehabilitation, small business training and local hiring subsidies. Up to 65 percent of a small business' eligible project costs can be covered through the program. Grants that exceed \$250,000 require City Council approval.
