Reindeer Birth At Brookfield Zoo



Bunny a reindeer at Brookfield Zoo gave birth to a female reindeer on April 2nd, following a gestation of about 7½ months. Guests visiting the zoo can see the two bonding in their outdoor habitat at Hamill Family Wild Encounters.

The unnamed fawn weighed just over 12 pounds at birth but will almost double her weight in two weeks due to her mother's milk. She will also begin to graze on solid food in another week or two, but will still rely on Bunny for nutrition for about six months. Like her brother, who was born last year, the fawn was up and walking around her habitat within two hours of her birth.

Fawns are born with dark fur that absorbs radiant heat from the sun as well as acts as camouflage. At about two to three months, they begin to shed as lighter-colored fur grows in. Also, little antler buds begin developing at about a month old followed by short spikes within the first year.

Reindeer are found in arctic tundra and woodland edges in northern regions, including Scandinavia, Greenland, Canada, Alaska, and Russia. They are different from all other deer species because their noses are covered with fur and both sexes have antlers. The antlers are made of solid living bone and no two sets are alike. Antlers grow out of small bony platforms called pedicles and are covered with velvet, a soft tissue that supplies necessary nutrients. Males shed their antlers in November and December and females later in January or February.

Both genders begin growing a new set of antlers in early spring. Reindeer are well adapted to cold climates. They have hollow hairs that act as insulation by trapping in body heat. Two broad-hoofed toes help support them on snowy or swampy ground. Fatty tissue

keeps the feet flexible in subzero weather. The hooves have sharp edges to help prevent slipping on ice. In the summer, the edges of the hooves wear down exposing a spongy pad that helps support them on spongy ground.

Mummy Exhibit At Field Museum

The Field Museum is conducting an exhibition of Mummies from ancient Egypt and Peru through Sunday, April 21st from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Comprised of objects from The Field's own collection, the exhibition includes 14 mummies, exquisitely painted coffins, stone sarcophagus fragments, ceramics, mummified animals, and tummy masks. Using non-invasive CT scanning, DNA analysis, and other cutting-edge technologies, museum scientists

pare back thousands of years and reveal the people behind gilded coffins. Scans of the intricately wrapped "Gilded Lady" mummy of ancient Egypt reveal details that show us what she looked like.

World Penguin Day At Brookfield Zoo



Brookfield Zoo will stage its World Penguin Day celebration on Saturday, April 21st. Activities for the entire family will be taking place between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m., inside and outside The Living Coast exhibit.

The first 1,000 youngsters will receive a commemorative World Penguin Day wristband. The bands are the same colors as those on the zoo's penguins, and are how the animal care staff identify each individual bird. Kids can check out the ID guide posted in The Living Coast's Rocky Shores' habitat to determine which penguin is wearing the same color band as theirs.

Zoogoers can meet a few of the resident penguin "artists" outdoors at 12:30 and 2:30 p.m. on Saturday (weather permitting). The pieces of art are created with nontoxic watercolors. On the back of each canvas is a photo of the "artist" and footprint signature.

A pack of five notecards featuring images of the paintings will be available with a minimum \$10 donation. Proceeds will go towards the Chicago Zoological Society's Animal Care and Conservation Fund to help support its efforts in the Punta San Juan program. Located along South America's west coastline in Peru, Punta San Juan is a reserve where research and community outreach is being conducted to help protect the species native to the region, including Humboldt penguins.

Guests can attend Zoo

Chats and observe the penguins being fed in their habitat at 10:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. During the informal talks, animal care staff will share stories about the zoo's colony of Humboldt penguins along with conservation efforts that are being done to help protect these charismatic animals. At noon and 1:30 p.m., staff will provide the birds with enrichment items and answer any questions from the public.

The zoo's volunteer educators, will be at an information station with penguin artifacts. Volunteers will engage guests of all ages in the "egg shuffle" activity. Those who have wondered what it is like to be a penguin parent can try walking while balancing a replica egg on top of their feet. This demonstrates how several species of penguins protect their eggs.

A 6-foot-tall penguin sculpture made of plastic trash will remind everyone about the negative impact plastic waste pollution has on ocean life. Zoogoers can help keep these majestic birds safe with daily practices, including recycling plastic garbage and using reusable bags at grocery stores. Individuals can also download the Monterey Bay Aquarium's Seafood Watch Consumer Guide at seafoodwatch.org that suggests choices based on responsible fishing practices.

Those interested in helping care for the Humboldt penguins at Brookfield Zoo can contribute to the Share the Care program. For \$35, the recipient will receive the Basic Package, which includes a 5-inch x 7-inch color photograph of a penguin, a personalized adoption certificate, a fact sheet about the species, a Share the Care car decal, and an invitation to the 2018 Share the Care Evening. IDPH Warning For Cannabinoids

The Illinois Department of Public Health issued a warning about the dangers of synthetic cannabinoids, often called fake weed, K2 and spice, after six people who used synthetic cannabinoids suffered severe bleeding.

"Despite the perception that synthetic cannabinoids are safe and a legal alternative to marijuana, many are illegal and can cause severe illness," said IDPH Director Nirav D. Shah, M.D., J.D.

Synthetic cannabinoids are hundreds of different chemicals which act on the same brain cell receptors as the main active ingredient in marijuana. The health effects from using them can be unpredictable and harmful - even life threatening.

City Promotes Opportunity Fund

The City Council will consider a measure that would authorize an additional \$6 million in funding for the Neighborhood Opportunity Fund, which generates funds from downtown development projects to support commercial corridor growth on the South, Southwest and West sides.

The inaugural class of Fund winners was announced in June 2017, in which \$3.2 million was awarded to 32 businesses, selected from among more than 700 applications. The second round awarded \$3.2 million to 25 businesses, selected from more than 800 applicants.

The Neighborhood Opportunity Fund, is financed by voluntary contributions from downtown construction projects. The payments are in exchange for density bonuses that allow developers to exceed zoning limits for a specific development site.

Eligible costs for grants include property acquisition and rehabilitation, small business training and local hiring subsidies. Up to 65 percent of a small business' eligible project costs can be covered through the program. Grants that exceed \$250,000 require City Council approval. 
