Budget Time for CPS Schools

This is a critical time for Chicago Public Schools -- it's Budget time. The Local School Councils along with the school principals must set their budget for 2018-19 school year. This is a time of year to plan for next year and to fund it the best you can.

The schools have been given their budgets and

have been assured it has been increased and were given a guarantee that they would not lose funding, even if enrollment drops. This has not been true for the past several years and principals and Local School Councils were forced to cut budgets during the school year.

CPS has announced that some special programs would be added throughout the city. Some of the programs are early college STEM, STEM magnet, and IB programs. They also plan to announce two new Classical schools.

The point of the budget process that this open process should make you aware: now is the time to plan. Do not complain in October if your child's textbooks are outdated, or in February if you find out there will be no Summer school. Now is the time that the principal and LSC are setting these priorities. If you have a concern, contact the school now.

The funding is set, there is more this year than last year, and guaranteed not to be reduced. So help plan with the money. They will work within their budget. In reality, no one should crab at the Mayor or Governor, the School Board or the President. The funds we have is what we work with. At home if you need a car, you decide whether it should be new or used according to your budget. You don't complain, you make the choice if you want a Hyundai or a Lexus. You don't expect to win the lottery and get whatever you want to make up the difference.

Finally, let's thank our neighbors who stood up for our schools and were elected to the Local School Councils on April 18th and 19th. They will take office on July 1st.

Smart Policing For 8th District

Mayor Rahm Emanuel and Chicago Police Department Superintendent Eddie Johnson announced that Chicago Lawn (8th District) on the southwest side is the latest district to deploy the Department's smart policing strategy. A station-based strategic nerve center, district-wide gunshot detection, crime cameras and mobile phone technology have been deployed to assist in crime strategies and investigations.

In 2017, smart policing strategies were implemented in six police districts: 6 (Gresham), 7 (Englewood), 9 (Deering), 10 (Ogden), 11 (Harrison) and 15 (Austin) which supported an average 25% reduction in shootings.

Five new patrol vehicles have been equipped with License Plate Reader technology to stop carjackings, and 108 new police officers have been trained.
