

## Father's Day

Fathers' Day will soon be here. For some of our school age children comes the sad question Who do they say Happy Fathers' Day to? In an ever decreasing number of families, the question is easy.

The families should be careful and many teachers can bring up the same issue by having students do art projects or cards -- but for whom are these cards made? I suggest teachers may offer to let the students make more than one or none if they so desire. The issue for many children surrounds divorce, live-ins, remarriage, gay marriage, and DNA testing. The all too easy answer is the man, if any, lives in the household. The other issue is, is there a male figure close to the child, maybe an uncle or grandfather.

Depending on the age of the child, the question

can be difficult and they often wonder "who's my real father?". Some of these children have brothers and sisters, stepbrothers and sisters, God brothers and sisters, and all of them have different biological fathers. Some come around, some send money, some are unknown. The question the family must answer is If there is no traditional father, is there a new husband, ex-husband, live-ins, ex live-ins, ex stepparents, and the one I heard a lot, especially from teenage girls, was sperm donor.

I had it easy as child, as the Sisters suggested cards with spiritual bouquets. You could make one or a dozen. This was a good way for teachers. Let the kid choose who, if anyone they should make gifts for. Moms should be careful to try not to let any bitterness between the adults spread to the young ones.

It might be hard to imagine, but I had several African American kids tell me they wished I was their Dad. While this is nice, I had to be careful not to encourage or overstep the expectations of my job. When I taught in high school, I escorted several girls I was not related to, to a Father/Daughter dance so they could attend and be part of the group. One thing to be sure is that if a child seems hesitant at this point, respect that silence. You may learn more than you wish.

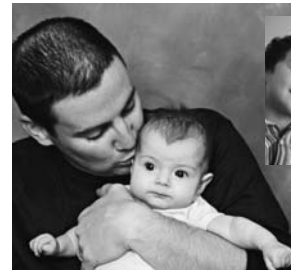
## Family Nature Days At Lincoln Park Zoo

And one day, we leave our fathers behind forever.

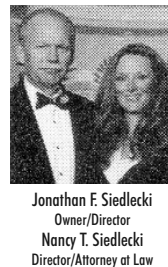
