

School Shootings

A recent report compiled by Evie Blad on the controversial subject of arming school staff had some very interesting Federal statistics. School shootings are statistically rare and "schools remain relatively safe and the tendency of violent homicide in schools have not trended significantly upwards since the Columbine shooting in 1999".

Although sad situations, like occurred in Parkland, Florida and Santa Fe Texas made about a third of parents fear their children's safety at school, there is very little reason for the worry. Many organizations play on this issue but if they were common we could not use the children and parents to meet a specific agenda and fly certain people around the country to give speeches.

In many rural areas majority of parents want armed staff. Such as demonstrated at the meeting with US Attorney Jeff Sessions in Percy, Arkansas where sheriff's deputies told school officials that in an active-shooter situation they should expect a 20-

30 minute response time. This is one of the reasons they have allowed the Arkansas State Police to train those staff members interested in a 60-hour program with a 24 hour review every year.

This is one reason that local law is probably best. We can never put ourselves in these situations. Of all the schools I worked at I had to attend many a funeral for violent death and many visits to hospitals, some of which never recovered, but none of these happened in a school. We know, that despite all training, you never know how you'll react until it happens. One soldier charges a machine gun nest and gets the Congressional Medal of Honor, another hides in a foxhole until the shooting is over. In the recent events we have seen things like this.

One of the more interesting ways a district in Bentonville, Arkansas is trying to make their Police presence to be stronger, they have open space for the Police to stop in for a quiet place to fill out paperwork. So you never know when a squad or an off-duty officer may show up to complete some work -- ever wonder why cops get a discount at doughnut shops -- they might stop in any time.

I hope this makes you realize there is not only one answer to school safety. We see that statistically school is about a safe a place as the children can be. But having said that, I have worked in areas that gang intelligence was at my school every dismissal because the bad guys knew were certain other bad guys would be most of the time and could be an easy target, outside the building. Here in the city we probably will never arm our teachers, but the safe passage and other such programs seem to be helping.

CPS Announces Sustainable Initiative

Chicago Public Schools announced the 20 schools who will receive a combined \$10 million investment to implement the Sustainable Community School Initiative -- a new initiative that pairs schools with community organizations to increase access to academic and non-academic programs for children and families. In the months ahead, schools and partner agencies will create detailed plans outlining the specific schedule of services that will be available to families, including afterschool programs, health services, family engagement programs, and more. The Chicago Board of Education approved this investment at its June 2018 Board Meeting, and programming is expected to launch in October.

The initiative was created with the goal of improving access to various programs for children and families, and supporting the relationships between teachers, parents, and school personnel -- all while creating a supportive environment where classroom and social support services work together to enhance student achievement.

The types of services

and programming will be tailored to the unique needs of each school community. Examples of the resources school communities will receive include: health services, social and emotional learning supports, enrichment and recreational activities, homelessness supports and services, and family programming.

This work is being driven by a 20-member taskforce, involving CPS leaders and union officials, who met on a bi-weekly basis to direct and manage the implementation. Earlier this year, the joint taskforce developed standardized criteria and invited eligible schools to apply.

In order to be considered, the school must be located in a primarily low income community with 81 percent or more of the students qualifying for free or reduced lunch, and must be a neighborhood open enrollment school. Schools that met all of the criteria were invited to apply along with a partner agency of their choice.

Local schools selected are: Brighton Park Elementary and Kelly High School partnered with the Brighton Park Neighborhood Council.

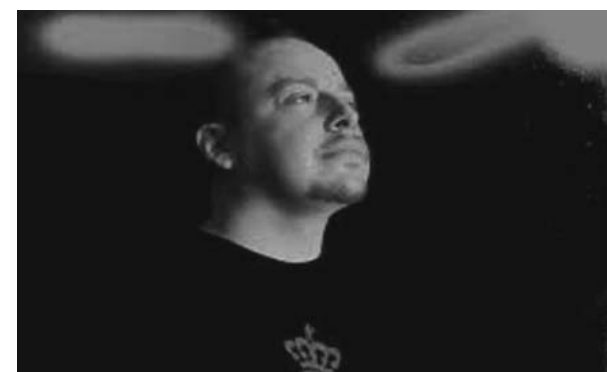
