

Fewer Parents Want Children to be Teachers

In July, PDK International released its yearly survey of American attitudes about teachers. The poll shows an increase in confidence in Public School teachers. It shows 61% approve, while in 2015 only 51% were satisfied with Public School teachers.

The survey also seems to agree that teacher salaries are too low and 73% would support teacher strikes for better pay. Though 6% believe many are overpaid. This is due to many unions obtaining automatic yearly raises, not tied to performance.

The most significant part of this survey was that over one half of the respondents would not want their child to become a teacher. That has risen 11% since the 2014 results. So the poll indicates that the teaching profession is in trouble. It appears that the majority of Americans recognize the importance of the teaching profession, and have a willingness to increase their salaries, but they do not

want their children to become part of the profession.

The parents surveyed indicated the increased pressure and expectations of the job. Randi Weingarten, President of the American Federation of Teachers, said that these findings prove that Americans "understand the burden placed on teachers".

For your information you should realize that PDK is a society of educators who were honor students in college and stands for Phi Delta Kappa International, so when reading the survey, you should keep this in mind. I personally am not surprised that the survey would say that the job is respected, underpaid, and that parents, while finding the job valuable, would often prefer their children chose another profession.

In elementary school, I was raised in Back of the Yards, in high school, I lived in Bridgeport. Not a lot of the people I knew went to college. Several asked me, why are you going to college? We can all get jobs from the city. In fact, city officials did offer me a few jobs and even asked me to change my major. But I wanted to teach. I am very grateful to them for the offers, but I made the right choice. And among my friends and their families they looked at me and my profession as a kid from hood who chose a job having dignity. So these stats might not fit exactly where we are from, but it does show a tendency that educators must be aware of when trying to staff their buildings.

Applications For LIHEAP Program

The Illinois Department of Commerce & Economic Opportunity's Office of Community Assistance announced that the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) will begin scheduling appointments and accepting applications for winter heating assistance for seniors and people with disabilities beginning Oct. 1st.

Customers must bring all required documentation when applying for assistance including:

Proof of gross income from all household members for the 30-day income period beginning with the date of the application.

A copy of their current heat and electric bills issued within the last 30 days (if they pay for their energy directly).

A copy of their rental agreement (if they are renting) showing that utilities are included, the monthly rental amount and landlord contact information.

Proof of Social Security numbers for all household members.

Proof that their household received Temporary Assistance for Needy

Families (TANF); Aid to the Aged, Blind, or Disabled (AABD); or other benefits, such as Medical Eligibility or Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), if receiving assistance from the Illinois Department of Human Services.

Disconnected households and families with children ages 5 or under (includes all children who are not yet 6 years old, that is, up to 5 years and 364 days) can begin applying for assistance beginning Nov. 1st. Individuals not eligible for priority enrollment can apply beginning Dec. 1st. Applicants will be served on a first-come, first-served basis until May 31st.

A single-person household can qualify with a monthly income of up to \$1,518; a two-person household up to \$2,058; a family of three can earn up to \$2,598; and a family of four can earn up to \$3,138. Benefits are paid directly to energy vendors. The exception is households whose heating costs are included in their rent.

Deadline For App Challenge

Congressman Dan Lipinski (IL-3) is inviting high school students to participate in the 2018 Congressional App Challenge, a competition designed to encourage student involvement in computer science and coding through Oct. 15th.

This nationwide effort allows students to compete against their peers by creating an application – or “app” – for web, PC, tablet, Raspberry Pi, mobile, or other platform of their choice. Apps may be written in any programming language, including C, C++, Java, JavaScript, Python, Ruby and block code.

Students may compete as individuals or in teams of up to four members. At least two members of each team must be eligible to compete in the district in which they enter.

Apps created may cover any topic, but they must be original and appropriate.

Submissions will be judged on quality of the idea, including creativity and originality; implementation of the idea, including user experience and design; and demonstrated excellence of coding and programming skills.
