



9/11 Still Haunts Us

It's been 17 years since that terrible morning that the terrorists commandeered four flights and used them to kill many people in their suicide mission, but many like myself, try to treat the day with the positive note calling it Patriot Day.

Some have asked me when will you forget this bloody day and I say never. I did not know any of the first victims personally, though I had friends who lost relatives and acquaintances.

As educators and parents we should help our students show empathy to families of the victims. Who were the victims? All of us, not just the loved ones of the 3,000 who have their names etched in the 9/11 Memorial in New York City.

While everyone wanted to help, as those who were in the buildings trying to rescue citizens of the world, they did not know these people as the buildings collapsed around them. Upon their collapse, a large plume of "toxic dust" filled the air for miles. No one realized at the time just how toxic it was as chemicals and mercury vaporized into the atmosphere. About 70 firemen and 60 policemen on the scene after the collapse have died in ways that the families attribute to 9/11. This includes 55 of cancer, and other pulmonary diseases and asthma. Those there could register for special Ground Zero related workmen's comp. About 14,000 applied for it before the deadline of August, 2007.

The most recent stats say that over 40,000 have claimed some problem they relate to the terrorist attack. Most common being depression, anxiety, and post traumatic syndrome. These numbers are very hard to verify because of privacy issues and, sad to say, a few may just be looking for money so they can become eligible for the "9/11 Victims Compensation Fund".

The truth is if you or any of our children have ever had a trauma in their life it may not show up right away. This is something we must watch for in our kids and the effects could last their entire life. Remember, pray, but for the Grace of God it could be one of us suffering.

Park District Headquarters to 14th Ward

Aldermen Edward M. Burke (14th) and Raymond Lopez (15th) joined Mayor Rahm Emanuel and Chicago Park District Superintendent Michael Kelly in announcing that the Park District Board is poised to relocate its headquarters to the Brighton Park community in the 14th Ward.

The Board will consider purchasing 17 acres of land for \$8.6 million to build a 54,000 square foot administrative building at 48th st. bordering Western ave. The proposal also includes plans for a 19,000 square foot

recreational center, three soccer fields, an entertainment venue for musical events and a children's playground and spray-pool area.

On-site construction

and other improvements would cost \$41.4 million.

The project would be completed in the next two years and transform a vacant industrial site that was once occupied by

Wilson Steel and Chicago Tube & Iron. This site provides public access to C.T.A. bus routes #48, #49 and #94, as well as the Orange Line at 49th and Western.
