



100th Anniversary of Veterans' Day

World War I officially ended, which was then called Armistice Day, November 11, 1918. Much of the world celebrated this day and in various local communities its popularity grew. As we began to have fewer and fewer Veterans of WWI, it became popular to celebrate all Veterans on this day, not just those in the military on Armistice Day. Then, after World War II and the Korean War, there were an enormous number of Veterans and the first national observance of Veterans Day was in 1954.

The Viet Nam Veterans are still quite numerous and a few things need to be clarified to recognize these people who gave their time and some their lives during the war. The war has been over for 45 years now. But there are so many movies, etc. with political agendas that I would like to mention a few things that were made known in the 1993 documentary on the History Channel. The United States did not lose the war in Viet Nam. We had signed a Peace Accord in 1973 and all our troops were withdrawn by March 29, 1983. The Fall of Saigon was

April 30, 1975. You can not lose a war that you had not been part of for two years.

The North Vietnamese supplied by both the Soviets and Red Chinese re-crossed the Demilitarized Zone and our Congress refused to help fund the South Vietnamese with ammunition and supplies and were, therefore, easily overrun. This was the real racism of the war. We never would have left a Caucasian army or Black nation to face this onslaught on their own. Also despite "common knowledge" 86% of those who died in this war were Caucasian, 12.5% were Black and 1.2% were other races.

According to ASEAN (Association of Southeast Asian Nations) the 2.6 million Americans who served in Viet Nam helped save nations like the Philippines, Indonesia, Malaysia, Singapore, and Thailand as they stayed free of Communism. Those countries are thankful to American Vets as we all should be, whether the Vet was combat or not. I had a neighbor who was embarrassed because he drove a truck on to the beaches at Normandy, but never heard a shot or used a gun. This is no reason not to be proud of your service.

Thank a Vet this Veterans Day. Be grateful they are still with us. Places like Arlington and the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier and similar cemeteries like I visited with my family in Normandy, France and Florence, Italy and Gettysburg, PA still make my eyes tear up and my heart swell with pride. Let's pass this on to our other generations. Faithful citizens have been remembering our fallen citizens for 100 years, but this does not include the American Revolution and others who have served in war and peace.
