The State Board of Education continues to try to formulate an exam that actually has the validity to judge the performance of the students in its public schools. There are always groups that complain about the tests. This year, the Illinois Assessment of Readiness is being administered from now until April 11th - and, of course, the complaints are already in. It is reported in The Sun-Times that some complain that after all the time and all the money, they claim there is no difference between the new IAR test and the PARCC test it is meant to replace.

## County Tax Sale Starts May 3rd

Delinquent Cook County property taxes totaling \$189.6 million on 56,976 properties is scheduled to be auctioned at the Annual Tax Sale that begins May 3rd. Lists of all the properties, by municipality and Chicago ward, are published on [cookcountytreasurer.com](http://cookcountytreasurer.com).

Nearly 21,000 owners may be unaware of the Tax Sale because the U.S. Postal Service has returned their bills and subsequent notices. About 22,000 owe \$1,000 or less. Over 2,000 homes are probably owned by senior citizens. As many as 900 seniors would see their homes removed from the Tax Sale if they applied for property tax exemptions they received last year.

Homeowners can avoid the Tax Sale by paying all delinquent taxes and interest before the sale begins. To see if your taxes are delinquent - and to make a payment - visit [cookcountytreasurer.com](http://cookcountytreasurer.com) and select "Avoid the Tax Sale." You can search by address or by Property Index Number. The May 3rd Tax Sale is for homes, businesses, and land with unpaid bills for Tax Year 2017 (originally due in 2018).

ference between the new IAR test and the PARCC test it is meant to replace.

One of our experienced area principals told me that a positive note is that the test is shorter. It remains long for many of those in the third grade, which start taking the test. It is about six hours total between Math and Reading. All the tests are on the computer, which means the administration at the schools has a need to plan well. The schools must space out the tests to make them more digestible and allow for their correct number of working computers that fit in their band width.

You can discuss if the test actually measures what it hopes to, but you cannot deny that these tests, in some form, will not go away soon. For best results, administrators must prepare time and space, prepare for possible power outages, computer glitches, and emergency days, and the unexpected, like fire drills. And, of course, making up for the absent teachers and students. Teachers must follow the instructions and not share their apprehension with the students - they have big ears.

Parents encourage your children to do their best, take the test seriously, but not to the point of worrying. Remember, even if the test is flawed, judgements will be made as a result and they will be compared to other students' test scores and, of course, all the kids are under the same situation. All we hear about how good schools are and transparency demands that some formal test be given. We work with what we have.
