Burke Supports Gel Fuel Ban

Chicago alderman would seek to ban the sale of a potentially dangerous gel fuel product used in portable fire pots that has been linked to a risk of serious injury to consumers under an ordinance proposed by Edward M. Burke (14th) and Ariel E. Reboyras (30th).

The proposal targets an ethyl-alcohol based pourable gel fuel used in ceramic fire pots which are utilized for outdoor lighting or to repel mosquitos.

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission announced the "voluntary recall" of two million units of the fuel gel, following 65 accidents that results in 34 hospitalizations and 2 deaths.

9 companies have agreed to the voluntary recall while a 10th company has declined.

The injuries have occurred when consumers pour more gel into a pot that they believe is no longer lit, or is still hot, resulting in the explosion of a dangerous ball of fire that can reach as far as 10 feet.

Violators of the ban would face fines ranging from up to \$300 for first offenses and up to \$500 for the second and subsequent offenses.

Civil War Event At US Grant Home

The 1861 mustering of the 45th Volunteer Illinois Infantry, which fought under General Ulysses S. Grant in some of the major battles of the Civil War, will be re-enacted during a special event Saturday, Sept. 24th from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sunday, Sept. 25th from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. in the park across the street from the Ulysses S. Grant Home State Historic Site in Galena. The event is free and open to the public.

The Old Northwest Volunteers will portray members of the 45th Volunteer Illinois Infantry as they receive their orders, check weapons, train and participate in camp life. There will also be a group portraying civilians who followed soldiers from camp to camp. Visitors are welcome to

watch the re-enactments and visit the authentic campsites.

The 45th was organized at Galena and saw service with General Grant in the Battles of Fort Donelson, Shiloh and Vicksburg. It was nicknamed the "Washburne Lead Mine Regiment" after Galena Congressman Elihu Washburne and the lead mines in the area.

The Ulysses S. Grant Home State Historic Site, administered by the Illinois Historic Preservation Agency, was built in 1860 and given to Galena's most prominent citizen in 1865. The home is completely restored and decorated with original furnishings from the Grant family. It is open Wednesday through Sunday from 9 a.m. to 4:45 p.m.

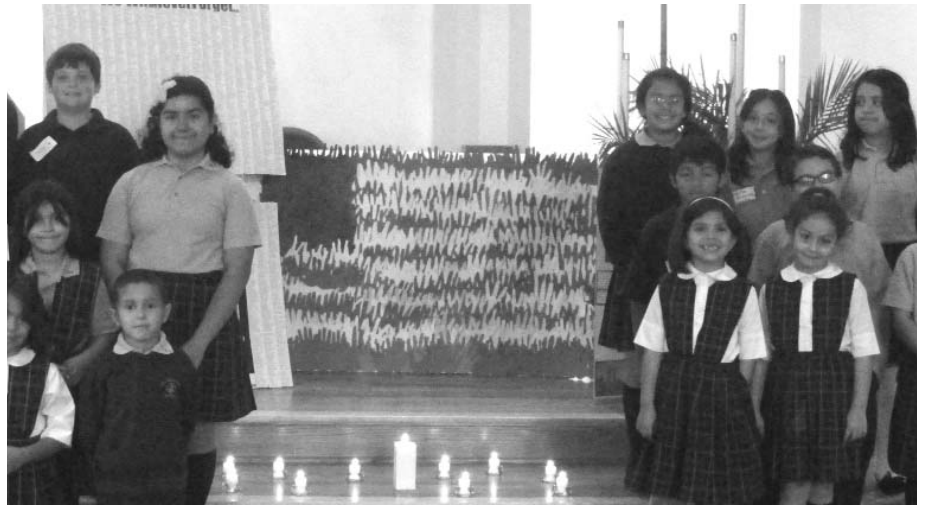

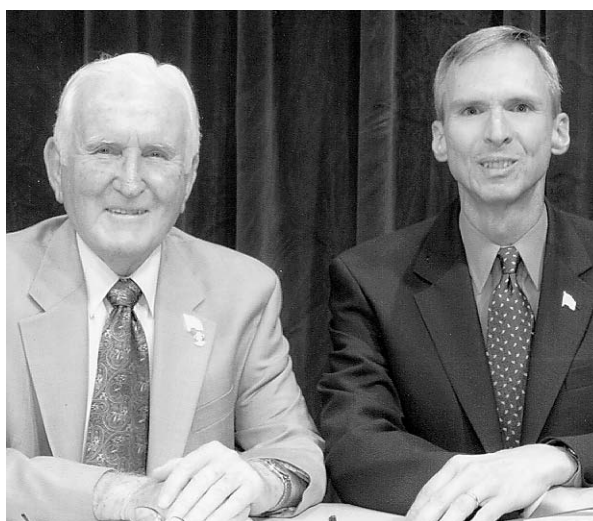

New Law Defines No Trespassing

A new law signed by Governor Pat Quinn allows Illinois landowners or lessees the option of using purple paint markings on trees or posts on their property as a "no trespassing" notice. The "Purple Paint Law" is designed as an alternative which Illinois landowners can use to protect their property from trespassing.

Until January 1st, 2013 those landowners using purple marks must continue to issue a "no trespassing" notice either by oral or written notice to individuals or by posting appropriate signage at the main entrance to the property in question.

Provisions of the new law require that the purple paint marks used to designate "no trespassing" notice must be either: A vertical line of at least 8 inches in length. The bottom of the mark shall be between 3 feet and 5 feet high. Each mark shall be no more than 100 feet from another such mark and be readily visible to any person approaching the property. Or a post capped or otherwise marked on at least its top 2 inches. The bottom of the cap or mark shall be between 3 feet and 5 feet 6 inches high.

Posts so marked shall be no more than 36 feet apart and be readily visible to any person approaching the property. Prior to applying a cap or mark that is visible from both sides of a fence shared by different property owners or lessees, all such owners or lessees must agree to the deci-

Trespassing on property marked for "no trespassing" is a Class B misdemeanor, except when a person trespasses using a motor vehicle if the marked area is an orchard; an enclosed area containing livestock; a barn or other agricultural building containing livestock; or a field that is used or capable of being used for growing crops. Such trespassing constitutes a Class A misdemeanor.

No landowner or lessee is authorized to post purple marks if doing so would violate any applicable law, rule, ordinance, order, covenant, bylaw, declaration, regulation, restriction, contract, or other instrument.

The new law does not apply to real property located in a municipality of over 2,000,000 inhabitants.
