**Enrollment For LIHEAP Program**

The Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity's Office of Energy Assistance announced that anyone eligible to receive winter heating assistance through the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) can apply now.

Some clients will have the option of choosing between the traditional Direct Vendor Payment plan or the new Percentage of Income Payment Plan which is available to eligible clients who are customers of Ameren Illinois, ComEd, Nicor Gas and Peoples Gas/North Shore Gas.

Under PIPP, the eligible client will pay a percentage of their income, receive a monthly benefit towards their utility bill, and receive a reduction in overdue payments for every on-time payment they make by the bill due date. The traditional DVP plan is a one-time payment.

LIHEAP is a state and federally funded energy assistance program for low income families, in which heating bill payments are made on behalf of households.

A single-person household can qualify with a monthly income of up to \$1,361; a two-person household up to \$1,839; a family of three can earn up to \$2,316 and a family of four can earn up to \$2,794. Benefits are paid directly to utilities on behalf of eligible households. The exception is households whose heating costs are included in their rent.

Customers will be served on a first-come first-served basis until funding is exhausted.

**November Is Diabetes Month**

November is American Diabetes Month, and the Illinois Department of Public Health is encouraging residents to make lifestyle changes like becoming physically active, eating healthier and quitting smoking to reduce the risk of being diagnosed with the chronic but manageable disease.

Nearly 26 million Americans are living with diabetes, which can lead to serious complications like heart attack, stroke, amputation, blindness and kidney failure if left untreated or improperly managed. Another 79 million are at risk for developing Type - 2, or

adult onset diabetes.

The signs of diabetes are frequent thirst, constant urination, unusual hunger, rapid weight loss, fatigue and blurred vision. Risk factors include obesity, family history of diabetes, being a member of certain racial ethnic groups (higher risk among African America, Latinos and Native Americans), and physical inactivity.
