**Solar Powered Art Exhibit**

American artist Spencer Finch (b. 1962) recently installed his luminous *Lunar* (2011) - a solar-powered, buckyball-shaped spacecraft sculpture on top of the Art Institute of Chicago's Modern Wing, 111 S. Michigan ave.

Positioned on the open-air Bluhm Family Terrace, *Lunar* glows during evening hours with the color and brightness of the full moon over Chicago as recorded in July 2011. The presentation is on view through April 3, 2012 and is free and open to the public.

Throughout his career, Spencer Finch has used color and light as primary subjects - and materials - in his drawings, photographs, mixed media projects, and large-scale installations.

For his solo project at the Art Institute, Finch has created a solar-powered "lunar lander module" that uses energy from sunlight to power a geodesic dome-shaped object - that resembles the carbon molecules named for visionary architect Buckminster Fuller.

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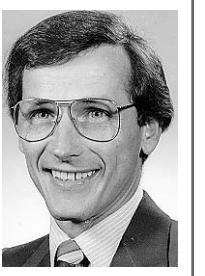

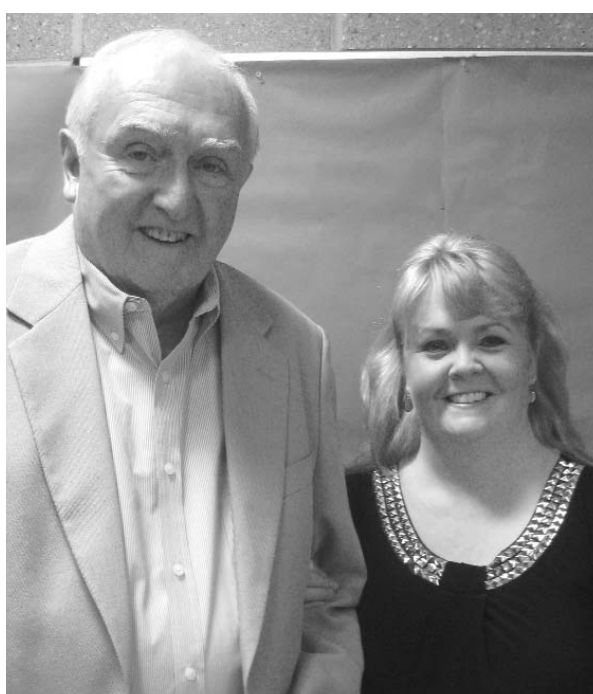
