## 33rd Anniversary Of '79 Papal Visit

The 33rd annual Mass commemorating the anniversary of Pope John Paul II's visit to Five Holy Martyrs Parish will take place on Sunday, Oct. 7th. Weather permitting, this bi-lingual English - Polish Mass will be celebrated at the Papal Altar in the Parish parking lot, 44th and Richmond at 11 a.m.

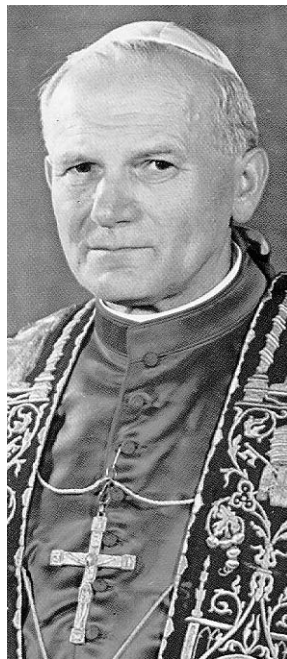
The main celebrant and homilist will be former Pastor, and current Auxiliary Bishop of Chicago, the Most Rev. Andrew P. Wypych.

The Pope John Paul II Centrum Committee has raised over \$55,000 and continues raising funds to renovate this altar to make it a more permanent fixture.

On Sept. 24th, 2011, Five Holy Martyrs Parish received a relic of Blessed John Paul II from His Eminence, Stanislaw Cardinal Dziwisz, the Archbishop of Krakow, Poland, and former personal secretary to Pope John Paul II.

The relic is a drop of Blessed Pope John Paul II's blood on a cloth protected by a lunula, a small, round glass encasement. The lunula has been mounted into a reliquary, a vessel in which a relic is held and exposed.

Since receiving this relic, the parish has begun a new tradition on the first Sunday of the month by sharing inter-

esting facts, stories, and poems about him in a bulletin insert; by offering up petitions to God through his intercession and venerating his relic at the 9 a.m. English and the 11 a.m. Polish Masses; reciting the prayer for his canonization as a community of believers; and by receiving a special blessing with the relic at the end of Mass.

After these two Masses, parishioners and friends are invited to gather in the Bishop Abramowicz Parish Hall for cake, coffee, and fellowship. All parish, cultural and neighborhood organizations are invited to attend this Mass on Oct. 7th and walk in the entrance procession.

### Free Legal Help For Renters

Attorney General Lisa Madigan announced that nearly \$1.4 million in funding from the national foreclosure settlement has been awarded to Chicago's Lawyers Committee for Better Housing.

The grant will provide legal representation and advocacy services for renters living in buildings on the verge of foreclosure. 1 out of every 10 rental units in Chicago has been impacted by foreclosure. Last year, 4,477 apartment buildings were foreclosed on, including 13,814 rental units.

"When an apartment building enters foreclosure, its tenants are often thrown into a legal limbo, where their rights are ignored or overtly violated," Madigan said.
