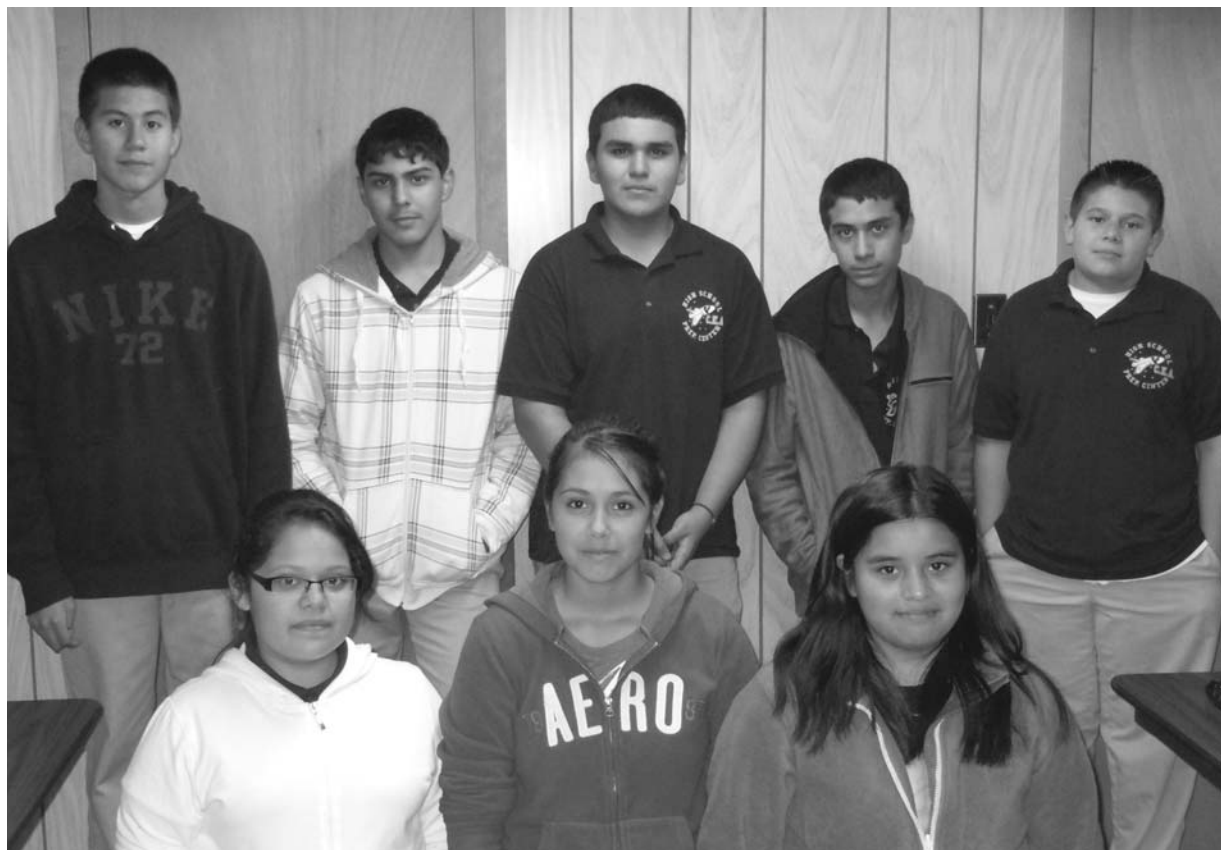

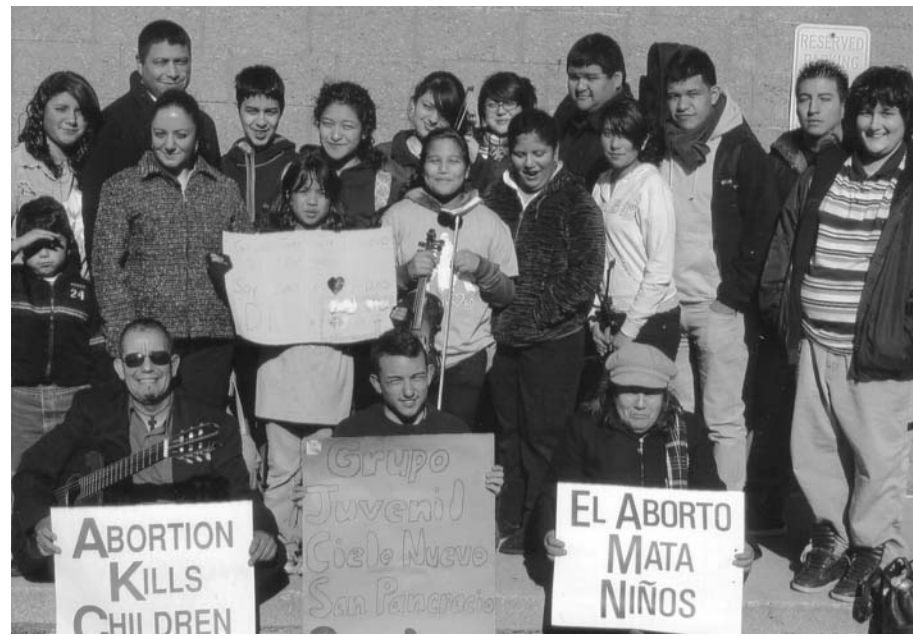
### Halloween Activities At Brookfield Zoo

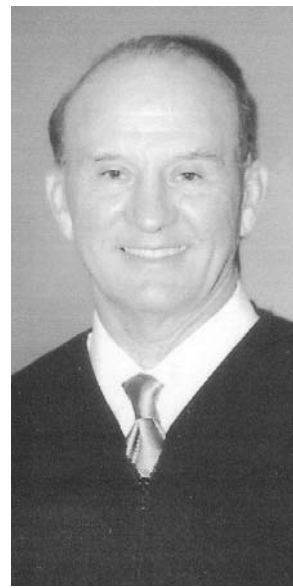

Hours are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Cook County Clerk's downtown office, 69 W. Washington, Fifth Floor Monday through Saturday. Grace-period registrants must vote on touch screen voting equipment immediately after registering. They are not eligible to vote at the polls on Election Day or take part in Early Voting. To qualify to vote, a person must be a U.S. citizen, at least 18 years old by Election Day (Nov. 6) and a resident of their precinct for at least 30 days prior to the election.

MWRD Collects Unwanted Meds

During the national Sept. 29th unwanted medicine take back initiative, Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago police collected 250 pounds of unwanted medications. The U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration started biannual collections in September 2010 and the MWRD has participated in each of them as a way to prevent or reduce accidental contamination of streams, rivers and lakes. "Wastewater treatment facilities are not designed to remove pharmaceutical products if they are poured down a drain or flushed down a toilet," said Commissioner Kathleen Meany, chair of the Public Information and Education Committee. "The chemicals can work their way into lakes or streams and harm fish and other aquatic life."
