Debate Honors For Kelly Students



The Kelly High School Varsity Debate Team of sophomores Eva Alcalá and Yesenia Salgado were recently crowned conference champions of the Local Chicago Circuit Conference held at Lindbloom High School on Feb. 22nd - 23rd. While competing against 32 teams of 2 debaters representing 12 conference teams, the duo debated for two rounds each on Friday night and Saturday morning, finishing with a 4-1 record and qualifying for the elimination round as the number two seed. They won their quarter-final, semi-final and final rounds by unanimous decision, finishing 7-1 on the weekend. The championship has paved the way for an invite for Alcalá and Salgado to participate in a special tournament of champions event on March 16th. The conference championships are scheduled for April 1st-3rd.

Kedzie - 33rd Bridge Project

The Chicago Department of Transportation has begun work on the reconstruction of the Kedzie Avenue Bridge over the Chicago Sanitary & Ship Canal near 33rd st.

The three-span fixed bridge, which was first built in 1909 and reconstructed in 1969, will be completely restored with a new concrete roadway deck; repaired girders,

floor beams and lateral bracing; and new sidewalks with fiberglass panels.

The \$5 million project is part of Building a New Chicago, a \$7.3 billion infrastructure renewal program put forward by Mayor Rahm Emanuel, and is expected to support approximately 50 jobs.

The construction will be performed in two phases, which will keep one vehicle lane open in each direction until May 28th. Afterward until November, the roadway will be completely closed while the deck is replaced and supports are repaired. One sidewalk will remain open throughout the construction project.

Truck traffic will be detoured to the canal bridge on Pulaski Road. All other vehicles, including cars, buses and bicycles will be detoured to cross the canal at California ave.

Assessment Tool For Blood Clots

The Illinois State Medical Society announces the publication of a new, no-cost risk assessment tool for one of the most common types of blood clots, deep vein thrombosis. In December, Hillary Clinton experienced a relatively rare cerebral vein thrombosis, which is a blood clot in a vein between the brain and the skull. In 1998, she suffered from a DVT in her leg, and research shows that people who have had a blood clot in the past are

at a higher risk of having one again. A new edition of the internationally recognized risk assessment tool developed by Joseph A.
