The relic is a drop of Blessed Pope John Paul II's blood on a cloth protected by a lunula, a small, round glass encasement. The lunula has been mounted into a reliquary, a vessel in which a relic is held and exposed.

Since receiving this relic, the parish has begun a new tradition on the first Sunday of the month by sharing interesting facts, stories, and poems about him in a bulletin insert; by offering up petitions to God through his intercession and venerating his relic at the 9 a.m. English and 11 a.m. Polish Masses; reciting the prayer for his canonization as a community of

City Council

The Chicago City Council has adopted a resolution recognizing the 25th anniversary of the ultimate sacrifice made by Chicago Police Officer Irma C. Ruiz.

The sponsors, Aldermen Edward M. Burke (14th) and Danny Solis (25th), also proposed an order that seeks to install a plaque in her memory at the Moses Montefiore School, 1300 S. Ashland, where she was fatally shot on Sept. 22nd, 1988.

Officer Ruiz, accompanied by her partner, Greg Jaglowski of the Area 4 Youth Division, was inside the school when they were alerted to the arrival of an armed assailant, a deranged Vietnam veteran, arrived at the school intent on continuing a deadly rampage he had begun earlier that morning at a nearby auto parts busi-

During the confrontation, Officer Jaglowski was wounded in the left thigh, while Officer Ruiz was fatally shot.

The gunman stepped inside an unoccupied room to reload his weapon. Shortly afterward, reappeared and opened fire on Jaglowski, shooting him in the right

In spite of his serious wounds, the officer returned fire and killed the assailant.

Officer Ruiz was posthumously decorated with the Blue Star Award, Award of Valor and Police Medal, the Chicago Police Department's highest honor. A Chicago public elementary school is also named in her honor on the Southwest Side.

Survivors are her husband, Peter and children Peter, Irma Linda, John and Philip.





Common Core Standards Explained

A phrase often heard at school is Common Core Standards. Just what is this? In short, it mean a set of concepts that all the students in that grade are expected to master. This is nothing new. There has always been a set of curriculum for schools. The effort now is to have all students in all schools learn the same thing at the same grade level.

There are 46 states, including Illinois, that have adopted the Com-mon Core Standards in Math and English. The goal is to eventually help all students learn these goals regardless of the school they attend. Our society has become very fluid and very few students attend the same elementary school or the same high school until they graduate. The idea is while there will be a social adjustment for recently transferred students, they should be able to pick up academically where they left at the other school. 
