New App For Pet First Aid

A new Red Cross Pet First Aid App puts life-saving information in the hands of dog and cat owners so they can provide emergency care until veterinary assistance is available.

The 99 cent Pet First Aid app gives iPhone and Android smart phone users instant access to instructions, videos and images for more than 25 common first aid and emergency situations including how to treat wounds, control bleeding, and care for breathing and cardiac emergencies.

Additional topics include burns, car accidents, falls and what to do for cold- and heat-related emergencies. Other features in the app allow pet owners to: create a pet profile including tag identification number, photos, list of medications and instructions; use the list of early warning signs to learn when to call their veterinarian; contact their veterinarian; find emergency pet care facilities or alternate veterinarians; locate pet-friendly hotels; test their knowledge with interactive quizzes and earn badges that they can share on their social networks along with their favorite picture of their pet.

Holidays

During the next six weeks, our students will be inundated with celebrations about different people. There's Dr. King, Abraham Lincoln, George Washington, Casimir Pulaski and President's Day. It is always good to remember contributions by famous people. I'm just not sure at what age these become educationally sound. Many teachers give the kids a coloring sheet and think that's enough. Sometimes the kids are just too young to spend time on these individuals.

I'd like to give you some examples of experiences with students, both as a teacher and as an administrator. I asked some pre-K kids at De La Cruz who were they celebrating and they said Washington and Lincoln. I asked them what they could tell me and one very bright little girl was sure she had the answer. I know that Washington was more important than Lincoln. I asked her how she knew that. She said it's simple - Washington is on a quarter while Lincoln is only on a penny.

I asked a kindergarten class at the Nathan Davis School what they knew about President Lincoln. A little boy responded he was a black guy with a beard. I asked him where he got that information and he pointed to the wall where the teacher had put up black silhouettes of Washington and Lincoln.

I asked the pre-K class at St. Paul - Our Lady of Vilna which president did they like the best and one little girl said I liked the lady president. I said okay which one is that. She went up to the calendar where Lincoln and Presidents Day and Washington's birthday were displayed and pointed to Feb. 11th, which is the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. The teacher had a little Blessed Mother in the square.

I asked my 6th grade class at Metcalfe Magnet "which president do you think we should celebrate on President's Day?" The young man in the back of the class said "Ronald Reagan because he is the only president I heard of

that got shot and didn't die, that's tough."

The story I liked best carried over to the month of February. My second grade boy asked what number president was Dr. King? The kids interrupted, they knew and told him he was a preacher, not a president. In a couple of weeks, we were talking about Lincoln and he asked me where was Lincoln a preacher. The kids tell him, no he was a president. The boy just smacked himself in the forehead "boy I wish you people would make up your mind."

Be prepared with age appropriate answers to any questions your young ones have. Remember, we have some very good and new Chicago Public Libraries in our communities.
