

# Testing Week for CPS

This has been standardized testing week for CPS. It has been in the news lately -- not because of scores, but irate people concerned with over-testing. Well about time! When I brought up this issue a couple years ago, you would have thought I was Benedict Arnold.
Ever since CPS bought

into Data! Data! and Data! we have wasted a lot of teaching time. However, I realize some standardized testing is necessary and useful. But the State and City are constantly changing the test and the number of times to be tested. There have been too many names of tests to list them all in this short article. They have made the test "high stakes" rating students, schools, teachers, and principals by the results. What does this accomplish -- nothing but stress and, too often, it encourages teaching to the test. Despite their desire. the Archdiocese has not been allowed to take the same standardized test that the State demands of Public Schools.

There was a time when the students did not take the standardized tests seriously. Then they became a requirement to pass and

the scores jumped dra-matically. CPS having so many taking the test and improving so much the testing company had to re-norm the test. What does this mean? An example would be if you had 20 correct, you might have scored a 6.5 and graduated. The next year a student taking the exact same test scores 20, but he gets a 5.9 and had to graduate after Summer School. I had a 6th grader at De La Cruz tell me "My mom said not to do well on the test because she needs me to go to Summer School because there is no one to watch me in the morning."

The testing issue won't

be going away and is likely to get worse because the plan now is to change the test again and everyone will take the test on the computer. Think of this nightmare -- kids aren't supposed to talk about the test, but what do you do when your school has a lot more kids than they do computers. Even a small school might have 500 kids, they certainly don't have 500 computers. I am sure some State politicians and bureaucrats are proud of this new testing way, but they keep cutting the budget, while they take their bows.
