The Kelly High School Girls Basketball Team completed its most successful season in school history with a season full of highlights and milestones including the first division title in over 15 years.

The Lady Trojans finished the regular season with a 20-2 overall record and a perfect 14-0 division record. This season marked the first 20 win season in school history, as well as the highest winning percentage and first ever undefeated conference record which captured the team Metro Central Division Championship. The team also won the Consolation Bracket at the Little Village Tournament and defeated the Metro South Division Champions Bowen High School and Little Village High School to go 2-0 at the Tilden Invitational.

Marbella Rodriguez lead the team in scoring 10 times, scoring in double digits 13 times and carrying a scoring average of 15pts/game, while Jennifer Rodriguez lead the team in scoring 9 times, scoring in double digits 13 times and carried a scoring average of 16pts/game. Power forward Stephanie Mendoza played the most minutes and center Yazmin Villagomez, the smallest center in the division coming in at 5'8", won 17 out of 22 jump balls.

Testing Week for CPS

This has been standardized testing week for CPS. It has been in the news lately -- not because of scores, but irate people concerned with over-testing. Well about time! When I brought up this issue a couple years ago, you would have thought I was Benedict Arnold.

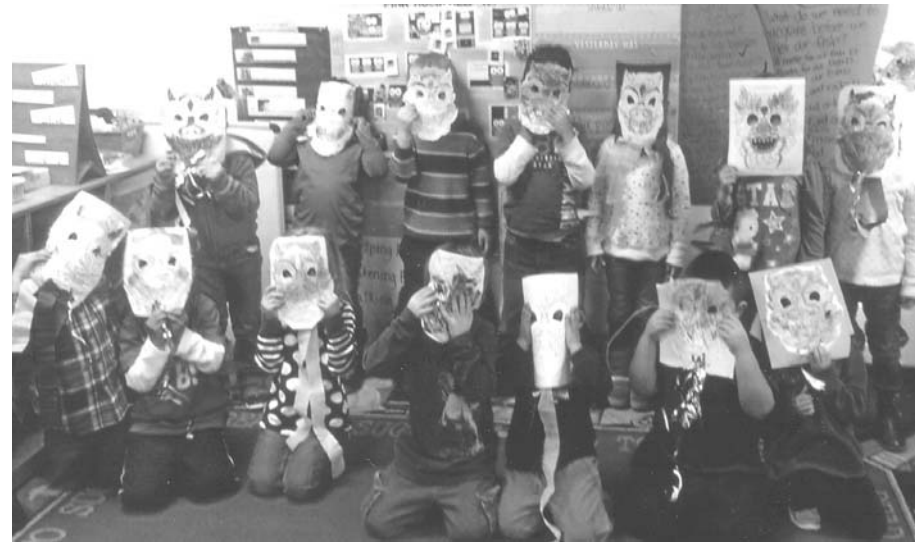
Ever since CPS bought into Data! Data! and Data! we have wasted a lot of teaching time. However, I realize some standardized testing is necessary and useful. But the State and City are constantly changing the test and the number of times to be tested. There have been too many names of tests to list them all in this short article. They have made the test "high stakes" rating students, schools, teachers, and principals by the results. What does this accomplish -- nothing but stress and, too often, it encourages teaching to the test. Despite their desire, the Archdiocese has not been allowed to take the same standardized test that the State demands of Public Schools.

There was a time when the students did not take the standardized tests seriously. Then they became a requirement to pass and

the scores jumped dramatically. CPS having so many taking the test and improving so much the testing company had to re-norm the test. What does this mean? An example would be if you had 20 correct, you might have scored a 6.5 and graduated. The next year a student taking the exact same test scores 20, but he gets a 5.9 and had to graduate after Summer School. I had a 6th grader at De La Cruz tell me "My mom said not to do well on the test because she needs me to go to Summer School because there is no one to watch me in the morning."

The testing issue won't be going away and is likely to get worse because the plan now is to change the test again and everyone will take the test on the computer. Think of this nightmare -- kids aren't supposed to talk about the test, but what do you do when your school has a lot more kids than they do computers. Even a small school might have 500 kids, they certainly don't have 500 computers. I am sure some State politicians and bureaucrats are proud of this new testing way, but they keep cutting the budget, while they take their bows.

Speed Cameras At Gage, McGuane

Speeding tickets will be issued this week from Automated Speed Enforcement (ASE) cameras in the Children's Safety Zones near Gage, 2513 W. 55th st., and McGuane Parks, 2928 S. Halsted.

Fines for violations are \$35 for vehicles traveling 6-10 miles per hour over the posted speed limit while in a safety zone, and \$100 for vehicles traveling 11 or more miles over the posted speed limit.

The City plans to equip Children's Safety Zones around parks and schools with ASE cameras in an effort to increase safety and reduce speeding. Any revenue generated by the program is to be invested in safety initiatives including after-school, anti-violence and jobs programs; crossing guards and police officers around schools; and infrastructure improvements, such as additional signs, crosswalk markings and other traffic safety improvements. Enforcement hours will be limited from 7 am to 7 pm in safety zones around schools on school days (Monday through Friday); 7 am to 4 pm: 20 mph speed limit when children are present; 30 mph speed limit when no children are present 4 to 7 p.m.: 30 mph speed limit.
