

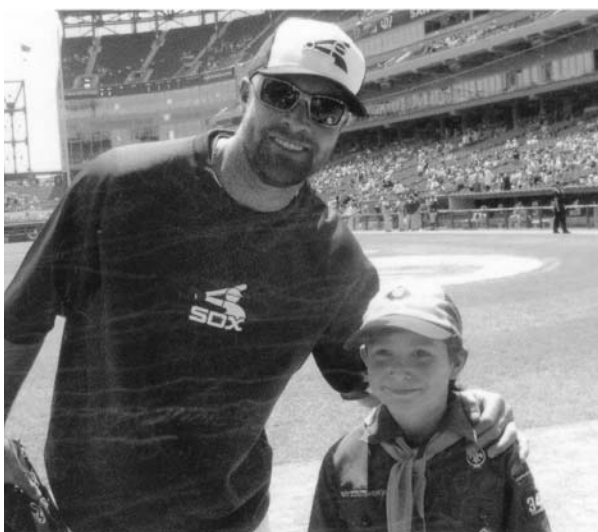


## 2nd Place In City Softball For Davis School

## Increase For WIC Benefits

The Illinois Department of Human Services announces that children in the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC) will receive an additional \$2 per month - from \$6 to \$8 - to redeem for eligible fruits and vegetables.

WIC is a USDA-funded public health program created to reduce the nutritional risk of low-income pregnant, postpartum, and breastfeeding women, infants, and children up to the age of five.

The supplemental foods and nutrition have assisted in reducing fetal deaths, infant mortality, low birth weight rates, iron deficiency anemia in children and increased immunization rates.

## New Director Of Juvenile Probation

Circuit Court of Cook County Chief Judge Timothy C. Evans announced the appointment of Rose Marie Golden as director of the court's Juvenile Probation and Court Services Department. She succeeds Michael J. Rohan who served from Jan. 1994 until his retirement on May 30th.

The Department provides guidance, structure and services to delinquent minors and other court-involved children, employs approximately 338 juvenile probation officers and 78 support staff.

Ms. Golden joined the department in 1985 as a delinquent field officer. From 1993 through 2004, she held several managerial positions in the field of training, including supervisor, acting coordinator, and a deputy chief probation officer.

In 2004, she was appointed director of grants. During the course of her career, her duties also extended to leading the department in the implementation of evidence-based practices which involve developing and employing case management strategies.

She also served as department liaison to the Administrative Office of Illinois Courts, the administrative arm of the Illinois Supreme Court, and as the project director for Reclaiming Futures, a substance abuse initiative funded by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation.

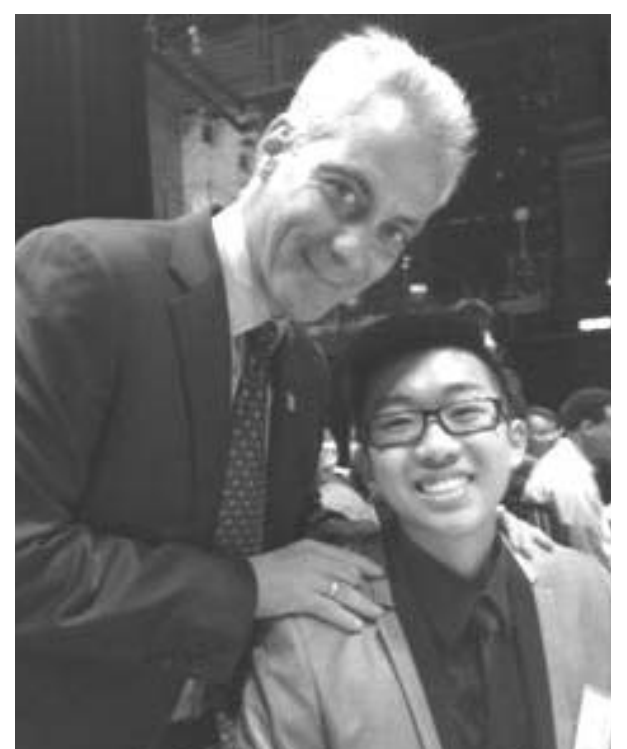
In 2008, she was appointed director of human resources with the additional responsibility

to oversee suburban operations. As human resources director, she held one of the three top management positions within the department and was responsible for hiring and disciplinary matters, as well as labor negotiations.

Her M.A. in Criminal Justice/Corrections was received from Chicago State University in 1989, and B.A. in Criminal Justice/Foreign Languages from St. Ambrose College, Davenport, Iowa, in 1983.

Ms. Golden hopes to expand clinical services offered to support youth who have been exposed to trauma and violence. She also intends to expand the department's partnerships with the community to provide activities and services as an alternative to detention.

## Weekend Closures For I-90/94 X-Way

The Illinois Department of Transportation announced that weather permitting, demolition of the westbound Ohio/Ontario Street Bridge to eastbound I-90/94 over I-90/94 (Kennedy Expressway), will begin Friday, June 13.

This large-scale demolition will occur over the course of three separate weekends. Due to the type of bridge, a three-unit, eight-span, concrete structure with the supporting columns constructed integral into the bridge, it cannot be disassembled in pieces, but must be removed one unit at a time.

Motorists can expect significant delays and back-ups and should seek alternate routes. Drivers are urged to pay close attention to flaggers, watch for signing in the work zones, obey the posted speed limits, and be on the alert for workers and equipment. Mass transit is strongly encouraged.
