On Fridays at 5:30 p.m., before the Grant Park Orchestra takes the stage, audiences will be treated to concerts by students from local music schools and summer music programs at the front of the Great Lawn at the Jay Pritzker Pavilion.

"Front Line" Lauded

This summer television has been better than other summers. There was the World Cup, The White Sox are more interesting and some cable channels have a summer schedule with premieres. The best show, for those of us interested in education, has been Front Line. This award winning balanced documentary series recently produced some very enlightening programs on schools and the students in our nation.

The episode I found particularly enlightening was about the Bronx Middle School Initiative. This program showed how the school system used a study from Johns Hopkins University to attempt to have inner-city youth graduate high school. The study from Johns Hopkins indicated that if a student in 6th grade failed either Math or English, or did not attend school on time at least 80% of the time, or got an unsatisfactory behavior grade, there was a 75% chance these children would not graduate high school. They were careful not to include Special Education students, who have a different set of problems and often are receiving special help. The program followed a young girl who was doing quite well in high school while her brother stopped going to school and had constant run-ins with the law.

This program called for special interventions. The program calls for the student to go to a different school because things were not working for this student in this neighborhood. They also had weekly meetings to red flag any student who has this problem with the criteria. The student was assigned two or more adults to help follow the child's progress. These extra adults helped with parent involvement and sought out social services when appropriate. The program used retired educators to help fill the gap with this adult intervention team.

The intervention has helped follow students and tried to prevent the child from dropping out of high school. Statistics show students who have dropped out of school are most likely to be chronically unemployed, have children before marriage, and have run-ins with the legal system. Hotline For Elder Abuse

Governor Pat Quinn has issued a proclamation that July is Elder Abuse Awareness and Prevention Month and the Illinois Department on Aging (IDoA) is raising awareness through its annual campaign. Elder abuse refers to a negligent act (physical, sexual, emotional, confinement, passive neglect, willful deprivation, or financial exploitation) by a caregiver or another person known by the victim that causes harm or a serious risk of harm to a vulnerable adult 60 years of age or older.

DoA operates a 24 hour hotline at (866) 800-1409 to report the abuse, neglect, or financial exploitation of an eligible adult. There are resources to help victims and all calls and information related to suspected abuse are confidential. In addition to older adults, IDoA extends protective services people with disabilities ages 18 to 59 who live in a domestic setting.
