

DCASE Schedules Theater and Dance

The Department of Cultural Affairs and Special Events (DCASE) is pleased to announce its fall season of theater and dance performances and residencies. The DCASE Theater and Dance series presents critically-acclaimed local, national and international music, theater, dance and multidisciplinary artists, newly commissioned works and Chicago premieres.

Returning to the Chicago Cultural Center and the Storefront Theater is the second annual SpinOff dance series, November 7-22. This month-long celebration of contemporary dance will present work by Midwest-based choreographers and dance companies. All performances are free and feature Chicago and world premieres and excerpts from works-in-progress. A complete schedule will be released in September.

Fall 2014 DCASE Theater and Dance Schedule: Red Tape Theatre opens the season at the Storefront Theater with the Chicago premier of *Mnemonic* by Complicite. Crossing continents and centuries, *Mnemonic* weaves together the discovery of Otzi the iceman, a search for an absent father and the longing for love lost in an exploration that questions our reliance on memory, the most subjective of storytellers. Drawing parallels between these stories, this fragmented narrative focuses on the theme of the role of the imagination in recapturing the past. The original production received awards in the UK, France, New York and Sarajevo, including the 2001 Drama Desk Award for "Unique Theatrical Experience." The comedy takes us to a small cabaret stage in an undisclosed location, where animals perform with their band against all odds night after night, exploring the universal struggles of

SpinOff 2014, November 7-22. Now in its second year, the month-long series celebrating contemporary dance is back. SpinOff 2014, November 7-22, will feature a series of work by emerging and mid-career Midwest-based choreographers and dance companies. SpinOff will feature dance presentations from Darrell Jones, Elements Contemporary Ballet, Jillian Soto, Morgan Thorson, among others at the Chicago Cultural Center Dance Studio and the Storefront Theater. A complete schedule will be released in September. A complete schedule of performances during SpinOff 2014 will be released in early fall.

Opening weekend of SpinOff will feature the world premiere of *The Conviction* by Pearl Dakota by Jillian Soto after a development residency through DCASE's In the Works program in 2013. The performances created and directed by Soto, was inspired by her observations of the traffic courts at the Chicago Daley Center over the course of six months. Drawing from observed patterns of repetition and body language, as well as the internal geographies of the dancers, the performance unfolds as episodic movement potentially providing freedom, revealing conflict and complicating origins and destinations of bodies. Performance dates and times are November 7-8 at 6:30 p.m. in the Chicago Cultural Center Dance Studio on the first floor.

Taking a leap during SpinOff to the Jay Pritzker Pavilion Stage is the Elements Contemporary Ballet with Baroque Band and their world premiere of *The Sun King*, A Contemporary Ballet in One Act. With inspiration from the book *Lully ou le Musicien du Soleil* by Philippe Beaussant and the 2000 French film *Le Roi Danse* by Gérard Corbiau, *The Sun King* is a foray into Lully's world, delving deep into his obsession with the dancing King and the immense part their relationship played in shaping music and dance as we know it today. Featuring live music by Chicago's only period-instrument orchestra, Baroque Band, and an original baroque-fusion costume design by world-class designer Meriem Bahri. Performance dates and times are November 13-15 at 7 p.m.

The Chicago premiere of *YOU*, created and directed by Morgan Thorson, is a dance that composes itself from an ensemble movement practice that mediates human connection and togetherness for everyone in the room. The dance presentation is a conversation that moves from dancer to audience, to music, to architecture, to ensemble and then back to the audience. "You" won't want to miss this unique SpinOff presentation at the Storefront Theater on November 22 and 23 at 7:30 p.m.

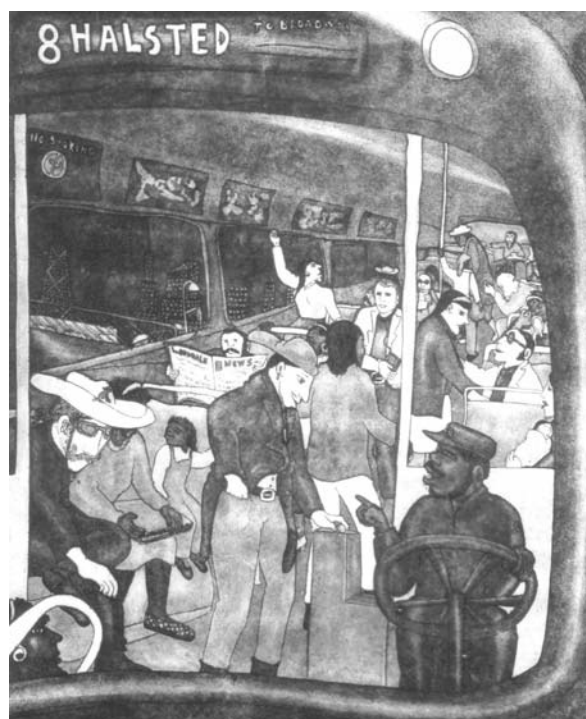
