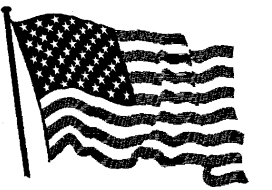

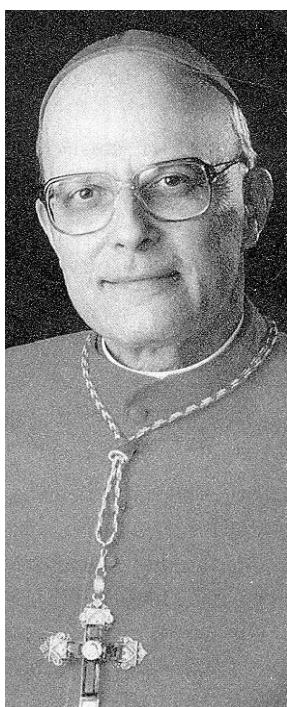

CPS Announces Graduation Rate

Mayor Rahm Emanuel and Chicago Public Schools CEO Barbara Byrd-Bennett announced that CPS students in School Year 2013-2014 (SY 13-14) set a record graduation rate of 69.4 percent.

The SY 13-14 graduation rate continues a consistent upward trend and represents the largest two-year increase in District history. Last year 65.4 percent of CPS students graduated. Two years ago, 61.2 percent graduated, and three years ago, 58 percent of CPS students graduated.

Earlier this year, the University of Chicago Consortium on Chicago School Research announced that 82 percent of last year's high school freshmen are on track to graduate, an increase of 25 percent from 2007. This increase is largely attributable to strategy to reduce course failure in the ninth grade.

CPS students also achieved an all-time high ACT scores and an increase in attendance rates. In 2013, the average composite ACT score was 18, outpacing the state in growth in reading and math scores. The District's attendance rates from kindergarten through 12th grade also rose, reaching 93.2 percent, an increase of 0.7 percent from SY 12-13.

Last year, 57.2 percent of CPS graduates enrolled into college, which was an increase of 1.2 percent from 2012.

Intl. Literacy Day

This September 8th is International Literacy Day which has been sponsored since 1965 by the United Nations. According to their figures, 775 million adults lack minimum literacy skills, that is about 1 in 5 adults.

Their worldwide statistics show that 2/3 of these are women, who, in some countries, are not allowed to attend school. They also indicate that 60.7 million primary school-age children are not attending school. One of the oddities of the statistics of the World Literacy Foundation is that the world's most populated countries that have many well educated people compose 52% of the illiterates in the world and that is India and China.

We, in the United States, have a history of on one hand stating we are the best country in the world, and on the other hand demonizing anything successful. How many times have you seen derogatory articles about Disney, McDonald's and Walmart? How dare they be successful. This is followed by our literacy rates.

Our own US Department of Education and National Institute of Literacy claims 32 million American adults can't read. Well that's 14% of the population. They also claim 19% of high school grads can't read. Yet the United Nations states the literacy rate of the United States is 99%. Maybe we just expect more or maybe we just don't like admitting we are doing things better than the world in general. Part can be, we think, that an understanding at the 5th grade level makes one literate. While the vast majority of the world doesn't educate their kids that far.

level makes one literate. While the vast majority of the world doesn't educate their kids that far.

If interested to see who is listed as 100% literate it was Greenland, Luxembourg and that bastion of the educational world North Korea. A former teacher of mine, now teaching "American" yes not English, in Romania tells me that his classes are filled from students around Europe because everyone wants to come here. They list two things most often as their reasons: 1. biculturalism is ruining Europe and 2. our schools for the average kid are just so much better than theirs.

I can attest to some anecdotal records because I have spent many hours this summer talking with foreign students attending American universities. They can't go the thousands of miles home, but they can come to the museums of Chicago for short weekend visits. The majority of these students tell me they will probably never go home. They plan to get a job, and bring their parents here.

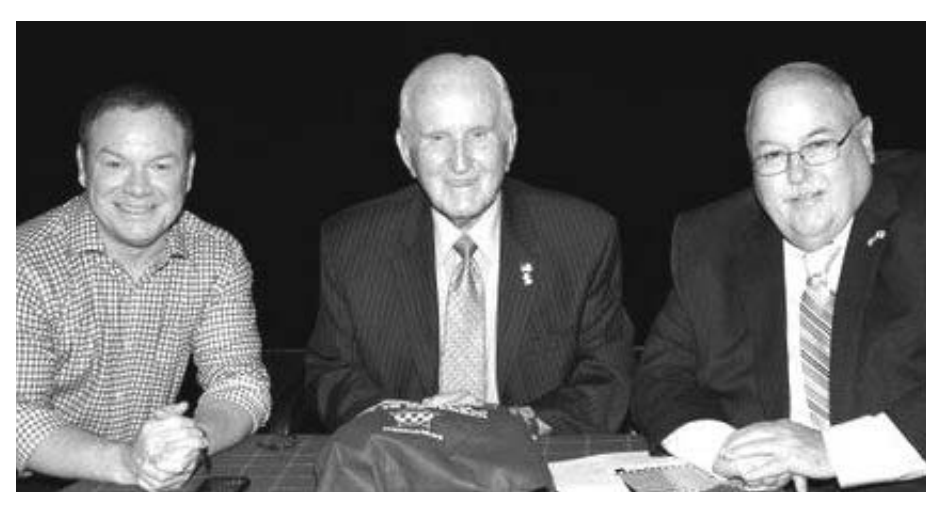
