New Archbishop

In September, Blasé Cupich was named as the successor of the retiring Archbishop of Chicago, Cardinal George. In an interview after the announcement in Chicago, the questions to Bishop Cupich indicated the lack of knowledge that the press has of the position. They asked "Was Pope Francis sending a message to the Catholic Church in the US?" Blasé's answer "No, I was sent to be the Bishop, not a message". If these supposed educated people have little idea what the position of Archbishop entails, how do our students understand the true role of the Archbishop of Chicago? This is especially important in our community where the overwhelming majority of people, at least nominally, are Catholic.

The newspapers have been understanding to Cardinal George's recent announcements of his poor health, the closing of more schools, and release of the documents about the 30 priests accused of crimes against minors. But they also ask about the new Archbishop's ideas on same sex marriage, gay adoption, and elective abortions.

It is little wonder the responses I received from 6th graders when I was principal at De La Cruz (a CPS school in Pilsen). In 1997, when Cardinal George was appointed, many of the students knew that Cardinals elected the Popes. Many thought he lived in

Vatican City with the Pope. The funniest answer was, my dad likes the Cardinals, they always beat the Cubs. The most disturbing answer was, I have no idea.

The students should know the responsibility of the Archbishop, something like that of a principal, who manages everything in the building and gets too much credit when test scores are high and too much blame when things aren't going well. According to *The Catechism of the Catholic Church*, "As Christ's Vicar, each Bishop has the pastoral care of the particular churches entrusted to him" and it also states "Their authority must be exercised in communion with the whole Church under the guidance of the Pope".

It would be a good thing to make our students aware that when the new Archbishop is installed on November 18th, the management of the Archdiocese will change and it may look like the direction is changing.

The new Archbishop will make thousands of decisions, some that will affect the lives of our students, but Catholic theology is constant and not locally controlled. When we see 80 year old nuns calling for abortion, that is their right as Americans, but only represents themselves, not the Church. We, as good Americans, should recall this is not teaching religion and is completely protected by the Constitution.
