

Chicago Labor Law Changes July 1st

Brandon Johnson issued a proclamation declaring June 24th-28th, "Chicago Workers' Rights Week" to bring attention to upcoming labor law changes. An increased minimum wage, the first increase in the sub-minimum wage, and a new City of Chicago Paid Time Off policy will go into effect on Monday, July 1st.

The minimum wage will be \$16.20. The minimum wage for subsidized youth employment programs, and subsidized transitional employment programs will be \$15. The minimum wage will no longer be tiered for large and small business-

Since reaching \$15 per hour in 2021, the minimum wage increases annually according to changes to the Consumer Price Index or 2.5%,

whichever is lower. The One Fair Wage Ordinance was passed by the Chicago City Council in Oct. of 2023, phasing out the subminimum wage for tipped workers




