



Supreme Court Hearings

When the hearing for Supreme Court Justice began, I started reading articles on what the affects of the hearings might be on our students. It was hard to find articles and certainly none by men. It seems that's what the only issue was. It was hard to find unbiased articles after all by my count almost all the 100 Senators announced how they would vote before the hearings began. It appears after the hearings, only three changed in favor of Kavanaugh and one undecided against him.

I read an article saying that many children were coming crying to this 8th grade teacher that they had been victims, but she never said what she did with these 14 year old girls, except watch them cry. Crying isn't enough. If it happened, they need help. Other educators stressed that we must support the accusers. The idea seems okay until you see the term "must".

In the last couple of weeks, I listened to some interesting remarks by young students (13 - 20). I did talk to a group of 5th graders, but they had no idea about what I was talking about. The problem they saw on TV, was adults acting in ways their parents disapproved of, especially screaming and yelling at people in restaurants and then being told by politicians to do it again.

An article by a Rowan University assistant professor wanted to blame schools for having discussions -- after all boys are loud and can dominate these discussions. She

wants to get rid of dress codes because it's a way of "policing what young women wear". Now some other articles discussed how to present "consent to students. "No" means no, even if you started by saying yes. Of course, this discussion must be age appropriate.

Some articles mention not remembering things, yet others say you can forget only to a point. I had a lady tell me she had been abused about 20 years ago, can remember most things, except the exact date. I had another young lady tell me that she reported an incident to her mother and the mother told her don't say anything because her dad and brothers will kill him and we don't need them in jail. She told me the story and that the perpetrator had passed away. I understand her dilemma, but she could have started counseling a long time ago.

I talked with a group of a dozen girls from an Iowa college. They were amazed how polarized the people were and how the people resorted to being nasty. They really felt it was a shame that Dr. Ford's own team did not seem to protect her confidentiality.

I, as an administrator, had contact with DCFS and CPD on several occasions to investigate allegations. It is a hard job. Both sides hated me, but I followed the law. Yes, I even dealt with a teacher, who no longer worked at the school, and I was not there when the event occurred.

If you feel you should dwell on these events, one of the most compelling speeches I heard was that by Senator Collins on the floor of the Senate. Even her critics have, as far as I know, not argued about its substance.

This is the best educational event and would not be pro either way. Another interesting educational method is to have the kids say if they would say yes or no on the confirmation. Then have them defend the other position.

If they would have voted no, defend why yes was the correct way to go. This, like all political arguments, is often thrust upon us and, if we could avoid it, it might be wise. But if the students keep bringing it up, try not to show your own bias.


Video Series At Shedd Aquarium

Legislation For Untreated Sewage

Congressman Dan Lipinski (IL-3) has introduced HR 6967, the Great Lakes Water Protection Act, which will improve water quality in the Great Lakes Basin by working with wastewater treatment plans to end the dumping of untreated sewage during rain events.

Through a process called blending, which happens when there is more water coming into a treatment plan than it can process, untreated or partially-treated sewage is mixed with fully-treated water before it is discharged.

This bill will ban blending and provide financial assistance to help municipalities comply. Senator Tamm Duckworth (D-IL) will introduce a Senate version of the bill in coming weeks.
