High School Ratings

Most people enjoy ratings -- where do I stand among others in my class? We like being associated with being in the top ranked anything. This article is an attempt This article is an attempt to show you where some schools are ranked. These were provided by US News and World Report. Many educators look for these yearly. Often after it is out in their magazine, many news sources. zine, many news sources use the data as signifi-cant. I have used these statistics in papers and speeches and with talks with Illinois educators

with Illinois educators while on certain statewide committees. It seems to be as close to reality as I can get.

These schools that I list are among the 734 Illinois high schools. There are some not included, some of which are very small. Do you really compare schools with 12 students with one with 3,000? It may cause with 3,000? It may cause some of you to be shocked by the five top rated high schools in Illinois. All are Chicago Public Schools:

1. Payton College Prep, is

also ranked fifth in the 2. Northside College Prep 3. Jones College Prep 4. Whitney Young

Magnet 5. Lane Tech

Followed by Proviso Math and Science, number 6, the top rated sub-urban school. Other top rated Chicago schools are #12 Brooks College Prep, #20 Hancock College Prep, #23 Lindblom Math and Science and #24 Phoenix Military Academy. These scores are impressive for CPS, but

so, as to be fair, most of these schools recruit citywide. Your child could go to any of these schools on a competitive basis. This accomplishes a few things. It gives a few excellent schools for CPS students. It brings family income much closer to suburban earnings. It also takes students out of the neighborhood schools, which because of the competitive nature, takes some top scholars from the neighborhood. If you wish, you can

look up any school in the US News and World Report. This is also a place to see how they did the ratings. I only did a limited number of schools. I did not want to embarrass students working in a school with a embarrass poor ranking. I know many people that have worked in schools suc-cessfully that are not named in this article. We know many people who have no college grads in their families but they themselves have or will graduate due to the effort of students, family and staff. I have many relatives that are first in their families to graduate. There are millions of dollars in scholarships that go unused.





Exhibition Debuts At Morton Arboretum

Five large-scale sculptures fashioned from reclaimed tree branches and other natural materials by Polish-American artist. Olga Ziemska will debut May 26th in the newest outdoor exhibition at The Morton Arboretum, 4100 Illinois Route 53, Lisle.

Of the Earth, the first major sculpture installation by a woman artist, is Ziemska's largest exhibition to date anywhere in the world. The exhibition will be free with advance purchase of daytime admission and will remain through spring 2025.

All five sculptures — rata, Oculus, Ona, Strata, Hear: With an ear to the ground and Stillness in Motion: The Matka series pay homage to the Arboretum landscapes while exploring Ziemska's central and reoccurring theme, "We are nature."

The sculptures are made of organic and manmade materials, including steel and glass-fiber reinforced concrete necessary to withstand the Midwest's weather variations, and range in size from 5to 14-feet tall and 45 feet in length. Volunteers spent several weeks laying the groundwork for creation of the unique pieces by collecting, pruning and preparing natural materials such as fallen tree branches from sugar maple, hackberry, linden, willow, elm and wild black cherry trees.

Stillness in Motion: The Matka series, Of the Earth's signature piece, is the newest in Ziemska's

Matka ("mother" in Polish) series, following versions in Romania and Poland. Located outside the Visitor Center, the 6foot-tall female figure is composed mostly of willow tree branches.

Ona ("she" in Polish) is the sole sculpture situated on the West Side. The 14-foot-tall piece depicts a woman with windswept tree branch hair and mirrored eves

Oculus comprises two 10-foot-tall human head profiles fit with hundreds of varying sizes of tree cookies, or the cross-section of a tree, and mirrored eyes that reflect the surrounding Maple Col-

Inspired by a recurring theme in Ziemska's work that considers the "body as landscape," Strata is a 45-foot-long reclining fefigure emerging male from the ground at the base of a hill in the Crabapple Collection.

Thousands of white river rocks pattern the surface of Hear: With an ear to the ground, a 5-foottall horizontal human head that appears to be at rest in its natural surroundings with Meadow Lake as its backdrop.

Cook County Offers Medical Debt Relief

Cook County Board President Toni Preckwinkle announced that Cook County's Medical Debt Relief Initiative has successfully acquired and will erase \$79.2 million in medical debt to benefit 72,989 residents. The County has already acquired and erased over \$25 million in medical debt for 45,000 residents, and has now acquired and will abolish the remaining \$54 million in debt for nearly 28,000 residents. The program is funded using American Rescue Plan Act dollars and is being implemented in partnership with national nonprofit RIP Medical

Individuals who qualify for medical debt abolishment through MDRI must live in Cook County, have incomes up to 400 percent of the current Federal Poverty Guidelines, or have medical debt that is 5% or more of their annual income. Medical debt abolishment cannot be requested by an individual. Those eligible with debts in the portfolios RIP is able to acquire from local healthcare providers will have debt erased without taking any action. Recipients are notified by mail that their debts have been relieved, and any negative marks on their credit reports are removed. Because medical debt is purchased in bundled portfolios for a fraction of its face value,


