# Reparations

Reparations is a term many of us have been dealing with for many years. Its simplest form can be stated as giving someone something they are owed by you. Now a committee sanctioned by committee sanctioned by the state of California has been appointed to study the issue of reparations due to slavery in the United States. The committee has been working on this task to assess the harms that slavery harms caused African Americans in the US and the state of California. Many have been look-

ing at this report to see what this task force has come up with. They have made several reports at fact finding hearings in an effort to be thorough and fair. I found much of this information from the website of the California State Attorney General Rob Ponta. Many ask the common question: how much will relatives of former slaves receive? There have been estimates of from 5 to 1.5 million. The task force is also looking into who is eligible for the reparations. They are arranging a process and do not expect to give a sum of money to the legislature. They seem to want to rely on sites like Ancestry.com birth and death records. That may take a while for the legislature to work this out.

Many people understand that no matter how good the report is, it will raise many questions. It seems money will be the way reparations are made. The report is at least 500 pages long and there will be many to argue about some things.

There are many items that will make some twinge and ask if they "want to pass the bill or not". If you look at the entire report most will find something they do not like or think that is unfair. What about White families who were not in the US before 1900? Or families like mine, who had 3 (that we know of) who fought and died fighting slavery in the Union Army.

I will attempt to answer more questions that will be brought up in the future, especially before the election, when this issue will become more of an issue. We can discuss this as necessary. Remember, as with many things, our ideas and opinions are shaped by our experiences. People can have different opinions. Adults should be able to listen to each other because despite our differences, none of us

# Commemoration For Korean War Memorial

The annual commemoration at the Korean Monument in Kennedy Park, 11320 S. Western, was

held on July 29th. In 1986, as Korean War veteran Ed McCarthy marched in a downtown Chicago parade honoring Vietnam War veterans, he began to think of ways to memorialize those who served with him in the conflict known as the "Forgotten War." After North Korean troops invaded in 1950, the United Nations urged its members to help support South Korea. Although the United States of American found in the Korean War. Congress never made a formal declaration of war, millions of Americans fought in the Korean War between 1950 and 1953, and more than 50,000 were killed.

McCarthy suggested the idea of creating a Korean War Memorial to the Windy City Veterans Association. The group organized a variety of fund-raising events and received donated services from the engraver, Maurice Moore Memorials. The semi-circular form is inscribed: "The veterans of the greater Chicago area present this memorial in memory of those men and women who served during the Korean War so that those who sacrificed so much in the cause of freedom will never be forgotten." Dedicated on September 15, 1988, the Kennedy Park memorial was the nation's first ever monument honoring America's involvement in the Korean War.

# End of Summer At Brookfield Zoo

Although still seen inside its mother's pouch, a Bennett's wallaby joey has begun to venture out and explore its surroundings at Brookfield Zoo's Hamill Family Wild Encounters.

Before the kids head back to school, take an end-of-summer family adventure to Brookfield

Butterflies!, presented by JULIE, Inc., is home to painted ladies, monarchs, zebra longwings, and swallowtails through Sept.8th. The screenedin, outdoor habitat is landscaped with a winding path, water features, and a wide assortment of flowering plants and native grasses. Guests can also peek into a room to see the transformation

from pupa to butterfly.
Stop by Regenstein
Wolf Woods to see Ahote, a Mexican wolf pup born on April 27th. He can be seen interacting with his parents Vivilette and Amigo or his big brother, Joe Jr. A female nyala (antelope native to Africa) born on May 23rd is in an outdoor habitat with other members of the herd, including her half-sibling, who was born in December 2022. And at Hamill Family Wild Encounters, zoogoers can see a Bennett's wallaby joey who is beginning to explore outside its mother's pouch.

Other new arrivals are Asha, a 2-year-old reticulated giraffe, and several species of macaws, including blue-and-yellow, hyacinth, and scarlet. Other winged additions include a pair of toco toucans and redlegged seriemas that can be seen outside at Hamill Family Play Zoo.

Zoogoers, young and older, wanting to learn more about the animals, can attend informal chats held daily through Sept. 4th. From 11 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., animal care staff present fun facts about various species such as bears, California sea lions and grey seals, African painted dogs, black rhinoceros, ring-tailed lemurs, and okapi. 
