## Grand Opening Celebration



The Chicago Park District will conduct a grand opening celebration for its new Brighton Park Community Campus, 4830 S. Western ave. on Saturday, June 24th from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. Martha Montes, supervisor of Park 596 invites the public to visit the 17 acre site that features a new 58,100-square-foot two-story facility. The multi-purpose, circular building is both the Chicago Park District headquarters and a fieldhouse equipped with all types of amenities and energy efficiencies.

The public fieldhouse boasts a 20,000-square-foot footprint equipped with a gymnasium, fitness center, bathrooms, locker rooms, teen center, community multi-purpose rooms, and a terrace that doubles as an event space. Once a vacant, unkept property, the new park is a welcoming outdoor green space with two artificial turf athletic fields with lighting and a scoreboard ready for soccer, football, and lacrosse games, and a grand lawn where patrons will enjoy concerts, movies, and performances. While kids amuse themselves in the playground, spray pool, and nature play space, seniors will have access to the fitness center and walkways.

From the reclaimed Chicago common brick to the natural habitats for birds and pollinators, this new park and facility were designed to have minimal impact on the environment. Native trees, flowers, and grasses will fill the natural area and create an urban oasis while absorbing stormwater, and reducing urban heat island effects. The park welcomes children, August 6 to 12, to its inaugural six-week Summer Day Camp, June 26th - August 4th from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Early Bird Camp, 8:30 a.m. to 10 a.m. and Extended Camp, 4 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. will also be available. In late August, the park will offer Play Camp and a Girl's Basketball Camp.

Teens, ages 13 to 15, will have the opportunity to apply to be a volunteer Junior Counselor and assist with day camp activities. This program is an enriching career development opportunity that allows youth to become Recreation Leaders when they are eligible at age 16. ## MSI Exhibit On Plastic Pollution

On July 1st, the Museum of Science and Industry, Chicago will unveil a powerful, immersive experience - The Blue Paradox - where visitors can walk beneath the ocean's surface, explore the impact plastic pollution has on this vital natural resource, and discover the actions needed to stop plastic waste from becoming pollution.

Presented by SC Johnson, in partnership with Conservation International, The Blue Paradox was initially launched in 2021 as an immersive pop-up experience in London. The high-demand, sold-out event struck a nerve with 97 percent of attendees saying they planned to change their behavior for good.

The exhibit aims to illuminate a paradox when it comes to plastic use: while the widespread use of plastic in our daily lives has led to considerable advancements in modern society, increased

convenience, and reduced reliance on natural resources, it has become one of the most pervasive pollution issues facing our ocean ecosystem and the planet.

As a global omnipresent issue, the plastic pollution crisis continues to make headlines. About 26 billion pounds of plastic is dumped into the ocean each year. Further, scientists continue to sound the alarm about plastic pollution in the Great Lakes region, estimating 22 million pounds of plastic enter the lakes annually. Researchers have even discovered 12 types of microplastics commonly found in bottles and packaging in the lungs of living people, in addition to previous studies that have shown plastic particle pollution in human blood.

## Health Benefits For Immigrants

Department of Health-care and Family Services has filed emergency and regular rules for the Health Benefits for Immigrant Adults and Health Benefits for Immigrant Seniors programs. These new rules establish the process to determine if and when to alter the program, and how the Department will provide public notification of the alterations.

In passing the FY24 State budget and Senate Bill 1298, the General Assembly directed the Department to ensure the programs do not exceed the funds available and appropriated for FY24. HFS will follow the process laid out in the emergency rules to temporarily pause new enrollments in the Health Benefits for Immigrant Adults program, covering eligible residents between the ages of 42 to 64, beginning July 1st. This pause does not impact current HBIA enrollees who remain eligible for healthcare coverage.

Enrollment in the Health Benefits for Immigrant Seniors program will remain open. HBIS enrollment will be temporarily paused for FY24 if the number of enrollees reaches 16,500.

Inpatient hospitalization, \$250 co-pay; Hospital emergency room visits, \$100 co-pay; Hospital or Ambulatory Surgical Treatment Center outpatient services, 10% co-insurance.

## Grant To Support Chicago Monuments

The Mellon Foundation announced a grant of \$6.8 million to The City of Chicago Department of Cultural Affairs and Special Events to support the Chicago Monuments Project and citywide community-generated commemorative initiatives and installations. Funding will allow for the implementation of new Chicago monuments, including the Chicago Torture Justice Memorial. These projects will add to the collection and memorialize events, people, and groups that historically have been excluded or underrepresented. Additional funding from Mellon will support ongoing programs that facilitate the continued engagement of artists and communities around monuments, public art, and cultural history.

Launched in 2020, the Mellon Monuments Project is a five-year, \$250 million commitment to reimagine and rebuild commemorative spaces and transform the way history is told in the United States. The Chicago Monuments Project was created as a response to the need for a larger reckoning with monuments that

symbolize outdated values and do not tell the full story of Chicago's history. A collaboration between DCASE, Chicago Public Schools, and the Chicago Park District, CMP's work began in 2020 and was guided by an advisory committee of community leaders, artists, architects, scholars, curators, and City officials.

Eight new works were conceived and DCASE provided initial planning grants of \$50,000 to organizations to help develop the project proposals. These include: Chicago Torture Justice Memorial, George Washington Monument Intervention, A Long Walk Home, Mother Jones's, Mahalia Jackson monument, Pilsen Latina Histories, Chicago Race Riots of 1919 Commemoration Project and Early Chicago.

## Cook County Jail Finds Narcotics

A Grand Jury indicted two individuals in custody at the Cook County Jail after a Sheriff's Office investigation found them in possession of paper soaked in synthetic cannabinoids, Sheriff Thomas J. Dart announced.

On April 27th, jail staff recovered strips of drug-soaked paper in the right sock of a prisoner who was being housed in Division 6. The next day, jail staff recovered drug-soaked paper hidden in a notebook being carried by a prisoner while being housed in Division 11.

In each case, the contraband subsequently tested positive for synthetic cannabinoids.

Grand jurors issued indictments charging both men with one count each of Possession of Contraband in a Penal Institution, a Class 1 felony.

The charges are part of the Sheriff's Office's efforts to address the danger of drug and chemical-laced paper that has been a growing trend in correctional facilities across the country,

including the Cook County Jail, which has had to institute numerous new policies, including increasing the searching of mail and regulating paper brought into the facility.

## 2-year old Giraffe At Brookfield Zoo

One of Brookfield Zoo's newest residents is already 10 feet tall and still growing. Asha, a 2-year-old female reticulated giraffe arrived recently and can now be seen in the outdoor area at Habitat Africa! The Savannah.

Since her arrival on May 6th, she has been behind the scenes acclimating to the animal care staff and being introduced to the other giraffes—Potoka, 9; Ato, 7; Jasiri, 17; and Arnieta, 16. Staff describe Asha as a confident and curious giraffe, who will be a great addition to the herd. Her coat is lightly colored and she has a delicate and expressive face.

The transfer of Asha to Brookfield Zoo from another accredited North American zoo was based on a recommendation from the Association of Zoos and Aquariums' Giraffe Species Survival Plan. Each plan manages the breeding of a species to maintain a healthy and self-sustaining population, which is both genetically diverse and demographically stable. It was determined that Asha is a good genetic match with Ato, the Zoo's breeding male. She will be paired with him once she reaches sexual maturity.

In 2018, the species was listed as endangered. Found across northern and north-eastern Kenya and small populations in southern Ethiopia and along the south-eastern border of Somalia, only about 16,000 individuals remain in their native habitat. Causes for the decline of reticulated giraffes include habitat loss and fragmentation, increased poaching, and political unrest.

## Cash Assistance For Survivors

The Chicago Department of Family and Support Services announced the official launch of the Emergency Financial Assistance for Gender-based Violence and Human Trafficking Survivors, a new \$5M fund to provide cash assistance to survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, or human trafficking, with an additional \$1M in funding from the 2023 budget. The program will provide one-time, \$1,000 payments in support of the economic stability of survivors. The application will be open until June 30th.

The program is intended to reach over 5,000 survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, and/or human trafficking who live in Chicago and have been negatively impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The financial assistance will cover expenses such as, childcare, transportation, medical expenses, education, or housing costs. The program is being administered by The Network: Advocating Against Domestic Violence.

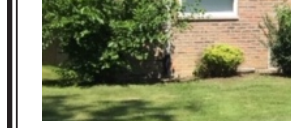
